2 following:

3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 29A.08
4 RCW to read as follows:

5 In order to vote at any election or primary, whether at a polling
6 place or by absentee or mail ballot, a person must have registered to
7 vote at least thirty days before the election or primary, regardless of
8 the person's status as an absentee, mail ballot, out-of-state,
9 overseas, or service voter.

10 **Sec. 2.** RCW 29A.04.103 and 2003 c 111 s 118 are each amended to
11 read as follows:

12 "Out-of-state voter" means any (~~elector~~) registered voter of the
13 state of Washington outside the state but not outside the territorial
14 limits of the United States or the District of Columbia.

15 **Sec. 3.** RCW 29A.04.109 and 2003 c 111 s 119 are each amended to
16 read as follows:

17 "Overseas voter" means any (~~elector~~) registered voter of the
18 state of Washington outside the territorial limits of the United States
19 or the District of Columbia.

20 **Sec. 4.** RCW 29A.04.163 and 2003 c 111 s 127 are each amended to
21 read as follows:

22 "Service voter" means any (~~elector~~) registered voter of the state
23 of Washington who is a member of the armed forces under 42 U.S.C. Sec.
24 1973 ff-6 while in active service, is a student or member of the
25 faculty at a United States military academy, is a member of the
26 merchant marine of the United States, is a program participant as

1 defined in RCW 40.24.020, or is a member of a religious group or
2 welfare agency officially attached to and serving with the armed forces
3 of the United States.

4 **Sec. 5.** RCW 29A.08.010 and 2003 c 111 s 201 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 As used in this chapter: "Information required for voter
7 registration" or "required information" means the minimum information
8 provided on a voter registration application that is required by the
9 county auditor in order to place a voter registration applicant on the
10 voter registration rolls. This information includes proof that the
11 applicant is a United States citizen, the applicant's name, (~~complete~~
12 ~~residence~~) residential address, date of birth, and a signature
13 attesting to the truth of the information provided on the application.
14 Proof of citizenship is not required if an applicant is transferring
15 his or her voter registration within a county or between counties in
16 this state. All other information supplied is ancillary and not to be
17 used as grounds for not registering an applicant to vote.

18 **Sec. 6.** RCW 29A.08.010 and 2004 c 267 s 102 are each amended to
19 read as follows:

20 As used in this chapter: "Information required for voter
21 registration" or "required information" means the minimum information
22 provided on a voter registration application that is required by the
23 county auditor in order to place a voter registration applicant on the
24 voter registration rolls. This information includes proof that the
25 applicant is a United States citizen, the applicant's name, (~~complete~~
26 ~~residence~~) residential address, date of birth, Washington state
27 driver's license number, Washington state identification card, or the
28 last four digits of the applicant's social security number, and a
29 signature attesting to the truth of the information provided on the
30 application(~~(, and a check or indication in the box confirming the~~
31 ~~individual is a United States citizen)~~). If the individual does not
32 have a driver's license, state identification card, or Social Security
33 number the registrant must be issued a unique voter registration number
34 (~~and~~) in order to be placed on the voter registration rolls. All
35 other information supplied is ancillary and not to be used as grounds
36 for not registering an applicant to vote. Modification of the language

1 of the official Washington state voter registration form by the voter
2 will not be accepted and will cause the rejection of the registrant's
3 application. Proof of citizenship is not required if an applicant is
4 transferring his or her voter registration within a county or between
5 counties in this state.

6 **Sec. 7.** RCW 29A.08.030 and 2004 c 267 s 104 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 The definitions set forth in this section apply throughout this
9 chapter, unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

10 (1) "Verification notice" means a notice sent by the county auditor
11 or secretary of state to a voter registration applicant and is used to
12 verify or collect information about the applicant in order to complete
13 the registration.

14 (2) "Acknowledgement notice" means a notice sent by nonforwardable
15 mail by the county auditor or secretary of state to a registered voter
16 to acknowledge a voter registration transaction, which can include
17 initial registration, transfer, or reactivation of an inactive
18 registration. An acknowledgement notice may be a voter registration
19 card.

