- AN ACT Relating to payments to jurors; and amending RCW 2.36.150.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 2.36.150 and 1987 c 202 s 105 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- Jurors shall receive for each day's attendance, besides mileage at the rate determined under RCW 43.03.060, the following ((compensation))
- 7 <u>expense payments</u>:
- 8 (1) Grand jurors may receive up to twenty-five dollars but in no gase less than ten dollars;
- 10 (2) Petit jurors may receive up to twenty-five dollars but in no 11 case less than ten dollars;
- 12 (3) Coroner's jurors may receive up to twenty-five dollars but in no case less than ten dollars;
- 14 (4) District court jurors may receive up to twenty-five dollars but 15 in no case less than ten dollars:
- 16 PROVIDED, That a person excused from jury service at his or her own
- 17 request shall be allowed not more than a per diem and such mileage, if
- 18 any, as to the court shall seem just and equitable under all
- 19 circumstances: PROVIDED FURTHER, That the state shall fully reimburse

- 1 the county in which trial is held for all jury fees and witness fees
- 2 related to criminal cases which result from incidents occurring within
- 3 an adult or juvenile correctional institution: PROVIDED FURTHER, That
- 4 the ((compensation paid)) expense payments paid to jurors shall be
- 5 determined by the county legislative authority and shall be uniformly
- 6 applied within the county.
