1 AN ACT Relating to outdoor recreation programs; and amending RCW 2 46.09.020, 46.09.170, and 46.09.280.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.09.020 and 1986 c 206 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 ((As used in this chapter the following words and phrases have the 7 designated meanings unless a different meaning is expressly provided or 8 the context otherwise clearly indicates:)) The definitions in this 9 section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly 10 requires otherwise.

11 (1) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, association, 12 or corporation.

13 (2)(a) "Nonhighway vehicle" means any motorized vehicle when used 14 for recreation travel on trails and nonhighway roads or for recreation 15 cross-country travel on any one of the following or a combination 16 thereof: Land, water, snow, ice, marsh, swampland, and other natural 17 terrain. Such vehicles include but are not limited to, off-road 18 vehicles, two, three, or four-wheel vehicles, motorcycles, four-wheel 1 drive vehicles, dune buggies, amphibious vehicles, ground effects or 2 air cushion vehicles, and any other means of land transportation 3 deriving motive power from any source other than muscle or wind.

4 (b) Nonhighway vehicle does not include:

5 (((1))) <u>(i)</u> Any vehicle designed primarily for travel on, over, or 6 in the water;

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(((2))) <u>(ii)</u> Snowmobiles or any military vehicles; or

8 (((3))) <u>(iii)</u> Any vehicle eligible for a motor vehicle fuel tax 9 exemption or rebate under chapter 82.36 RCW while an exemption or 10 rebate is claimed. This exemption includes but is not limited to farm, 11 construction, and logging vehicles.

12 (3) "Off-road vehicle" or "ORV" means any nonhighway vehicle when 13 used for cross-country travel on trails or on any one of the following 14 or a combination thereof: Land, water, snow, ice, marsh, swampland and 15 other natural terrain.

16 <u>(4)</u> "ORV use permit" means a permit issued for operation of an off-17 road vehicle under this chapter.

18 (5) "ORV trail" means a multiple-use corridor designated and 19 maintained for recreational travel by off-road vehicles that is not 20 normally suitable for travel by conventional two-wheel drive vehicles 21 and is posted or designated by the managing authority of the property 22 that the trail traverses as permitting ORV travel.

23 (6) "ORV use area" means the entire area of a parcel of land 24 ((except for camping and approved buffer areas)) that is posted or 25 designated for ORV use in accordance with rules adopted by the managing 26 authority.

27 (7) "ORV recreation facility" includes ORV trails, ORV campgrounds,
 28 and ORV use areas.

29 <u>(8)</u> "Owner" means the person other than the lienholder, having an 30 interest in or title to a nonhighway vehicle, and entitled to the use 31 or possession thereof.

32 (9) "Operator" means each person who operates, or is in physical 33 control of, any nonhighway vehicle.

34 (10) "Dealer" means a person, partnership, association, or 35 corporation engaged in the business of selling off-road vehicles at 36 wholesale or retail in this state.

37 (11) "Department" means the department of licensing.

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(12) "Hunt" means any effort to kill, injure, capture, or purposely
 disturb a wild animal or wild bird.

3 (13) "Nonhighway road" means any road owned or managed by a public 4 agency, or any private road for which the owner has granted a permanent 5 easement for public use of the road, other than a highway generally 6 capable of travel by a conventional two-wheel drive passenger 7 automobile during most of the year and in use by such vehicles and that 8 is not built or maintained with appropriations from the motor vehicle 9 fund.

10 (14) "Nonhighway road recreation facilities" means recreational 11 trails and facilities that are accessed by nonhighway roads and are 12 intended solely for nonmotorized recreational uses.

13 (15) "Highway," for the purpose of this chapter only, means the 14 entire width between the boundary lines of every way publicly 15 maintained by the state department of transportation or any county or 16 city when any part thereof is generally open to the use of the public 17 for purposes of vehicular travel as a matter of right.

18 <u>(16)</u> "Organized competitive event" means any competition, 19 advertised in advance through written notice to organized clubs or 20 published in local newspapers, sponsored by recognized clubs, and 21 conducted at a predetermined time and place.

