**EFFECT:** Adds proviso language to the Department of Ecology's hazardous waste program to existing state toxics control account funds that are provided to implement the cleanup priority act. Specifies that funds must be spent consistent to cleanup priority act legislation, funds may not be used for substances other than dangerous wastes or hazardous substances released into the environment, and must be used by the department to issue explanatory statements and rules within the limits of the hazardous waste management statute.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Adds budget language to existing \$2,405,000 from the state toxics control account.
