1 AN ACT Relating to fish and wildlife automated recreational
2 licensing; and amending RCW 77.32.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.32.050 and 2000 c 107 s 266 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 All recreational licenses, permits, tags, and stamps required by
7 this title and raffle tickets authorized under chapter 77.12 RCW shall
8 be issued under the authority of the commission. The commission shall
9 adopt rules for the issuance of recreational licenses, permits, tags,
10 stamps, and raffle tickets, and for the collection, payment, and
11 handling of license fees, terms and conditions to govern dealers, and
12 dealers' fees. A transaction fee on recreational ~~((licenses))~~
13 documents issued through an automated licensing system may be set by
14 the commission and collected from licensees. The department may
15 authorize all or part of such fee to be paid directly to a contractor
16 providing automated licensing system services. Fees retained by
17 dealers shall be uniform throughout the state. The department shall
18 authorize dealers to collect and retain dealer fees of at least two
19 dollars for purchase of a standard hunting or fishing recreational

1 license document, except that the commission may set a lower dealer fee
2 for issuance of tags or when a licensee buys a license that involves a
3 stamp or display card format rather than a standard department
4 licensing document form.
