- 2 and amending RCW 18.20.110.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.20.110 and 2000 c 47 s 4 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- The department shall make or cause to be made, at least ((a
- 7 yearly)) every eighteen months with an annual average of fifteen
- 8 months, an inspection and investigation of all boarding homes.
- 9 However, the department may delay an inspection to twenty-four months
- 10 if the boarding home has had three consecutive inspections with no
- 11 written notice of violations and has received no written notice of
- 12 violations resulting from complaint investigation during that same time
- 13 period. The department may at anytime make an unannounced inspection
- 14 of a licensed home to assure that the licensee is in compliance with
- 15 this chapter and the rules adopted under this chapter. Every
- 16 inspection shall focus primarily on actual or potential resident
- 17 outcomes, and may include an inspection of every part of the premises
- 18 and an examination of all records (other than financial records),
- 19 methods of administration, the general and special dietary, and the

stores and methods of supply. Following such an inspection or 1 2 inspections, written notice of any violation of this law or the rules adopted hereunder shall be given to the applicant or licensee and the 3 department. The department may prescribe by rule that any licensee or 4 applicant desiring to make specified types of alterations or additions 5 to its facilities or to construct new facilities shall, before 6 commencing such alteration, addition, or new construction, submit plans 7 and specifications therefor to the agencies responsible for plan 8 reviews for preliminary inspection and approval or recommendations with 9 10 respect to compliance with the rules and standards herein authorized.
