6 (1) "Basic necessities of life" means food, water, shelter, 7 clothing, and medically necessary health care, including but not 8 limited to health-related treatment or activities, hygiene, oxygen, and 9 medication.

10 (2)(a) "Bodily injury" means physical pain or injury, illness, or 11 an impairment of physical condition;

(b) "Substantial bodily harm" means bodily injury which involves a temporary but substantial disfigurement, or which causes a temporary but substantial loss or impairment of the function of any bodily part or organ, or which causes a fracture of any bodily part;

16 (c) "Great bodily harm" means bodily injury which creates a high 17 probability of death, or which causes serious permanent disfigurement, 18 or which causes a permanent or protracted loss or impairment of the 19 function of any bodily part or organ.

(3) "Child" means a person under eighteen years of age.

21 (4) "Dependent person" means a person who, because of physical or 22 mental disability, or because of extreme advanced age, is dependent 23 upon another person to provide the basic necessities of life. Α 24 resident of a nursing home, as defined in RCW 18.51.010, a resident of an adult family home, as defined in RCW 70.128.010, and a frail elder 25 or vulnerable adult, as defined in RCW 74.34.020(((+))) (13), 26 is 27 presumed to be a dependent person for purposes of this chapter.

(5) "Employed" means hired by a dependent person, another person acting on behalf of a dependent person, or by an organization or governmental entity, to provide to a dependent person any of the basic necessities of life. A person may be "employed" regardless of whether the person is paid for the services or, if paid, regardless of who pays for the person's services.

4 (6) "Parent" has its ordinary meaning and also includes a guardian 5 and the authorized agent of a parent or guardian.

6 (7) "Abandons" means leaving a child or other dependent person 7 without the means or ability to obtain one or more of the basic 8 necessities of life.

9 (8) "Good samaritan" means any individual or group of individuals who: (a) Is not related to the dependent person; (b) voluntarily 10 provides assistance or services of any type to the dependent person; 11 (c) is not paid, given gifts, or made a beneficiary of any assets 12 valued at five hundred dollars or more, for any reason, by the 13 14 dependent person, the dependent person's family, or the dependent person's estate; and (d) does not commit or attempt to commit any other 15 crime against the dependent person or the dependent person's estate. 16

17 **Sec. 2.** RCW 9A.42.020 and 1997 c 392 s 510 are each amended to 18 read as follows:

(1) A parent of a child, the person entrusted with the physical 19 20 custody of a child or dependent person, a person who has assumed the 21 responsibility to provide to a dependent person the basic necessities of life, or a person employed to provide to the child or dependent 22 person the basic necessities of life is guilty of criminal mistreatment 23 24 in the first degree if he or she recklessly, as defined in RCW 9A.08.010, causes great bodily harm to a child or dependent person by 25 26 withholding any of the basic necessities of life.

27 (2) Criminal mistreatment in the first degree is a class B felony.

28 **Sec. 3.** RCW 9A.42.030 and 1997 c 392 s 511 are each amended to 29 read as follows:

(1) A parent of a child, the person entrusted with the physical custody of a child or dependent person, <u>a person who has assumed the</u> <u>responsibility to provide to a dependent person the basic necessities</u> of life, or a person employed to provide to the child or dependent person the basic necessities of life is guilty of criminal mistreatment in the second degree if he or she recklessly, as defined in RCW 9A.08.010, either (a) creates an imminent and substantial risk of death or great bodily harm, or (b) causes substantial bodily harm by withholding any of the basic necessities of life.

(2) Criminal mistreatment in the second degree is a class C felony.

5 Sec. 4. RCW 9A.42.035 and 2000 c 76 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

 risk of bodily injury to a child or dependent person by withholding any
