- 1 AN ACT Relating to autism; creating new sections; and making an
- 2 appropriation.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that:
- 5 (1) Autism is a complex developmental disability that typically 6 appears during the first three years of life;
- 7 (2) As many as one million five hundred thousand Americans are 8 believed to have some form of autism;
- 9 (3) The number of children with autism is increasing;
- 10 (4) Researchers are investigating a number of theories, including 11 the link between heredity, genetics, and medical problems, and the
- 12 relationship between vaccines and autism; and
- 13 (5) Research into the causes and prevention of autism is urgently 14 needed.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The department of health shall contract for
- 16 a study on the causes and prevention of autism. The department shall
- 17 submit a report to the appropriate committees of the legislature by

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- 1 December 1, 2005, that includes recommendations to help decrease the
- 2 incidence of autism in Washington state.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The sum of two hundred fifty thousand
- 4 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for
- 5 the biennium ending June 30, 2005, from the general fund to the
- 6 department of health for the purposes of this act.

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
