1 AN ACT Relating to animal cruelty; adding a new section to chapter 2 16.52 RCW; prescribing penalties; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 16.52 RCW 5 to read as follows:

6 (1) A person is guilty of the unlawful use of a hook if the person 7 utilizes, or attempts to use, a hook with the intent to pierce the 8 flesh or mouth of a bird or mammal.

9 (2) Unlawful use of a hook is a gross misdemeanor.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 12 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 13 immediately.
