## <u>3SHB 1226</u> - H AMD 850 By Representative Anderson

## FAILED 02/13/2006

Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

"NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. It is the purpose of this act to create a 3 4 citizens' commission to establish proper campaign contribution limits, 5 thus removing political considerations in fixing the appropriateness of 6 the amount of such limits. The commission shall establish campaign 7 contributions that protect citizen rights as provided for in Article I, 8 of the state Constitution section 5 while ensuring public 9 accountability and citizen access to elected office.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The Washington citizens' commission on 11 campaign contribution limits is created to consist of fourteen members 12 to be selected as provided in this section.

(1) Seven of the fourteen commission members shall be selected by lot by the secretary of state from among those registered voters eligible to vote at the time persons are selected for appointment to full terms on the commission. No two members shall come from the same county. The secretary shall establish policies and procedures for conducting the selection by lot.

19 (2) The remaining seven of the fourteen commission members, all 20 residents of this state, shall be selected jointly by the speaker of 21 the house of representatives and the president of the senate. All 22 members shall serve four-year terms and the names of the seven persons 23 selected in this subsection for appointment to the commission shall be 24 forwarded to the governor no later than July 1st every two years.

(3) No person may be appointed to more than two terms. No member of the commission may be removed during his or her term of office unless for cause of incapacity, incompetence, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office, or for a disqualifying change of residence. The unexcused absence of any person who is a member of the commission from

two consecutive meetings of the commission shall constitute the 1 2 relinquishment of that person's membership on the commission. Such a relinquishment creates a vacancy in that person's position on the 3 commission. A member's absence may be excused by the chair of the 4 5 commission upon the member's written request if the chair believes there is just cause for the absence. Such a request must be received 6 7 by the chair before the meeting for which the absence is to be excused. A member's absence from a meeting of the commission may also be excused 8 9 during the meeting for which the member is absent by the affirmative 10 vote of a majority of the members of the commission present at the 11 meeting.

12 (4) No state official, public employee, or lobbyist, or immediate 13 family member of the official, employee, or lobbyist, subject to the 14 registration requirements of chapter 42.17 RCW, is eligible for 15 membership on the commission. As used in this subsection, the phrase 16 "immediate family" means the parents, spouse, siblings, children, or 17 dependent relative of the official, employee, or lobbyist whether or 18 not living in the household of the official, employee, or lobbyist.

19 (5) Upon a vacancy in any position on the commission, a successor 20 shall be selected and appointed to fill the unexpired term. The 21 selection and appointment shall be concluded within thirty days of the 22 date the position becomes vacant and shall be conducted in the same 23 manner as originally provided.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) The commission shall adopt a schedule of 25 campaign contribution limits for:

26 (a) Candidates for state legislative office;

27 (b) Candidates for state office other than state legislative 28 office;

29 (c) Candidates for county office in a county that has over two 30 hundred thousand registered voters;

31 (d) Candidates for special purpose district office if that district 32 is authorized to provide freight and passenger transfer and terminal 33 facilities and that district has over two hundred thousand registered 34 voters;

(e) Persons holding an office in (a) through (d) of this subsectionagainst whom recall charges have been filed or to a political committee

1 having the expectation of making expenditures in support of the recall

2 of a person holding the office;

3 (f) Caucus political committees;

4 (g) Bona fide political parties;

5 (h) Candidates for the state supreme court and court of appeals.

6 (2) Members of the commission shall receive no compensation for 7 their services, but shall be eligible to receive a subsistence 8 allowance and travel expenses pursuant to RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

9 (3) The members of the commission shall elect a chair from among 10 their number. The commission shall set a schedule of campaign 11 contribution limits by an affirmative vote of not less than eight 12 members of the commission.

(4) The commission shall file its initial schedule of campaign 13 contribution limits for individuals included in subsection (1) of this 14 section with the secretary of state no later than October 1, 2006, and 15 shall file a schedule biennially thereafter. Each schedule shall be 16 17 filed in legislative bill form, shall be assigned a chapter number and published with the session laws of the legislature, and shall be 18 codified by the statute law committee. The signature of the chair of 19 the commission shall be affixed to each schedule submitted to the 20 secretary of state. The chair shall certify that the schedule has been 21 22 adopted in accordance with the provisions of state law and with the rules, if any, of the commission. The schedules shall become effective 23 ninety days after the filing thereof. 24

25 (5) Before the filing of any campaign contribution limit schedule, the commission shall first develop a proposed schedule and then hold no 26 27 fewer than four regular meetings as defined by chapter 42.30 RCW to take public testimony on the proposed schedule within the four months 28 immediately preceding the filing. At the last public hearing that is 29 held as a regular meeting on the proposed schedule, the commission 30 31 shall adopt the schedule as originally proposed or as amended at that 32 meeting that will be filed with the secretary of state.

(6) All meetings, actions, hearings, and business of the commission
shall be subject in full to the open public meetings act under chapter
42.30 RCW.

36 (7) The campaign contribution limits filed by the commission shall 37 take effect on January 1, 2007, and shall continue until modified by 38 the commission under this section." <u>EFFECT:</u> Replaces campaign contribution limits in the proposed substitute bill with a fourteen member Washington citizens' commission that will establish campaign contribution limits.

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
