State of Washington 58th Legislature 2003 Regular Session

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AN ACT Relating to special law enforcement memorial license plates; amending RCW 46.16.313 and 46.16.316; adding new sections to chapter 46.16 RCW; and adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 In cooperation with the Washington state patrol and the department, 8 the sponsor of the law enforcement memorial license plate shall create and design, and the department shall issue, a special license plate 9 10 displaying a symbol of law enforcement that may be used in lieu of regular or personalized license plates for motor vehicles required to 11 12 display two motor vehicle license plates, excluding vehicles registered under chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and conditions established by the 13 14 department. These special plates will honor Washington law enforcement officers who gave their lives in the line of duty. 15

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW 17 to read as follows: "Law enforcement memorial license plates" means license plates
issued under section 1 of this act that display a symbol honoring law
enforcement officers who were killed in the line of duty.

4 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.16.313 and 1997 c 291 s 8 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) The department may establish a fee of no more than forty 7 dollars for each type of special license plates issued under RCW 46.16.301(1) (a), (b), or (c), as existing before amendment by section 8 5, chapter 291, Laws of 1997, in an amount calculated to offset the 9 cost of production of the special license plates and the administration 10 11 of this program. ((Until December 31, 1997, the fee shall not exceed 12 thirty-five dollars, but effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on January 1, 1998, the department may adjust the fee to no 13 more than forty dollars.)) This fee is in addition to all other fees 14 required to register and license the vehicle for which the plates have 15 16 been requested. All such additional special license plate fees 17 collected by the department shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the motor vehicle fund. 18

(2) ((Until December 31, 1997, in addition to all fees and taxes 19 20 required to be paid upon application, registration, and renewal 21 registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a collegiate license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct 22 23 an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. 24 The remaining proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be 25 26 remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper 27 identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in 28 29 RCW 28B.10.890.

30 (3) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on 31 January 1, 1998,)) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder 32 of a collegiate license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty 33 dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve 34 dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration 35 36 and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall 37 be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper

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identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the
 funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in
 RCW 28B.10.890.

(((4) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on 4 January 1, 1999,)) (3) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be 5 paid upon renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a б 7 collegiate license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee 8 collected under this subsection for administration and collection 9 expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to 10 the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed 11 12 report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate 13 collegiate license plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890.

14 $\left(\left(\frac{5}{5}\right)\right)$ (4) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a 15 special baseball stadium license plate shall pay an initial fee of 16 17 forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for 18 administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining 19 proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be distributed to 20 21 a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments 22 on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as 82.14.0485, including reasonably 23 defined in RCW necessary 24 preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 25 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund. 26

27 ((((6) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 1, 1999,)) (5) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be 28 paid upon renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a 29 special baseball stadium license plate shall pay a fee of thirty 30 dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two 31 dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration 32 and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall 33 be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and 34 35 interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball 36 stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary 37 preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW

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82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds
 to the state general fund.

3 (6) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on January 1, 2004, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid 4 upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a 5 law enforcement memorial license plate shall pay an initial fee of 6 7 forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for 8 administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining 9 proceeds must be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a 10 proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit 11 the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department 12 13 determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of 14 implementing the law enforcement memorial license plate. Upon the department's determination, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds to 15 the law enforcement memorial account established under section 4 of 16 17 this act.

(7) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 18 1, 2005, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 19 renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a law 20 21 enforcement memorial license plate shall, upon application, pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed 22 two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for 23 24 administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds must be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a 25 proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit 26 27 the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of 28 implementing the law enforcement memorial license plate. Upon the 29 department's determination, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds to 30 the law enforcement memorial account established under section 4 of 31 32 this act.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW 34 to read as follows:

35 (1) The law enforcement memorial account is created in the custody 36 of the state treasurer. Upon the department's determination that the 37 state had been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the law

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enforcement memorial license plate, all receipts, except as provided in RCW 46.16.313 (6) and (7), from law enforcement memorial license plates must be deposited into the account. Only the director of general administration or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the account. The account is subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

8 (2) Funds in the account must be disbursed subject to the following9 conditions and limitations:

10 (a) The director of general administration or the director's designee must disburse the funds for the purpose of constructing a law 11 12 enforcement memorial on the grounds of the capitol campus. Upon the 13 completion of the memorial, the director of general administration or 14 the director's designee must disburse the funds for the purpose of providing maintenance for the memorial. At the end of each fiscal year 15 any remaining funds in the account must be disbursed for the purpose of 16 17 contracting with a qualified nonprofit organization to provide grants to the families of officers killed in the line of duty. 18 The grants must be distributed on the basis of financial need. 19

(b) For purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation incorporated and operating exclusively in Washington that has received a determination of tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code. The organization must have been established for the express purpose of honoring law enforcement officers who have given their lives in service to their communities.

(c) Beginning January 31, 2005, the qualified nonprofit organization selected by the department under (a) of this subsection shall prepare and submit to the department an annual independent audit, an annual financial statement, and an annual report detailing the nonprofit organization's expenditure of the funds from the account created in subsection (1) of this section.

33 (d) Disbursement of these funds from the account to the nonprofit 34 organization is contingent upon the organization meeting all reporting 35 and review requirements as specified under (c) of this subsection.

36 (e) No portion of any funds disbursed under this section may be37 used, directly or indirectly, for any of the following purposes:

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(i) Attempting to influence: (A) The passage or defeat of any
 legislation by the legislature of the state of Washington, by a county,
 city, town, or other political subdivision of the state of Washington,
 or by Congress; or (B) the adoption or rejection of any rule, standard,
 rate, or other legislative enactment of any state agency;

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(ii) Making contributions reportable under chapter 42.17 RCW; or(iii) Providing any: (A) Gift; (B) honoraria; or (C) travel,

8 lodging, meals, or entertainment to a public officer or employee.

9 Sec. 5. RCW 46.16.316 and 1997 c 291 s 10 are each amended to read 10 as follows:

11 Except as provided in RCW 46.16.305:

12 (1) When a person who has been issued a special license plate or plates under section 1 of this act or RCW 46.16.301 as it existed 13 before amendment by section 5, chapter 291, Laws of 1997, sells, 14 trades, or otherwise transfers or releases ownership of the vehicle 15 16 upon which the special license plate or plates have been displayed, he 17 or she shall immediately report the transfer of such plate or plates to an acquired vehicle or vehicle eligible for such plates pursuant to 18 departmental rule, or he or she shall surrender such plates to the 19 20 department immediately if such surrender is required by departmental 21 rule. If a person applies for a transfer of the plate or plates to another eligible vehicle, a transfer fee of five dollars shall be 22 23 charged in addition to all other applicable fees. Such transfer fees 24 shall be deposited in the motor vehicle fund. Failure to surrender the plates when required is a traffic infraction. 25

(2) If the special license plate or plates issued by the department
become lost, defaced, damaged, or destroyed, application for a
replacement special license plate or plates shall be made and fees paid
as provided by law for the replacement of regular license plates.

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
