1 AN ACT Relating to apportionment of the cost of installing and 2 maintaining signals or warning devices at railroad-highway grade 3 crossings; amending RCW 81.53.271 and 81.53.281; and creating a new 4 section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that grade crossing, 7 rail trespass, and other safety issues continue to present a public 8 safety problem.

9 The legislature further finds that with the increased importance of 10 rail to freight and commuter mobility, there is a direct public benefit 11 in assisting local communities and railroads to work together to 12 address rail-related public safety concerns.

13 Sec. 2. RCW 81.53.271 and 1982 c 94 s 2 are each amended to read 14 as follows:

The petition shall set forth by description the location of the crossing or crossings, the type of signal or other warning device to be installed, the necessity from the standpoint of public safety for such installation, the approximate cost of installation and related work,

and the approximate annual cost of maintenance. If the commission 1 2 directs the installation of a grade crossing protective device, and a federal-aid funding program is available to participate in the costs of 3 such installation, ((both)) installation and maintenance costs of the 4 5 device shall be apportioned in accordance with the provisions of RCW 81.53.295. Otherwise if installation is directed by the commission, it 6 7 shall apportion the cost of installation and maintenance as provided in this section: 8

9 (1) Installation: (((1))) (a) The first twenty thousand dollars 10 shall be apportioned to the grade crossing protective fund created by 11 <u>RCW 81.53.281; and</u>

12 (b) The remainder of the cost shall be apportioned as follows:

13 (i) Sixty percent to the grade crossing protective fund, created by 14 RCW 81.53.281;

15 $((\frac{2}{2}))$ <u>(ii)</u> Thirty percent to the city, town, county, or state; 16 and

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(((3))) <u>(iii)</u> Ten percent to the railroad:

PROVIDED, That, if the proposed installation is located at a new 18 19 crossing requested by a city, town, county, or state, forty percent of the cost shall be apportioned to the city, town, county, or state, and 20 21 none to the railroad. If the proposed installation is located at a new crossing requested by a railroad, then the entire cost shall be 22 apportioned to the railroad. In the event the city, town, county, or 23 24 state should concurrently petition the commission and secure an order 25 authorizing the closure of an existing crossing or crossings in proximity to the crossing for which installation of signals or other 26 27 warning devices shall have been directed, the apportionment to the petitioning city, town, county, or state shall be reduced by ten 28 percent of the total cost for each crossing ordered closed and the 29 apportionment from the grade crossing protective fund increased 30 31 accordingly. This exception shall not be construed to permit a charge 32 to the grade crossing protective fund in an amount greater than the total cost otherwise apportionable to the city, town, county, or state. 33 No reduction shall be applied where one crossing is closed and another 34 opened in lieu thereof, nor to crossings of a private nature. 35

36 (2) Maintenance: (((1))) (a) Twenty-five percent to the grade 37 crossing protective fund, created by RCW 81.53.281; and

(((2))) <u>(b)</u> Seventy-five percent to the railroad:

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PROVIDED, That if the proposed installation is located at a new crossing requested by a railroad, then the entire cost shall be apportioned to the railroad.

4 **Sec. 3.** RCW 81.53.281 and 1998 c 245 s 166 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 There is hereby created in the state treasury a "grade crossing 7 protective fund $((\tau))$ " to ((which shall be transferred all moneys)appropriated for the purpose of carrying)) carry out the provisions of 8 RCW 81.53.261, 81.53.271, 81.53.281, 81.53.291, and 81.53.295; for 9 10 grants and/or subsidies to public, private, and nonprofit entities for rail safety projects authorized or ordered by the commission; and for 11 12 personnel and associated costs related to supervising and administering rail safety grants and/or subsidies. The commission shall transfer 13 from the public service revolving fund's miscellaneous fees and 14 penalties accounts moneys appropriated for these purposes as needed. 15 At the time the commission makes each allocation of cost to said grade 16 crossing protective fund, it shall certify that such cost shall be 17 payable out of said fund. ((When federal-aid highway funds are not 18 involved, the railroad shall, upon completion of the installation of 19 20 any such signal or other protective device and related work, present 21 its claim for reimbursement for the cost of installation and related 22 work from said fund of the amount allocated thereto by the commission. 23 The annual cost of maintenance shall be presented and paid in a like manner.)) When federal-aid highway funds are involved, the department 24 25 of transportation shall, upon entry of an order by the commission 26 requiring the installation or upgrading of a grade crossing protective device, submit to the commission an estimate for the cost of the 27 proposed installation and related work. Upon receipt of the estimate 28 29 the commission shall pay to the department of transportation the percentage of the estimate specified in RCW 81.53.295, as now or 30 31 hereafter amended, to be used as the grade crossing protective fund portion of the cost of the installation and related work. 32 ((The commission is hereby authorized to recover administrative costs from 33 34 said fund in an amount not to exceed three percent of the direct 35 appropriation provided for any biennium, and in the event 36 administrative costs exceed three percent of the appropriation, the

- 2 pursuant to RCW 81.24.010.
- 3 The office of financial management shall direct the state treasurer
- 4 to transfer to the motor vehicle fund an amount not to exceed
- 5 \$1,331,000 from the grade crossing protective fund for the 1987-89
- 6 fiscal biennium.))
- 7 The commission may adopt rules for the allocation of money from the
- 8 grade crossing protective fund.
