- 6 ((Any device used or useful in the diagnosis or treatment of 7 disease or injury)) (1) A medical device which is not in violation of 8 the Medical Device Amendments of 1976, Public Law No. 94-295, 90 Stat.
- 9 539, as amended from time to time, and as interpreted by the Food and

- 11 Services or its successor, shall be deemed to be in compliance with all

- 13 (2) The installation, maintenance, or repair of a medical device

- 17 19.28.101. This exemption does not include work providing electrical

- 1 raceways. This exemption covers only those factory engineers or third-