20 (3) "Confirmation notice" means a notice sent to a registered voter
21 by first class forwardable mail at the address indicated on the voter's
22 permanent registration record and to any other address at which the
23 county auditor or secretary of state could reasonably expect mail to be
24 received by the voter in order to confirm the voter's residence
25 address. The confirmation notice must be designed (~~(so that the voter~~
26 ~~may update his or her current residence address)) to include a postage
27 prepaid, preaddressed return form by which the registrant may verify
28 the address information.~~

29 **Sec. 8.** RCW 29A.08.107 and 2004 c 267 s 106 are each amended to
30 read as follows:

31 (1) The secretary of state must review the information provided by
32 each voter registration applicant to ensure that (~~(either))~~ the
33 driver's license number, state identification card number, or the last
34 four digits of the social security number match the information
35 maintained by the Washington department of licensing or the social
36 security administration. If a match cannot be made, the secretary of

1 state or county auditor must correspond with the applicant to (~~resolve~~
2 ~~the discrepancy~~) obtain from the applicant a copy of a current photo
3 identification, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, or government
4 check or another government document that shows the applicant's name
5 and address.

6 (2) If the applicant fails to respond to any correspondence
7 required in this section to confirm information provided on a voter
8 registration application(~~(7)~~) within (~~(thirty)~~) forty-five days, the
9 (~~(secretary of state shall forward the application to the appropriate~~
10 ~~county auditor for document storage)~~) applicant will not be registered
11 to vote.

12 (3) Only after the secretary of state has confirmed (~~(that an~~
13 ~~applicant's driver's license number or the last four digits of the~~
14 ~~applicant's social security number match existing records with the~~
15 ~~Washington department of licensing or the social security~~
16 ~~administration or determined that the applicant does not have either a~~
17 ~~driver's license number or social security number)~~) the applicant's
18 identity, as required by subsection (1) of this section, may the
19 applicant be placed on the official list of registered voters.

20 **Sec. 9.** RCW 29A.08.110 and 2003 c 111 s 206 are each amended to
21 read as follows:

22 (1) On receipt of an application for voter registration under this
23 chapter, the county auditor shall review the application to determine
24 whether the information supplied is complete. An application that
25 contains proof that the applicant is a United States citizen, the
26 applicant's name, complete valid residence address, date of birth, and
27 signature attesting to the truth of the information provided on the
28 application is complete. Proof of citizenship is not required if an
29 applicant is transferring his or her voter registration within a county
30 or between counties in this state. If it is not complete, the auditor
31 shall promptly mail a verification notice of the deficiency to the
32 applicant. This verification notice shall require the applicant to
33 provide the missing information. If the verification notice is not
34 returned by the applicant or is returned as undeliverable (~~(the auditor~~
35 ~~shall not place)~~), the name of the applicant may not be placed on the
36 county voter list. If the applicant provides the required information,

1 the applicant shall be registered to vote as of the date of mailing of
2 the original voter registration application.

3 (2) If the information is complete, the applicant is considered to
4 be registered to vote as of the original date of mailing or date of
5 delivery, whichever is applicable. The auditor shall record the
6 appropriate precinct identification, taxing district identification,
7 and date of registration on the voter's record. Within forty-five days
8 after the receipt of an application but no later than seven days before
9 the next primary, special election, or general election, the auditor
10 shall send to the applicant, by first class mail, an acknowledgement
11 notice identifying the registrant's precinct and containing such other
12 information as may be required by the secretary of state. The postal
13 service shall be instructed not to forward a voter registration card to
14 any other address and to return to the auditor any card which is not
15 deliverable. If the applicant has indicated that he or she is
16 registered to vote in another county in Washington but has also
17 provided an address within the auditor's county that is for voter
18 registration purposes, the auditor shall send, on behalf of the
19 registrant, a registration cancellation notice to the auditor of that
20 other county and the auditor receiving the notice shall cancel the
21 registrant's voter registration in that other county. If the
22 registrant has indicated on the form that he or she is registered to
23 vote within the county but has provided a new address within the county
24 that is for voter registration purposes, the auditor shall transfer the
25 voter's registration.

