1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE W. BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, 2 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 7 represent and petition as follows:

8 WHEREAS, In 1969 the United States Congress created the Alternative 9 Minimum Tax to prevent wealthy Americans and corporations from using 10 otherwise available deductions to reduce their income tax liability; 11 and

12 WHEREAS, Today the Alternative Minimum Tax has placed an onerous13 burden on working middle-class families and productive companies; and

14 WHEREAS, Any family making over \$49,000 that deducts their state 15 and local taxes, mortgage interest, children, and college education are 16 subject to the Alternative Minimum Tax; and

WHEREAS, The Corporate Alternative Minimum Tax targets capital intensive industries that create jobs, raise the incomes of workers, and increase the standard of living for all Americans; and WHEREAS, Corporations become subject to the Alternative Minimum Tax
 during recessions which forces layoffs of the employees; and

3 WHEREAS, It is important to protect working middle-income families 4 and productive companies from tax burdens that only reduce the 5 possibility of economic prosperity instead of encourage it;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United
States Congress vote to repeal the individual and permanent Alternative
Minimum Tax.

9 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately 10 transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United 11 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the 12 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of 13 Washington.
