AN ACT Relating to early intervention services from birth to three for children with disabilities; adding new sections to chapter 28A.155 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds an urgent and 6 substantial need to enhance the development of all infants and toddlers 7 with disabilities in Washington to minimize developmental delays and to 8 maximize individual potential for learning and functioning.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.155 10 RCW to read as follows:

11 By September 1, 2008, each school district shall provide or contract for early intervention services to all eligible children with 12 13 disabilities from birth to three years of age. Eligibility shall be determined according to Part C of the federal individuals with 14 disabilities education act and as specified in WAC 392-172-114. School 15 districts shall provide or contract for early intervention services in 16 17 partnership with local birth-to-three lead agencies and birth-to-three 18 Services provided under this section shall not supplant providers.

services or funding currently provided in the state for early intervention services to eligible children with disabilities from birth to three years of age. The state-designated birth-to-three lead agency shall be payor of last resort for birth-to-three early intervention services provided under this section.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 28A.155 7 RCW to read as follows:

8 (1) There is established a birth-to-three task force to make 9 recommendations concerning policies, procedures, and regulations 10 necessary to implement an equitable statewide comprehensive system for 11 all eligible children with disabilities from birth to three years of 12 age.

(2) Members of the task force shall be jointly appointed by the
governor and the superintendent of public instruction by July 1, 2004,
and shall include, at a minimum, the following:

16 (a) Representatives of the following: Special education operations within the office of the superintendent of public instruction; the 17 Washington association of school administrators; the Washington state 18 school directors' association; an educational service district; the 19 20 special education advisory council; the infant toddler early intervention program within the department of social and health 21 services; the developmental disabilities section of the association of 22 23 county human services; the medical assistance administration within the 24 department of social and health services; the governor's head start state collaboration office; the division of child care and early 25 26 learning within the department of social and health services; the children with special health care needs program within the department 27 of health; a local health department/district; an Indian tribe 28 providing early intervention services; the Washington state chapter of 29 30 the American academy of pediatrics; the early childhood development 31 association of Washington; the neurodevelopmental centers of Washington; a nonprofit local birth-to-three lead agency, which is not 32 already represented in the membership of the task force; and an 33 advocacy group for children with disabilities from birth to three years 34 of age and their families; and 35

(b) A special education director from a school district providing
 early intervention services; a special education director from a school

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district not providing early intervention services; and four members of the state interagency coordinating council for infants and toddlers with disabilities and their families, three of whom shall be parents.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 28A.155
 RCW to read as follows:

6 The birth-to-three task force shall submit a report to the governor 7 and the superintendent of public instruction by December 1, 2006, 8 outlining their recommendations.

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
