AN ACT Relating to the creation of a statewide first responder building mapping information system; adding new sections to chapter 3 36.28A RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes the extreme dangers present when the safety of our citizens requires first 6 responders such as police and fire fighters to evacuate and secure a 7 8 In an effort to prepare for responding to unintended building. disasters, criminal acts, and acts of terrorism, the legislature 9 10 intends to create a statewide first responder building mapping information system that will provide all first responders with the 11 12 information they need to be successful when disaster strikes.

13NEW SECTION.Sec. 2.A new section is added to chapter 36.28A RCW14to read as follows:15(1) When funded, the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police

16 Chiefs shall create and operate a statewide first responder building 17 mapping information system.

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(2) All state agencies and local governments must utilize building 1 2 mapping software that complies with the building mapping software standards established under section 3 of this act for any building 3 mapped after the statewide first responder building mapping information 4 5 system is operational. All state and local government-owned buildings must be mapped when funding is provided by the Washington association 6 7 of sheriffs and police chiefs, or from other sources. Nothing in this act requires any state agency or local government to map a building 8 9 unless the entire cost of mapping the building is provided by the 10 Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs, or from other sources. 11

12 (3) Once the statewide first responder building mapping information 13 system is operational, all state and local government buildings that 14 are mapped must forward their building mapping information data to the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs. 15 All participating privately, federally, and tribally owned buildings may 16 17 voluntarily forward their mapping and emergency information data to the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs. The Washington 18 association of sheriffs and police chiefs may refuse any building 19 mapping information that does not comply with the specifications 20 21 described in section 3 of this act.

(4) Consistent with the guidelines developed under section 3 of this act, the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall electronically make the building mapping information available to all state, local, federal, and tribal law enforcement agencies, the military department of Washington state, and fire departments.

(5) Consistent with the guidelines developed under section 3 of this act, the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall develop building mapping software standards that must be used to participate in the statewide first responder building mapping information system.

32 (6) The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall33 pursue federal funds to:

34 (a) Create the statewide first responder building mapping35 information system; and

36 (b) Develop grants for the mapping of all state and local 37 government buildings in the order determined under section 3 of this 38 act.

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<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 36.28A RCW
to read as follows:

3 The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs in 4 consultation with the Washington state emergency management office and 5 the Washington state fire commissioner's office shall convene a 6 committee to establish guidelines related to the statewide first 7 responder building mapping information system. The committee shall 8 have the following responsibilities:

9 (1) Develop the type of information to be included in the statewide 10 first responder building mapping information system. The information 11 shall include, but is not limited to: Floor plans, fire protection 12 information, evacuation plans, utility information, known hazards, and 13 text and digital images showing emergency personnel contact 14 information;

15 (2) Develop building mapping software standards that must be 16 utilized by all entities participating in the statewide first responder 17 building mapping information system;

18 (3) Determine the order in which buildings shall be mapped when 19 funding is received;

20 (4) Develop guidelines on how the information shall be made 21 available to first responders. These guidelines shall include detailed 22 procedures and security systems to ensure that the information is only 23 made available to first responders;

(5) Recommend training guidelines regarding using the statewide first responder building mapping information system to the criminal justice training commission and the Washington state patrol fire protection bureau.

28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 36.28A RCW 29 to read as follows:

30 Units of local government and their employees, as provided in RCW 31 36.28A.010, are immune from civil liability for damages arising out of 32 the creation and use of the statewide first responder building mapping 33 information system, unless it is shown that an employee acted with 34 gross negligence or bad faith.

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
