1 AN ACT Relating to freedom from discrimination because of genetic 2 information; and amending RCW 49.60.030 and 49.60.040.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 49.60.030 and 1997 c 271 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) The right to be free from discrimination because of race, 7 creed, color, national origin, sex, <u>genetic information</u>, or the 8 presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability or the use of 9 a trained dog guide or service animal by a disabled person is 10 recognized as and declared to be a civil right. This right shall 11 include, but not be limited to:

12 (a) The right to obtain and hold employment without discrimination;

(b) The right to the full enjoyment of any of the accommodations, advantages, facilities, or privileges of any place of public resort, accommodation, assemblage, or amusement;

16 (c) The right to engage in real estate transactions without 17 discrimination, including discrimination against families with 18 children; 1 (d) The right to engage in credit transactions without
2 discrimination;

3 (e) The right to engage in insurance transactions or transactions
4 with health maintenance organizations without discrimination:
5 PROVIDED, That a practice which is not unlawful under RCW 48.30.300,
6 48.44.220, or 48.46.370 does not constitute an unfair practice for the
7 purposes of this subparagraph; and

(f) The right to engage in commerce free from any discriminatory 8 boycotts or blacklists. Discriminatory boycotts or blacklists for 9 purposes of this section shall be defined as the formation or execution 10 any express or implied agreement, understanding, policy or 11 of 12 contractual arrangement for economic benefit between any persons which 13 is not specifically authorized by the laws of the United States and 14 which is required or imposed, either directly or indirectly, overtly or covertly, by a foreign government or foreign person in order to 15 restrict, condition, prohibit, or interfere with or in order to exclude 16 17 any person or persons from any business relationship on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, sex, the presence of any sensory, mental, 18 or physical disability, or the use of a trained dog guide or service 19 animal by a disabled person, or national origin or lawful business 20 21 relationship: PROVIDED HOWEVER, That nothing herein contained shall 22 prohibit the use of boycotts as authorized by law pertaining to labor disputes and unfair labor practices. 23

24 (2) Any person deeming himself or herself injured by any act in 25 violation of this chapter shall have a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin further violations, or to recover the 26 27 actual damages sustained by the person, or both, together with the cost of suit including reasonable attorneys' fees or any other appropriate 28 remedy authorized by this chapter or the United States Civil Rights Act 29 of 1964 as amended, or the Federal Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 30 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 3601 et seq.). 31

32 (3) Except for any unfair practice committed by an employer against 33 an employee or a prospective employee, or any unfair practice in a real 34 estate transaction which is the basis for relief specified in the 35 amendments to RCW 49.60.225 contained in chapter 69, Laws of 1993, any 36 unfair practice prohibited by this chapter which is committed in the 37 course of trade or commerce as defined in the Consumer Protection Act, 38 chapter 19.86 RCW, is, for the purpose of applying that chapter, a

1 matter affecting the public interest, is not reasonable in relation to 2 the development and preservation of business, and is an unfair or 3 deceptive act in trade or commerce.

4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 49.60.040 and 1997 c 271 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 As used in this chapter:

7 (1) "Person" includes one or more individuals, partnerships, 8 associations, organizations, corporations, cooperatives, legal 9 representatives, trustees and receivers, or any group of persons; it 10 includes any owner, lessee, proprietor, manager, agent, or employee, 11 whether one or more natural persons; and further includes any political 12 or civil subdivisions of the state and any agency or instrumentality of 13 the state or of any political or civil subdivision thereof;

14 (2) "Commission" means the Washington state human rights
15 commission;

16 (3) "Employer" includes any person acting in the interest of an 17 employer, directly or indirectly, who employs eight or more persons, 18 and does not include any religious or sectarian organization not 19 organized for private profit;

20 (4) "Employee" does not include any individual employed by his or 21 her parents, spouse, or child, or in the domestic service of any 22 person;

(5) <u>"Genetic information" is information about inherited</u>
 characteristics which can be derived from a DNA-based or other
 laboratory test, family history, or medical examination.

26 (6) "Labor organization" includes any organization which exists for 27 the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning 28 grievances or terms or conditions of employment, or for other mutual 29 aid or protection in connection with employment;

30 (((6))) <u>(7)</u> "Employment agency" includes any person undertaking 31 with or without compensation to recruit, procure, refer, or place 32 employees for an employer;

33 (((7))) (8) "Marital status" means the legal status of being 34 married, single, separated, divorced, or widowed;

35 (((8))) <u>(9)</u> "National origin" includes "ancestry";

36 (((9))) <u>(10)</u> "Full enjoyment of" includes the right to purchase any 37 service, commodity, or article of personal property offered or sold on,

or by, any establishment to the public, and the admission of any person 1 2 to accommodations, advantages, facilities, or privileges of any place of public resort, accommodation, assemblage, or amusement, without acts 3 directly or indirectly causing persons of any particular race, creed, 4 5 color, sex, national origin, or with any sensory, mental, or physical disability, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a 6 7 disabled person, to be treated as not welcome, accepted, desired, or 8 solicited;

