## SENATE BILL 5310

State of Washington 58th Legislature 2003 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to bond requirements for title insurance agents; 2 and adding a new section to chapter 48.29 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 48.29 RCW 5 to read as follows:

6 (1) At the time of filing an application for a title insurance 7 agent license, or any renewal or reinstatement of a title insurance 8 agent license, the applicant shall provide satisfactory evidence to the 9 commissioner of having obtained the following as evidence of financial 10 responsibility:

(a) A fidelity bond providing coverage in the aggregate amount of two hundred thousand dollars with a deductible no greater than ten thousand dollars covering the applicant and each corporate officer, partner, escrow officer, and employee of the applicant conducting the business of an escrow agent as defined in RCW 18.44.011 and exempt from licensing under RCW 18.44.021(6); and

(b) A surety bond in the amount of ten thousand dollars executed by the applicant as obligor and by a surety company authorized to do a surety business in this state as surety, unless the fidelity bond

obtained by the licensee to satisfy the requirement in (a) of this 1 2 subsection does not have a deductible. The bond shall run to the state of Washington as obligee, and shall run to the benefit of the state and 3 any person or persons who suffer loss by reason of the applicant's or 4 its employee's violation of this chapter. 5 The bond shall be conditioned that the obligor as licensee will faithfully conform to and 6 abide by this chapter and all rules adopted under this chapter, and 7 shall reimburse all persons who suffer loss by reason of a violation of 8 this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter. The bond shall be 9 10 continuous and may be canceled by the surety upon the surety giving written notice to the commissioner of its intent to cancel the bond. 11 12 The cancellation shall be effective thirty days after the notice is 13 received by the commissioner. Whether or not the bond is renewed, continued, reinstated, reissued, or otherwise extended, replaced, or 14 modified, including increases or decreases in the penal sum, it shall 15 be considered one continuous obligation, and the surety upon the bond 16 17 shall not be liable in an aggregate amount exceeding the penal sum set forth on the face of the bond. In no event shall the penal sum, or any 18 portion thereof, at two or more points in time be added together in 19 determining the surety's liability. The bond is not liable for any 20 penalties imposed on the licensee, including but not limited to, any 21 increased damages or attorneys' fees, or both, awarded under RCW 22 19.86.090. 23

24 (2) For the purposes of this section, a "fidelity bond" means a primary commercial blanket bond or its equivalent satisfactory to the 25 commissioner and written by an insurer authorized to transact this line 26 27 of business in the state of Washington. The bond shall provide fidelity coverage for any fraudulent or dishonest acts committed by any 28 one or more of the employees, officers, or owners as defined in the 29 bond, acting alone or in collusion with others. 30 The bond shall be for sole benefit of the title insurance agent 31 the and under no 32 circumstances whatsoever shall the bonding company be liable under the bond to any other party. The bond shall name the title insurance agent 33 as obligee and shall protect the obligee against the loss of money or 34 35 other real or personal property belonging to the obligee, or in which 36 the obligee has a pecuniary interest, or for which the obligee is 37 legally liable or held by the obligee in any capacity, whether the

obligee is legally liable therefor or not. The bond may be canceled by the insurer upon delivery of thirty days' written notice to the commissioner and to the title insurance agent.

4 (3) The fidelity bond and the surety bond shall be kept in full 5 force and effect as a condition precedent to the title insurance 6 agent's authority to transact business in this state, and the title 7 insurance agent shall supply the commissioner with satisfactory 8 evidence thereof upon request.

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
