HOUSE BILL 1291

State of Washington 58th Legislature 2003 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to flood control zone districts; amending RCW 2 86.15.050; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 86.15.050 and 1961 c 153 s 5 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) The board of county commissioners of each county shall be ex 7 officio, by virtue of their office, supervisors of the zones created in 8 each county. <u>In any zone with more than two thousand residents, an</u> 9 <u>election of supervisors other than the board of county commissioners</u> 10 <u>may be held as provided in this section.</u>

11 (2) When proposed by citizen petition or by resolution of the board 12 of county commissioners, a ballot proposition authorizing election of 13 the supervisors of a zone shall be submitted by ordinance to the voters 14 residing in the zone at any general election, or at any special 15 election which may be called for that purpose.

16 (3) The ballot proposition shall be submitted (a) if the board of 17 county supervisors enacts an ordinance submitting the proposition after 18 adopting a resolution proposing the election of supervisors of a zone; 19 or (b) if a petition proposing the election of supervisors of a zone is 1 submitted to the county auditor of the county in which the zone is
2 located that is signed by registered voters within the zone, numbering
3 at least fifteen percent of the votes cast in the last county general
4 election by registered voters within the zone.

(4) Upon receipt of a citizen petition under subsection (3)(b) of 5 this section, the county auditor shall determine whether the petition 6 is signed by a sufficient number of registered voters, using the 7 registration records and returns of the preceding general election, 8 and, no later than forty-five days after receipt of the petition, shall 9 attach to the petition the auditor's certificate stating whether or not 10 sufficient signatures have been obtained. If the signatures are found 11 by the auditor to be insufficient, the petition shall be returned to 12 13 the person filing it.

14 (5) The ballot proposition authorizing election of supervisors of 15 zones shall appear on the ballot of the next general election or at the 16 next special election date specified under RCW 29.13.020 occurring 17 sixty or more days after the last resolution proposing election of 18 supervisors or the date the county auditor certifies that the petition 19 proposing such election contains sufficient valid signatures.

20 (6) The petition proposing the election of zone supervisors, or the 21 ordinance submitting the question to the voters, shall describe the 22 proposed election process. The ballot proposition shall include the 23 following:

27 <u>supervisors."</u>

28 (7) The ordinance or petition submitting the ballot proposition shall designate the proposed composition of the supervisors of zones, 29 which shall be clearly described in the ballot proposition. The ballot 30 proposition shall state that the zone supervisors shall thereafter be 31 selected by election, and, at the same election at which the 32 33 proposition is submitted to the voters as to whether to elect zone supervisors, three park commissioners shall be elected. The election 34 of zone supervisors is null and void if the voters, by a simple 35 majority, do not approve the direct election of the zone supervisors. 36 Candidates shall run for specific supervisor positions. No primary may 37 38 be held to nominate candidates. The person receiving the greatest

number of votes for each position shall be elected as a supervisor. 1 2 The staggering of the terms of office shall occur as follows: (a) The person who is elected receiving the greatest number of votes shall be 3 elected to a six-year term of office if the election is held in an odd-4 numbered year or a five-year term of office if the election is held in 5 an even-numbered year; (b) the person who is elected receiving the б 7 second greatest number of votes shall be elected to a four-year term of office if the election is held in an odd-numbered year or a three-year 8 term of office if the election is held in an even-numbered year; and 9 (c) the other person who is elected shall be elected to a two-year term 10 of office if the election is held in an odd-numbered year or a one-year 11 12 term of office if the election is held in an even-numbered year. The 13 initial supervisors shall take office immediately when they are elected 14 and qualified, and for purposes of computing their terms of office the terms shall be assumed to commence on the first day of January in the 15 year after they are elected. Thereafter, all supervisors shall be 16 elected to six-year terms of office. All supervisors shall serve until 17 their respective successors are elected and qualified and assume office 18 in accordance with RCW 29.04.170. Vacancies shall occur and shall be 19 filled as provided in chapter 42.12 RCW. 20

(8) The costs and expenses directly related to the election of zone
 supervisors shall be borne by the zone.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 24 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 25 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 26 July 1, 2003.

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
