1 AN ACT Relating to information and services for children who are 2 deaf or hard of hearing; and adding a new chapter to Title 70 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds that children who 5 are deaf or hard of hearing and their families have unique needs 6 specific to the hearing loss. These unique needs reflect the 7 challenges children with hearing loss and their families encounter 8 related to their lack of full access to auditory communication.

9 (2) The legislature further finds that early detection of hearing 10 loss in a child and early intervention and treatment have been 11 demonstrated to be highly effective in facilitating a child's healthy 12 development in a manner consistent with the child's age and cognitive 13 ability.

14 (3) These combined factors support the need for early intervention 15 services providers with specialized training and expertise, spanning 16 the spectrum of available approaches and educational options, who can 17 address the unique characteristics and needs of each child who is deaf 18 or hard of hearing and that child's family. 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) There is established an advisory council 2 in the department of social and health services for the purpose of 3 advancing the development of a comprehensive and effective statewide 4 system to provide prompt and effective early interventions for children 5 in the state who are deaf or hard of hearing and their families.

Members of the advisory council shall 6 (2) have training, 7 experience, or interest in hearing loss in children. Membership shall include, but not be limited to, the following: 8 Pediatricians; 9 audiologists; teachers of the deaf and hard of hearing; parents of 10 children who are deaf or hard of hearing; a representative from the Washington state school for the deaf; and representatives of the infant 11 toddler early intervention program in the department of social and 12 13 health services, the department of health, and the office of the 14 superintendent of public instruction.

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1) The advisory council shall develop 16 statewide standards for early intervention services and early 17 intervention services providers specifically related to children who 18 are deaf or hard of hearing.

19 (2) The advisory council shall develop these standards by January20 1, 2005.

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. (1) The advisory council shall create a 22 pamphlet to be provided to the parents of a child in the state who is 23 diagnosed with hearing loss by their child's pediatrician or audiologist, as appropriate, upon diagnosis of hearing loss. 24 The 25 pamphlet shall contain, at minimum, information on the following: The variety of interventions and treatments available for children who are 26 27 deaf or hard of hearing; and resources for parent support, counseling, 28 financing, and education related to hearing loss in children.

(2) The pamphlet shall be available for distribution by July 1,2005.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. Sections 1 through 4 of this act constitute 32 a new chapter in Title 70 RCW.
