1            AN ACT Relating to tuition and fees charged at institutions of  
2 higher education to military and naval veterans of the Korean conflict;  
3 amending RCW 28B.15.558; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5            NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that military and  
6 naval veterans who have served their country in wars on foreign soil  
7 have risked their own lives to defend both the lives of all Americans  
8 and the freedom that define and distinguish our nation. It is the  
9 intent of the legislature to honor veterans of the Korean conflict for  
10 the public service they have provided to their country.

11            **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.15.558 and 1997 c 211 s 1 are each amended to read  
12 as follows:

13            (1) The governing boards of the state universities, the regional  
14 universities, The Evergreen State College, and the community colleges  
15 may waive all or a portion of the tuition and services and activities  
16 fees for state employees as defined under subsection (2) of this  
17 section, veterans of the Korean conflict, and members of the Washington

1 national guard. The enrollment of these persons is pursuant to the  
2 following conditions:

3 (a) Such persons shall register for and be enrolled in courses on  
4 a space available basis and no new course sections shall be created as  
5 a result of the registration;

6 (b) Enrollment information on persons registered pursuant to this  
7 section shall be maintained separately from other enrollment  
8 information and shall not be included in official enrollment reports,  
9 nor shall such persons be considered in any enrollment statistics that  
10 would affect budgetary determinations; and

11 (c) Persons registering on a space available basis shall be charged  
12 a registration fee of not less than five dollars.

13 (2) For the purposes of this section, "state employees" means  
14 persons employed half-time or more in one or more of the following  
15 employee classifications:

16 (a) Permanent employees in classified service under chapter 41.06  
17 RCW;

18 (b) Permanent employees governed by chapter 41.56 RCW pursuant to  
19 the exercise of the option under RCW 41.56.201;

20 (c) Permanent classified employees and exempt paraprofessional  
21 employees of technical colleges; and

22 (d) Faculty, counselors, librarians, and exempt professional and  
23 administrative employees at institutions of higher education as defined  
24 in RCW 28B.10.016.

25 (3) For the purposes of this section, "veterans of the Korean  
26 conflict" means persons who served on active duty in the armed forces  
27 of the United States during any portion of the period beginning June  
28 27, 1950, and ending January 31, 1955.

29 (4) In awarding waivers, an institution of higher education may  
30 award waivers to eligible persons employed by the institution before  
31 considering waivers for eligible persons who are not employed by the  
32 institution.

33 ((+4)) (5) If an institution of higher education exercises the  
34 authority granted under this section, it shall include all eligible  
35 state employees, veterans of the Korean conflict, and members of the  
36 Washington national guard in the pool of persons eligible to  
37 participate in the program.

1        (~~(5)~~) (6) In establishing eligibility to receive waivers,  
2 institutions of higher education may not discriminate between full-time  
3 employees and employees who are employed half-time or more.
