## HOUSE BILL 1451

State of Washington 58th Legislature 2003 Regular Session

**By** Representatives Sommers, Fromhold and Wallace; by request of Office of Financial Management

Read first time 01/27/2003. Referred to Committee on Appropriations.

1 AN ACT Relating to basic health care plan enrollment; amending RCW 2 43.72.900; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.72.900 and 2002 c 371 s 909 and 2002 c 2 s 2 5 (Initiative Measure No. 773) are each amended to read as follows:

(1) The health services account is created in the state treasury. 6 7 Moneys in the account may be spent only after appropriation. Subject 8 to the transfers described in subsection (3) of this section, moneys in the account may be expended only for maintaining and expanding health 9 10 services access for low-income residents, maintaining and expanding the public health system, maintaining and improving the capacity of the 11 12 health care system, containing health care costs, and the regulation, planning, and administering of the health care system. 13

14 (2) Funds deposited into the health services account under RCW15 82.24.028 and 82.26.028 shall be used solely as follows:

(a) Five million dollars for the state fiscal year beginning July
1, 2002, and five million dollars for the state fiscal year beginning
July 1, 2003, shall be appropriated by the legislature for programs
that effectively improve the health of low-income persons, including

efforts to reduce diseases and illnesses that harm low-income persons. The department of health shall submit a report to the legislature on March 1, 2002, evaluating the cost-effectiveness of programs that improve the health of low-income persons and address diseases and illnesses that disproportionately affect low-income persons, and making recommendations to the legislature on which of these programs could most effectively utilize the funds appropriated under this subsection.

8 (b) Ten percent of the funds deposited into the health services account under RCW 82.24.028 and 82.26.028 remaining after the 9 appropriation under (a) of this subsection shall be transferred no less 10 frequently than annually by the treasurer to the tobacco prevention and 11 control account established by RCW 43.79.480. The funds transferred 12 13 shall be used exclusively for implementation of the Washington state 14 tobacco prevention and control plan and shall be used only to supplement, and not supplant, funds in the tobacco prevention and 15 control account as of January 1, 2001, however, these funds may be used 16 17 to replace funds appropriated by the legislature for further implementation of the Washington state tobacco prevention and control 18 plan for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001. For each state fiscal 19 year beginning on and after July 1, 2002, the legislature shall 20 21 appropriate no less than twenty-six million two hundred forty thousand 22 dollars from the tobacco prevention and control account for implementation of the Washington state tobacco prevention and control 23 24 plan.

(c) Because of its demonstrated effectiveness in improving the 25 26 health of low-income persons and addressing illnesses and diseases that 27 harm low-income persons, the remainder of the funds deposited into the health services account under RCW 82.24.028 and 82.26.028 shall be 28 appropriated solely for Washington basic health plan enrollment as 29 provided in chapter 70.47 RCW. ((Funds appropriated pursuant to this 30 subsection (2)(c) must supplement, and not supplant, the level of state 31 32 funding needed to support enrollment of a minimum of one hundred twenty-five thousand persons for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 33 2002, and every fiscal year thereafter. The health care authority may 34 35 enroll up to twenty thousand additional persons in the basic health 36 plan during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, above the base level 37 of one hundred twenty-five thousand enrollees. The health care 38 authority may enroll up to fifty thousand additional persons in the

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basic health plan during the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, above the 1 2 base level of one hundred twenty-five thousand enrollees. For each biennium beginning on and after July 1, 2005, the health care authority 3 may enroll up to at least one hundred seventy-five thousand 4 enrollees.)) Funds appropriated under this subsection may be used to 5 support outreach and enrollment activities only to the extent necessary 6 7 to achieve the enrollment goals described in this section.

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(3) Prior to expenditure for the purposes described in subsection (2) of this section, funds deposited into the health services account 9 under RCW 82.24.028 and 82.26.028 shall first be transferred to the 10 following accounts to ensure the continued availability of previously 11 12 dedicated revenues for certain existing programs:

13 (a) To the violence reduction and drug enforcement account under 14 RCW 69.50.520, two million two hundred forty-nine thousand five hundred dollars for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, four million 15 two hundred forty-eight thousand dollars for the state fiscal year 16 17 beginning July 1, 2002, seven million seven hundred eighty-nine thousand dollars for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, six million 18 nine hundred thirty-two thousand dollars for the biennium beginning 19 July 1, 2005, and six million nine hundred thirty-two thousand dollars 20 21 for each biennium thereafter, as required by RCW 82.24.020(2);

22 (b) To the health services account under this section, nine million seventy-seven thousand dollars for the state fiscal year beginning July 23 24 1, 2001, seventeen million one hundred eighty-eight thousand dollars 25 for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, thirty-one million seven hundred fifty-five thousand dollars for the biennium beginning 26 27 July 1, 2003, twenty-eight million six hundred twenty-two thousand dollars for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and twenty-eight 28 million six hundred twenty-two thousand dollars for each biennium 29 thereafter, as required by RCW 82.24.020(3); and 30

(c) To the water quality account under RCW 70.146.030, two million 31 two hundred three thousand five hundred dollars for the state fiscal 32 year beginning July 1, 2001, four million two hundred forty-four 33 thousand dollars for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, 34 eight million one hundred eighty-two thousand dollars for the biennium 35 36 beginning July 1, 2003, seven million eight hundred eighty-five 37 thousand dollars for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and seven

1 million eight hundred eighty-five thousand dollars for each biennium 2 thereafter, as required by RCW 82.24.027(2)(a).

3 During the 2001-2003 fiscal biennium, the legislature may transfer 4 from the health services account such amounts as reflect the excess 5 fund balance of the account.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is intended to apply retroactively 7 to January 1, 2002.

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate 9 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 10 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 11 immediately.

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