22 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.09.170 and 1995 c 166 s 9 are each amended to read 23 as follows:

(1) From time to time, but at least once each year, the state
treasurer shall refund from the motor vehicle fund one percent of the
motor vehicle fuel tax revenues collected under chapter 82.36 RCW,
based on the tax rate in effect January 1, 1990, less proper deductions
for refunds and costs of collection as provided in RCW 46.68.090. The
treasurer shall place these funds in the general fund as follows:

30 (a) Forty percent shall be credited to the ORV and nonhighway 31 vehicle account and administered by the department of natural resources 32 solely for planning, maintenance, and management of ORV recreation 33 facilities, nonhighway roads, and nonhighway road recreation 34 facilities. The funds under this subsection shall be expended in 35 accordance with the following limitations:

36 (i) Not more than five percent may be expended for information 37 programs under this chapter; (ii) Not less than ((ten)) thirty percent and not more than fifty
 percent may be expended for ORV recreation facilities;

3 (iii) Not more than twenty-five percent may be expended for 4 maintenance of nonhighway roads;

5 (iv) Not more than fifty percent may be expended for nonhighway 6 road recreation facilities;

7 (v) Ten percent shall be transferred to the interagency committee 8 for outdoor recreation for grants to law enforcement agencies in those 9 counties where the department of natural resources maintains ORV 10 facilities. This amount is in addition to those distributions made by 11 the interagency committee for outdoor recreation under (d)(i) of this 12 subsection;

(b) Three and one-half percent shall be credited to the ORV and nonhighway vehicle account and administered by the department of fish and wildlife solely for the acquisition, planning, development, maintenance, and management of nonhighway roads and recreation facilities;

18 (c) ((Two)) <u>Four</u> percent shall be credited to the ORV and 19 nonhighway vehicle account and administered by the parks and recreation 20 commission solely for the maintenance and management of ORV use areas 21 and facilities <u>and nonhighway road recreation projects including but</u> 22 <u>not limited to campgrounds, trails, restrooms, interpretive facilities,</u> 23 <u>and signage</u>; and

24 (d) ((Fifty-four)) Fifty-two and one-half percent, together with 25 the funds received by the interagency committee for outdoor recreation under RCW 46.09.110, shall be credited to the nonhighway and off-road 26 27 vehicle activities program account to be administered by the committee for planning, acquisition, development, maintenance, and management of 28 ORV recreation facilities and nonhighway road recreation facilities; 29 $((\Theta RV))$ user education and information; and $((\Theta RV))$ law enforcement 30 The funds under this subsection shall be expended in 31 programs. 32 accordance with the following limitations:

(i) ((Not more than twenty)) Fifty percent ((may)) must be expended on facilities consistent with the results of the fuel use study required in subsection (3) of this section for nonhighway road recreation projects or nonhighway and ORV education, information, and law enforcement programs under this chapter. For the purposes of this

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subsection, nonhighway road recreation projects include, but are not limited to, campgrounds, trails, restrooms, interpretive facilities, signage, and building maintenance;

4 (ii) <u>Of the amount not expended in (d)(i) of this subsection not</u>
5 less than an amount equal to the funds received by the interagency
6 committee for outdoor recreation under RCW 46.09.110 and not more than
7 sixty percent may be expended for ORV recreation facilities;

8 (iii) Of the amount not expended in (d)(i) of this subsection not 9 more than ((twenty)) sixty percent may be expended for nonhighway road 10 recreation facilities.

(2) On a yearly basis an agency may not, except as provided in RCW 46.09.110, expend more than ten percent of the funds it receives under this chapter for general administration expenses incurred in carrying out this chapter.

(3) Beginning July 1, 2007, and updated every six years thereafter 15 in conjunction with updating the plan required in RCW 46.09.250, the 16 interagency committee for outdoor recreation shall contract with an 17 independent entity to study the source and make recommendations on the 18 distribution and use of funds provided to off-road vehicle and 19 nonhighway road recreational activities under this section. The study 20 21 must determine the relative portion of the motor vehicle fuel tax revenues that are attributable to vehicles operating off-road or on 22 nonhighway roads for recreational purposes as provided in this section. 23 The study must include the types of vehicles and location of their use, 24 the types of recreational activities, the types of recreational 25 26 facilities used, and the recreational use of forest roads relative to 27 other, nonrecreational uses.

28 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.09.280 and 1986 c 206 s 13 are each amended to read 29 as follows:

The interagency committee for outdoor recreation shall establish 30 31 ((a committee of nonhighway road recreationists, including 32 representatives of organized ORV groups,)) the nonhighway and off-road provide 33 vehicle advisory committee to advice regarding the 34 administration of this chapter. The nonhighway and off-road vehicle 35 advisory committee consists of a proportional representation of persons with recreational experience in areas identified in the most recent 36

1 <u>fuel use study as required by RCW 46.09.170(3)</u>. Only representatives 2 of organized ORV groups may be voting members of the committee with 3 respect to expenditure of funds received under RCW 46.09.110.

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
