- 1 AN ACT Relating to the learning assistance program; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 28A.165 RCW; and repealing RCW 28A.165.010,
- 3 28A.165.012, 28A.165.030, 28A.165.040, 28A.165.050, 28A.165.060,
- 4 28A.165.070, 28A.165.080, and 28A.165.090.

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5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. FINDINGS--INTENT. The legislature finds 7 that many students do not meet the state achievement standards in the 8 basic skills areas of reading, writing, and mathematics. Research 9 indicates that it is possible to close the achievement gap between 10 those assessed as below standard and those assessed as at or above standard by providing students with rigorous academic coursework 11 12 coupled with effective instructional strategies and additional learning Research also indicates that there is a clear pattern between 13 student achievement and socioeconomic status and that many of the 14 15 achieving below standard in schools students are with concentrations of poverty. It is the legislature's intent to assist 16 school districts in meeting the needs of underachieving students who 17 must have their achievement accelerated to close the achievement gap 18

- <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** PURPOSE. The learning assistance program 1 requirements in this chapter are designed to: (1) Assist school 2 districts in understanding the nature of their achievement gaps; and 3 (2) guide school districts in providing the most effective and 4 5 efficient practices in implementation of their program. Further, this chapter provides the means by which a school district becomes eligible 6 7 for learning assistance program funds and the distribution of those 8 funds.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** DEFINITIONS. Unless the context clearly 10 indicates otherwise the definitions in this section apply throughout 11 this chapter.
- 12 (1) "Achievement gap" means the disparity in achievement scores 13 among traditionally underachieving groups of students.
 - (2) "Approved program" means a program submitted to and approved by the office of the superintendent of public instruction and conducted pursuant to the plan that addresses the required elements as provided for in this chapter.
- 18 (3) "Basic skills areas" means reading, writing, and mathematics as 19 well as readiness associated with these skills.
 - (4) "Basic skills assessments" means one or more of the several basic skills assessments administered as part of the state's student assessment system, and assessments in the basic skills areas administered by local school districts.
 - (5) "Participating student" means a student in kindergarten through grade nine who scores below standard for his or her grade level on basic skills assessments and who is identified in the approved plan to receive services.
- 28 (6) "Underachieving students" means students with the greatest 29 academic deficits in basic skills as identified by basic skills 30 assessments.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. PROGRAM PLAN. Each school district applying for learning assistance program funds shall submit a plan for the use of these funds. The school district plan shall include the following:
- 34 (1) District and school-level data on reading, writing, and mathematics achievement as reported pursuant to chapter 28A.655 RCW and P.L. 107-110;

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- 1 (2) Processes used for identifying the underachieving students to 2 be served by the program, including the identification of school or 3 program sites providing program activities;
 - (3) How accelerated learning plans are developed and implemented for participating students, including:
 - (a) Achievement goals for the students;
- 7 (b) Roles of the student, parents, or guardians and teachers in the 8 plan;
 - (c) Communication procedures regarding student accomplishment; and
 - (d) Plan reviews and adjustments processes;
- 11 (4) How state level and classroom assessments are used to inform 12 instruction;
- 13 (5) How focused and intentional instructional strategies have been identified and implemented;
- 15 (6) How highly qualified instructional staff are developed and supported in the program and in participating schools;
 - (7) How other federal, state, district, and school resources are coordinated with school improvement plans and the district's strategic plan to support underachieving students; and
- 20 (8) How a program evaluation will be conducted to determine 21 direction for the following school year.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES. Use of best practices magnifies the opportunities for student success. The following are services and activities that may be supported by the learning assistance program:
 - (1) Extended learning time opportunities occurring:
 - (a) Before or after the regular school day;
- 28 (b) On Saturday; and

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- 29 (c) Beyond the regular school year;
- 30 (2) Professional development for certificated and classified staff 31 that focuses on:
 - (a) The needs of a diverse student population;
- 33 (b) Specific literacy and mathematics content and instructional 34 strategies; and
 - (c) The use of student work to quide effective instruction;
- 36 (3) Consultant teachers to assist in implementing effective 37 instructional practices by teachers serving participating students;

1 (4) Tutoring support for participating students; and

2 (5) Outreach activities and support for parents of participating students.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. PLAN APPROVAL PROCESS. A participating school district shall annually submit a program plan to the office of the superintendent of public instruction for approval. The program plan must address all of the elements in section 4 of this act and identify the program activities to be implemented from section 5 of this act.

School districts achieving reading and mathematics goals as prescribed in chapter 28A.655 RCW shall have their program approved once the program plan and activities submittal is completed.

School districts not achieving reading and mathematics goals as prescribed in chapter 28A.655 RCW and that are not in a state or federal program of school improvement shall be subject to program approval once the plan components are reviewed by the office of the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of receiving technical assistance in the final development of the plan.

School districts with one or more schools in a state or federal program of school improvement shall have their plans and activities reviewed and approved in conjunction with the state or federal program school improvement program requirements.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. FUNDS--ELIGIBILITY--DISTRIBUTION. Each school district that has established an approved program is eligible, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, for state funds made available for the purposes of such programs. The superintendent of public instruction shall distribute funds appropriated for the learning assistance program in accordance with the biennial appropriations act. The distribution formula is for district allocation purposes only.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. MONITORING. To ensure that school districts are meeting the requirements of an approved program, the superintendent of public instruction shall monitor such programs no less than once every four years. Individual student records shall be maintained at the school district.

- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** CAPTIONS NOT LAW. Captions used in this
- 5 act are not any part of the law.