26 (3) If an acknowledgement notice card is properly mailed as
27 required by this section to the address listed by the voter as being
28 the voter's mailing address and the notice is subsequently returned to
29 the auditor by the postal service as being undeliverable to the voter
30 at that address, the auditor shall promptly send the voter a
31 confirmation notice. The auditor shall place the voter's registration
32 on inactive status pending a response from the voter to the
33 confirmation notice.

34 **Sec. 10.** RCW 29A.08.110 and 2004 c 267 s 107 are each amended to
35 read as follows:

36 (1) On receipt of an application for voter registration, the county
37 auditor shall review the application to determine whether the

1 information supplied is complete. An application is considered
2 complete only if it contains proof that the applicant is a United
3 States citizen, the applicant's name, complete valid residence address,
4 date of birth, and signature attesting to the truth of the information
5 provided and an indication the license information or social security
6 number has been confirmed by the secretary of state. Proof of
7 citizenship is not required if an applicant is transferring his or her
8 voter registration within a county or between counties in this state.
9 If it is not complete, the auditor shall promptly mail a verification
10 notice of the deficiency to the applicant. This verification notice
11 shall require the applicant to provide the missing information. If the
12 verification notice is not returned by the applicant or is returned as
13 undeliverable (~~the auditor shall not place~~), the name of the
14 applicant may not be placed on the county voter list. If the applicant
15 provides the required verified information, the applicant shall be
16 registered to vote as of the date of mailing of the original voter
17 registration application.

18 (2) In order to prevent duplicate registration records, all
19 complete voter registration applications must be screened against
20 existing voter registration records in the official statewide voter
21 registration list. If a match of an existing record is found in the
22 official list the record must be updated with the new information
23 provided on the application. If the new information indicates that the
24 voter has changed his or her county of residence, the application must
25 be forwarded to the voter's new county of residence for processing. If
26 the new information indicates that the voter remains in the same county
27 of residence or if the applicant is a new voter the application must be
28 processed by the county of residence.

29 (3) If the information required in subsection (1) of this section
30 is complete, the applicant is considered to be registered to vote as of
31 the original date of mailing or date of delivery, whichever is
32 applicable. The auditor shall record the appropriate precinct
33 identification, taxing district identification, and date of
34 registration on the voter's record in the state voter registration
35 list. Within forty-five days after the receipt of an application but
36 no later than seven days before the next primary, special election, or
37 general election, the auditor shall send to the applicant, by first
38 class mail, an acknowledgement notice identifying the registrant's

1 precinct and containing such other information as may be required by
2 the secretary of state. The postal service shall be instructed not to
3 forward a voter registration card to any other address and to return to
4 the auditor any card which is not deliverable. If the registrant has
5 indicated on the form that he or she is registered to vote within the
6 county but has provided a new address within the county that is for
7 voter registration purposes, the auditor shall transfer the voter's
8 registration.

9 (4) If an acknowledgement notice card is properly mailed as
10 required by this section to the address listed by the voter as being
11 the voter's mailing address and the notice is subsequently returned to
12 the auditor by the postal service as being undeliverable to the voter
13 at that address, the auditor shall promptly send the voter a
14 confirmation notice. The auditor shall place the voter's registration
15 on inactive status pending a response from the voter to the
16 confirmation notice.

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 11.** A new section is added to chapter 29A.08
18 RCW to read as follows:

19 No person registering to vote, who meets all the qualifications of
20 a registered voter in the state of Washington, may be disqualified
21 because of a nontraditional address being used as a residence address.
22 Voters using such an address will be registered and assigned to a
23 precinct based on the location provided. Voters without a traditional
24 address will be registered at the county courthouse, city hall, or
25 other public building near the area that the voter considers his or her
26 residence. Registering at a nontraditional address will not disqualify
27 a voter from requesting ongoing absentee voter status if the voter
28 designates a valid mailing address.