9 (((10))) <u>(11)</u> "Any place of public resort, accommodation, 10 assemblage, or amusement" includes, but is not limited to, any place, licensed or unlicensed, kept for gain, hire, or reward, or where 11 12 charges are made for admission, service, occupancy, or use of any 13 property or facilities, whether conducted for the entertainment, 14 housing, or lodging of transient quests, or for the benefit, use, or accommodation of those seeking health, recreation, or rest, or for the 15 16 burial or other disposition of human remains, or for the sale of goods, 17 merchandise, services, or personal property, or for the rendering of personal services, or for public conveyance or transportation on land, 18 water, or in the air, including the stations and terminals thereof and 19 20 the garaging of vehicles, or where food or beverages of any kind are 21 sold for consumption on the premises, or where public amusement, 22 entertainment, sports, or recreation of any kind is offered with or without charge, or where medical service or care is made available, or 23 24 where the public gathers, congregates, or assembles for amusement, 25 recreation, or public purposes, or public halls, public elevators, and public washrooms of buildings and structures occupied by two or more 26 27 tenants, or by the owner and one or more tenants, or any public library or educational institution, or schools of special instruction, or 28 nursery schools, or day care centers or children's camps: 29 PROVIDED, That nothing contained in this definition shall be construed to include 30 or apply to any institute, bona fide club, or place of accommodation, 31 32 which is by its nature distinctly private, including fraternal organizations, though where public use is permitted that use shall be 33 covered by this chapter; nor shall anything contained in this 34 definition apply to any educational facility, columbarium, crematory, 35 36 mausoleum, or cemetery operated or maintained by a bona fide religious 37 or sectarian institution;

1 (((11))) (12) "Real property" includes buildings, structures, 2 dwellings, real estate, lands, tenements, leaseholds, interests in real 3 estate cooperatives, condominiums, and hereditaments, corporeal and 4 incorporeal, or any interest therein;

5 (((12))) (13) "Real estate transaction" includes the sale, 6 appraisal, brokering, exchange, purchase, rental, or lease of real 7 property, transacting or applying for a real estate loan, or the 8 provision of brokerage services;

9 (((13))) <u>(14)</u> "Dwelling" means any building, structure, or portion 10 thereof that is occupied as, or designed or intended for occupancy as, 11 a residence by one or more families, and any vacant land that is 12 offered for sale or lease for the construction or location thereon of 13 any such building, structure, or portion thereof;

(((14))) <u>(15)</u> "Sex" means gender;

15 (((15))) <u>(16)</u> "Aggrieved person" means any person who: (a) Claims 16 to have been injured by an unfair practice in a real estate 17 transaction; or (b) believes that he or she will be injured by an 18 unfair practice in a real estate transaction that is about to occur;

19 ((((16))) (17) "Complainant" means the person who files a complaint 20 in a real estate transaction;

21 (((17))) <u>(18)</u> "Respondent" means any person accused in a complaint 22 or amended complaint of an unfair practice in a real estate 23 transaction;

24 ((((18))) (19) "Credit transaction" includes any open or closed end 25 credit transaction, whether in the nature of a loan, retail installment transaction, credit card issue or charge, or otherwise, and whether for 26 27 personal or for business purposes, in which a service, finance, or interest charge is imposed, or which provides for repayment in 28 scheduled payments, when such credit is extended in the regular course 29 of any trade or commerce, including but not limited to transactions by 30 31 banks, savings and loan associations or other financial lending 32 institutions of whatever nature, stock brokers, or by a merchant or mercantile establishment which as part of its ordinary business permits 33 34 or provides that payment for purchases of property or service therefrom 35 may be deferred;

36 (((19))) <u>(20)</u> "Families with children status" means one or more 37 individuals who have not attained the age of eighteen years being 38 domiciled with a parent or another person having legal custody of such

individual or individuals, or with the designee of such parent or other person having such legal custody, with the written permission of such parent or other person. Families with children status also applies to any person who is pregnant or is in the process of securing legal custody of any individual who has not attained the age of eighteen years;

7 (((20))) <u>(21)</u> "Covered multifamily dwelling" means: (a) Buildings 8 consisting of four or more dwelling units if such buildings have one or 9 more elevators; and (b) ground floor dwelling units in other buildings 10 consisting of four or more dwelling units;

11 (((21))) <u>(22)</u> "Premises" means the interior or exterior spaces, 12 parts, components, or elements of a building, including individual 13 dwelling units and the public and common use areas of a building;

14 (((22))) <u>(23)</u> "Dog guide" means a dog that is trained for the 15 purpose of guiding blind persons or a dog that is trained for the 16 purpose of assisting hearing impaired persons;

17 (((23))) <u>(24)</u> "Service animal" means an animal that is trained for 18 the purpose of assisting or accommodating a disabled person's sensory, 19 mental, or physical disability.
