TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE W. BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, 1 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 2 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 3 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE HONORABLE SPENCER ABRAHAM, SECRETARY OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY, AND TO 5 6 THE MEMBERS OF THE FEDERAL ENERGY REGULATORY COMMISSION, CHAIRMAN 7 PATRICK WOOD, III, COMMISSIONER NORA M. BROWNELL, AND COMMISSIONER WILLIAM L. MASSEY: 8

9 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 10 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 11 represent and petition as follows:

12 WHEREAS, The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission recently proposed 13 a new pricing policy for the rates of transmission owners that transfer 14 operational control of their transmission facilities to a Regional 15 Transmission Organization (RTO), form independent transmission 16 companies within RTOs, or pursue additional measures that promote 17 efficient operation and expansion of the transmission grid; and

18 WHEREAS, The proposed policy would create rate incentives based on 19 an unproven theory that it will improve grid performance, reduce 1 wholesale transmission and transactions costs, improve electric 2 reliability, and make electric wholesale competition more effective; 3 and

WHEREAS, The proposal offers a single model for the entire nation and fails to recognize regional differences in electricity generation and transmission or the benefits derived from public power; and

7 WHEREAS, Washington state has a comprehensive electricity policy,
8 which encourages efficiency while reflecting our unique resource base;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, The Northwest electricity system is different from most of 11 the rest of the nation and has produced affordable, cost-based rates 12 and reliable service for our region; and

WHEREAS, We believe the proposed pricing incentives would harm consumers in our region through increased costs without any positive cost-benefit analysis; and

16 WHEREAS, We believe the proposed pricing incentives will harm the 17 investment climate for new electricity infrastructure in the region due 18 to the Commission's inability to ensure delivery of the promised 19 incentives, and because the incentives first apply to existing 20 transmission and second to new investment, but only if a utility is a 21 member of an RTO; and

22 WHEREAS, We believe the proposed pricing incentives will make more 23 difficult the formation of any new regional transmission organization 24 that is, in fact, well-designed to fit Northwest regional circumstances 25 because the generic incentive is a new cost that may outweigh any 26 benefits of such an organization;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission leave the Northwest electricity system in place and withdraw its proposed new pricing policy for the rates of transmission owners until such time as a cost-benefit analysis is completed that indicates a positive benefit for Northwest consumers, and the region expresses its desire to form a new transmission organization; and

Your Memorialists further pray that in the event that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission does not withdraw its proposal, the President and Congress take action to prevent the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission from proceeding with their proposal.

Massey, the President of the 6 7 United States Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and 8 each member of Congress from the State of Washington.

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