29 For the purposes of this section, "nontraditional address" includes
30 shelters, parks, or other identifiable locations that the voter deems
31 to be his or her residence.

32 **Sec. 12.** RCW 29A.08.115 and 2004 c 267 s 108 are each amended to
33 read as follows:

34 A person or organization collecting voter registration application
35 forms must transmit the forms to the secretary of state or a

1 ((designee)) county auditor at least once weekly. The registration
2 date on such forms will be the date they are received by the secretary
3 of state or county auditor.

4 **Sec. 13.** RCW 29A.08.140 and 2003 c 111 s 212 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 The registration files of all precincts shall be closed against
7 original registration or transfers for thirty days immediately
8 preceding every primary, special election, and general election to be
9 held in such precincts.

10 The county auditor shall give notice of the closing of the precinct
11 files for original registration and transfer ~~((and notice of the~~
12 ~~special registration and voting procedure provided by RCW 29A.08.145))~~
13 by one publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the county
14 at least five days before the closing of the precinct files.

15 No person may vote at any primary, special election, or general
16 election in a precinct polling place unless he or she has registered to
17 vote at least thirty days before that primary or election. ~~((If a~~
18 ~~person, otherwise qualified to vote in the state, county, and precinct~~
19 ~~in which he or she applies for registration, does not register at least~~
20 ~~thirty days before any primary, special election, or general election,~~
21 ~~he or she may register and vote by absentee ballot for that primary or~~
22 ~~election under RCW 29A.08.145.))~~

23 **Sec. 14.** RCW 29A.08.140 and 2004 c 267 s 112 are each amended to
24 read as follows:

25 The registration files of all precincts shall be closed against
26 original registration or transfers for thirty days immediately
27 preceding every primary, special election, and general election to be
28 held in such precincts.

29 The county auditor shall give notice of the closing of the precinct
30 files for original registration and transfer ~~((and notice of the~~
31 ~~special registration and voting procedure provided by RCW 29A.08.145))~~
32 by one publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the county
33 at least five days before the closing of the precinct files.

34 No person may vote at any primary, special election, or general
35 election in a precinct polling place unless he or she has registered to
36 vote at least thirty days before that primary or election and appears

1 on the official statewide voter registration list. (~~If a person,~~
2 ~~otherwise qualified to vote in the state, county, and precinct in which~~
3 ~~he or she applies for registration, does not register at least thirty~~
4 ~~days before any primary, special election, or general election, he or~~
5 ~~she may register and vote by absentee ballot for that primary or~~
6 ~~election under RCW 29A.08.145.))~~

7 **Sec. 15.** RCW 29A.08.145 and 2004 c 267 s 113 are each amended to
8 read as follows:

9 This section establishes a special procedure which an elector may
10 use to register to vote or transfer a voter registration by changing
11 his or her address during the period beginning after the closing of
12 registration for voting at the polls under RCW 29A.08.140 and ending on
13 the fifteenth day before a primary, special election, or general
14 election. A qualified elector in the state may register to vote or
15 change his or her registration address in person in the office of the
16 county auditor of the county in which the applicant resides, or at a
17 voter registration location specifically designated for this purpose by
18 the (~~county auditor of the county in which the applicant resides~~)
19 secretary of state, and apply for an absentee ballot for that primary
20 or election. The auditor or registration assistant shall register that
21 individual in the manner provided in this chapter. The application for
22 an absentee ballot executed by the newly registered or transferred
23 voter for the primary or election that follows the execution of the
24 registration shall be promptly transmitted to the auditor with the
25 completed voter registration form.

