1 AN ACT Relating to controlling game damage to crops; and amending 2 RCW 77.36.020 and 77.12.150.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 77.36.020 and 1996 c 54 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 The department shall work closely with landowners and tenants 7 suffering game damage problems to control damage without killing the 8 animals when practical, to increase the harvest of damage-causing 9 animals in hunting seasons, and to kill the animals when no other 10 practical means of damage control is feasible.

If the department receives recurring complaints regarding property 11 being damaged as described in this section or RCW 77.36.030 from the 12 owner or tenant of real property, or receives such complaints from 13 several such owners or tenants in a locale, the commission shall 14 15 ((consider conducting)) conduct a special hunt or special hunts or take 16 remedial action to reduce the potential for such damage. The 17 commission shall authorize either one or two antlerless permits per hunter for special hunts held in damage areas where qualified 18

1 <u>department staff, or their designee, have confirmed six incidents of</u> 2 <u>crop damage by deer or elk.</u>

As an alternative to hunting, the department shall work with affected entities to relocate deer and elk when needed to augment existing herds.

6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.12.150 and 1987 c 506 s 24 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

8 (1) By emergency rule only, and in accordance with criteria 9 established by the commission, the director may close or shorten a season for game animals, game birds, or game fish, and after a season 10 11 has been closed or shortened, may reopen it and reestablish bag limits 12 on game animals, game birds, or game fish during that season. The director shall advise the commission of the adoption of emergency 13 rules. A copy of an emergency rule, certified as a true copy by the 14 director or by a person authorized in writing by the director to make 15 16 the certification, is admissible in court as prima facie evidence of 17 the adoption and validity of the rule.

(2)(a) If the director finds that game animals have increased in 18 numbers in an area of the state so that they are damaging public or 19 20 private property or over-utilizing their habitat, the commission may 21 establish a special hunting season and designate the time, area, and manner of taking and the number and sex of the animals that may be 22 23 killed or possessed by a licensed hunter. ((The director shall 24 determine by random selection the identity of hunters who may hunt within the area and shall determine the conditions and requirements of 25 26 the selection process.)) The director shall include notice of the 27 special season in the rules establishing open seasons.

(b) When the department receives six complaints concerning damage 28 to commercial agricultural and horticultural crop production by 29 wildlife from the owner or tenant of real property, or from several 30 owners or tenants in a locale, the commission shall conduct a special 31 hunt or special hunts or take remedial action to reduce the potential 32 for the damage, and shall authorize either one or two permits per 33 34 hunter. Each complaint must be confirmed by qualified department staff, or their designee. 35

36 (c) The director shall determine by random selection the identity
37 of hunters who may hunt within the area of the special hunt and shall

determine the conditions and requirements of the selection process. 1 2 Within this process, the department must maintain a list of all persons holding valid wildlife hunting licenses, arranged by county of 3 residence, who may hunt deer or elk that are causing damage to crops. 4 The department must update the list annually and utilize the list when 5 contacting persons to assist in controlling game damage to crops. The б department must make all reasonable efforts to contact individuals 7 residing within the county where the hunting of deer or elk will occur 8 before contacting a person who is not a resident of that county. The 9 department must randomize the names of people on the list in order to 10 provide a fair distribution of the hunting opportunities. Hunters who 11 12 participate in hunts under this section must report any kills to the 13 department. The department must include a summary of the wildlife 14 harvested in these hunts in the annual game management reports it makes available to the public. 15

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
