Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 1 2 following:

3 "Sec. 1. RCW 29A.48.010 and 2004 c 266 s 14 are each amended 4 to read as follows:

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(1) Before January 1, 2012:

6 (a) With express authorization from the county legislative 7 authority, the county auditor may conduct all primary, special, and general elections entirely by mail ballot. The county legislative 8 9 authority must give the county auditor at least ninety days' notice 10 before the first election to be conducted entirely by mail ballot. 11 If the county legislative authority and the county auditor decide 12 to return to a polling place election environment, the county legislative authority must give the county auditor at least one 13 hundred eighty days' notice before the first election to be 14 conducted using polling places. Authorization under this 15 subsection must apply to all primary, special, and general 16 17 elections conducted by the county auditor.

(b) The county auditor may designate any precinct having fewer 18 19 than two hundred active registered voters at the time of closing of 20 voter registration as provided in RCW 29A.08.140 as a mail ballot 21 precinct. ((The county auditor shall notify each registered voter 22 by mail that for all future primaries and elections the voting in 23 his or her precinct will be by mail ballot only.)) Authorization 24 from the county legislative authority is not required to designate 25 a precinct as a mail ballot precinct under this subsection. Τn 26 determining the number of registered voters in a precinct for the 27 purposes of this section, persons who are ongoing absentee voters 28 under RCW 29A.40.040 shall not be counted. Nothing in this section may be construed as altering the vote tallying requirements of RCW
29A.60.230.

3 (c) If the county legislative authority and county auditor 4 determine under (a) of this subsection, or if the county auditor 5 determines under (b) of this subsection, to return to a polling 6 place election environment, the auditor shall notify each 7 registered voter, by mail, of this and shall provide the address of 8 the polling place to be used.

9 (2) Effective January 1, 2012, all primary, special, and 10 general elections must be conducted entirely by mail ballot. A 11 county legislative authority may petition the secretary of state to conduct elections in a polling place environment for up to two 12 years after January 1, 2012. The secretary of state may allow such 13 a county to conduct elections in a polling place environment for 14 15 any period of time up to January 1, 2014, after which the county must conduct all elections entirely by mail ballot. 16

17 (3) Before changing a county or precinct from a polling place election environment to an all-mail election environment, the 18 19 county auditor shall notify each affected registered voter by mail 20 that for all future primaries and elections the voting will be by 21 mail ballot only. The auditor shall mail each active voter a 22 ballot at least eighteen days before a primary, general election, 23 or special election. The auditor shall send each inactive voter 24 either a ballot or an application to receive a ballot at least eighteen days before a primary, general election, or special 25 election. The auditor shall determine which of the two is to be 26 27 If the inactive voter returns a voted ballot, the ballot sent. shall be counted and the voter's status restored to active. If the 28 29 inactive voter completes and returns an application, a ballot shall 30 be sent and the voter's status restored to active. The 31 requirements regarding certification, reporting, and the mailing of 32 overseas and military ballots in RCW ((29.36.270)) 29A.40.070 apply 33 to <u>elections conducted by</u> mail ballot ((precincts)).

34 ((If the precinct exceeds two hundred registered voters, or the 35 auditor determines to return to a polling place election 36 environment, the auditor shall notify each registered voter, by 37 mail, of this and shall provide the address of the polling place to 38 be used.)) **EFFECT:** Requires all elections to be conducted by mail beginning January 1, 2012. Allows a county legislative authority to petition the Secretary of State to extend this date for up to two years. Requires all elections conducted by mail to provide voting access to individuals with disabilities.
