AN ACT Relating to a motorcycle skills education program for threewheeled motorcycles; amending RCW 46.20.500, 46.20.505, 46.20.515, 46.81A.010, and 46.81A.020; creating a new section; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.500 and 2002 c 247 s 6 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

8 (1) No person may drive <u>either</u> a <u>two-wheeled</u> or <u>a three-wheeled</u> 9 motorcycle, or a motor-driven cycle unless such person has a valid 10 driver's license specially endorsed by the director to enable the 11 holder to drive such vehicles.

12 (2) However, a person sixteen years of age or older, holding a 13 valid driver's license of any class issued by the state of the person's 14 residence, may operate a moped without taking any special examination 15 for the operation of a moped.

16

(3) No driver's license is required for operation of an electric-

assisted bicycle if the operator is at least sixteen years of age.
 Persons under sixteen years of age may not operate an electric-assisted
 bicycle.

4 (4) No driver's license is required to operate an electric personal
5 assistive mobility device.

6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.20.505 and 2002 c 352 s 16 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

8 Every person applying for a special endorsement of a driver's 9 license authorizing such person to drive a two or three-wheeled motorcycle or a motor-driven cycle shall pay a fee of five dollars, 10 11 which is not refundable. In addition, the endorsement fee for the 12 initial motorcycle endorsement shall not exceed ten dollars, and the subsequent renewal endorsement fee shall not exceed twenty-five 13 dollars, unless the endorsement is renewed or extended for a period 14 other than five years, in which case the subsequent renewal endorsement 15 fee shall not exceed five dollars for each year that the endorsement is 16 17 renewed or extended. The initial and renewal endorsement fees shall be deposited in the motorcycle safety education account of the highway 18 19 safety fund.

20 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.20.515 and 2002 c 197 s 1 are each amended to read 21 as follows:

22 The motorcycle endorsement examination must emphasize maneuvers 23 necessary for on-street operation, including emergency braking and 24 turning as may be required to avoid an impending collision. The 25 examination for a two-wheeled motorcycle endorsement and the examination for a three-wheeled motorcycle endorsement must be separate 26 and distinct examinations emphasizing the skills and maneuvers 27 necessary to operate each type of motorcycle. The department may waive 28 all or part of the examination for persons who satisfactorily complete 29 30 the voluntary motorcycle operator training and education program authorized under RCW 46.20.520 or who satisfactorily complete a private 31 motorcycle skills education course that has been certified by the 32 33 department under RCW 46.81A.020.

34 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.81A.010 and 1988 c 227 s 2 are each amended to read 35 as follows:

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Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
 this section apply throughout this chapter.

3 (1) "Motorcycle skills education program" means a motorcycle rider4 skills training program to be administered by the department.

- (2) "Department" means the department of licensing.

(3) "Director" means the director of licensing.

7 (4) "Motorcycle" means a ((motorcycle licensed under chapter 46.16 RCW, and does not include motorized bicycles, mopeds, scooters, off-8 road motorcycles, motorized tricycles, side-car equipped motorcycles, 9 or four-wheel all-terrain vehicles)) motor vehicle designed to travel 10 on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, on which the 11 12 driver rides astride the motor unit or power train and is designed to 13 be steered with a handle bar, but excluding farm tractors, electric personal assistive mobility devices, mopeds, motorized bicycles, and 14 15 off-road motorcycles.

16 Sec. 5. RCW 46.81A.020 and 2002 c 197 s 2 are each amended to read 17 as follows:

(1) The director shall administer and enforce the law pertaining tothe motorcycle skills education program as set forth in this chapter.

(2) The director may adopt and enforce reasonable rules that areconsistent with this chapter.

(3) The director shall revise the Washington motorcycle safetyprogram to:

(a) Institute ((a)) separate novice and advanced motorcycle skills 24 25 education courses for both ((novice and advanced motorcycle riders)) 26 two-wheeled and three-wheeled motorcycles that ((is)) are each a minimum of eight hours and no more than sixteen hours at a cost of (i) 27 no more than fifty dollars for Washington state residents under the age 28 of eighteen, and (ii) no more than one hundred dollars for Washington 29 state residents who are eighteen years of age or older and military 30 31 personnel of any age stationed in Washington state;

(b) Encourage the use of loaned or used motorcycles for use in themotorcycle skills education course if the instructor approves them;

34 (c) Require all instructors <u>for two-wheeled motorcycles</u> to conduct 35 at least three classes in a one-year period<u>, and all instructors for</u> 36 <u>three-wheeled motorcycles to conduct at least one class in a one-year</u> 37 <u>period</u>, to maintain their teaching eligibility; (d) Encourage the use of radio or intercom equipped helmets when,
 in the opinion of the instructor, radio or intercom equipped helmets
 improve the quality of instruction.

(4) The department may enter into agreements to review and certify 4 that a private motorcycle skills education course meets educational 5 standards equivalent to those required of courses conducted under the 6 7 motorcycle skills education program. An agreement entered into under this subsection must provide that the department may conduct periodic 8 audits to ensure that educational standards continue to meet those 9 10 required for courses conducted under the motorcycle skills education program, and that the costs of the review, certification, and audit 11 12 process will be borne by the party seeking certification.

13 (5) The department shall obtain and compile information from 14 applicants for a motorcycle endorsement regarding whether they have 15 completed a state approved or certified motorcycle skills education 16 course.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. This act shall be known as the Monty Lish 18 Memorial Act.