26 **Sec. 16.** RCW 29A.08.210 and 2003 c 111 s 216 are each amended to
27 read as follows:

28 (1) An applicant for voter registration shall complete an
29 application providing the following information concerning his or her
30 qualifications as a voter in this state:

- 31 ~~((1))~~ (a) Proof that the applicant is a United States citizen;
32 (b) The address of the last former registration of the applicant as
33 a voter in the state;
34 ~~((2))~~ (c) The applicant's full name;
35 ~~((3))~~ (d) The applicant's date of birth;

1 ~~((4))~~ (e) The address of the applicant's residence for voting
2 purposes;

3 ~~((5))~~ (f) The mailing address of the applicant if that address is
4 not the same as the address in (e) of this subsection ~~((4) of this~~
5 ~~section))~~;

6 ~~((6))~~ (g) The sex of the applicant;

7 ~~((7) A declaration that the applicant is a citizen of the United~~
8 ~~States;~~

9 ~~((8))~~ (h) The applicant's Washington state driver's license number,
10 Washington state identification card number, or the last four digits of
11 the applicant's Social Security number;

12 (i) The applicant's signature; and

13 ~~((9))~~ (j) Any other information that the secretary of state
14 determines is necessary to establish the identity of the applicant and
15 prevent duplicate or fraudulent voter registrations.

16 This information shall be recorded on a single registration form to
17 be prescribed by the secretary of state.

18 If the applicant fails to provide the information required for
19 voter registration, the auditor shall send the applicant a verification
20 notice. The auditor shall not register the applicant until the
21 required information is provided. If a verification notice is returned
22 as undeliverable or the applicant fails to respond to the notice within
23 forty-five days, the auditor shall not register the applicant to vote.

24 (2) The applicant shall sign and attest to the following
25 declaration:

26 "I declare that the facts on this voter registration form are true.
27 I am a citizen of the United States, I am not presently denied my civil
28 rights as a result of being convicted of a felony, I will have lived in
29 Washington at this address for thirty days before the next election at
30 which I vote, and I will be at least eighteen years old when I vote."

31 (3) The following warning shall appear in a conspicuous place on
32 the voter registration form:

33 "If you knowingly provide false information on this voter
34 registration form or knowingly make a false declaration about your
35 qualifications for voter registration you will have committed a class
36 C felony that is punishable by imprisonment for up to five years, or by
37 a fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both imprisonment and fine."

1 **Sec. 17.** RCW 29A.08.220 and 2004 c 267 s 115 are each amended to
2 read as follows:

3 (1) The secretary of state shall specify by rule the format of all
4 voter registration applications. These applications shall be
5 compatible with existing voter registration records. An applicant for
6 voter registration shall be required to complete only one application
7 and to provide the required information other than his or her signature
8 no more than one time. If an applicant transfers his or her voter
9 registration within a county or between counties of this state, he or
10 she is not required to provide proof of citizenship. These
11 applications shall also contain information for the voter to transfer
12 his or her registration.

13 Any application format specified by the secretary for use in
14 registering to vote in state and local elections shall satisfy the
15 requirements of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-
16 31) and the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (P.L. 107-252) for
17 registering to vote in federal elections.

18 (2) All registration applications required under RCW 29A.08.210 and
19 29A.08.340 shall be produced and furnished by the secretary of state to
20 the county auditors and the department of licensing.

21 **Sec. 18.** RCW 29A.08.250 and 2004 c 267 s 117 are each amended to
22 read as follows:

23 The secretary of state shall furnish registration forms necessary
24 to carry out the registration of voters as provided by this chapter
25 without cost to the respective counties. All voter registration forms
26 must include clear and conspicuous language, designed to draw an
27 applicant's attention, stating that the applicant must ~~((be))~~ provide
28 proof that the applicant is a United States citizen in order to
29 register to vote. Voter registration application forms must also
30 contain a space for the applicant to provide his or her driver's
31 license number or the last four digits of his or her social security
32 number as well as check boxes intended to allow the voter to indicate
33 age and United States citizenship ~~((eligibility))~~ under the Help
34 America Vote Act of 2002 (P.L. 107-252).

35 **Sec. 19.** RCW 29A.08.520 and 2003 c 111 s 233 are each amended to
36 read as follows:

1 (1) Upon receiving official notice of a person's conviction of a
2 felony in either state or federal court, if the convicted person is a
3 registered voter in the county, the county auditor shall cancel the
4 defendant's voter registration. Additionally, the secretary of state
5 in conjunction with the department of corrections and the Washington
6 state patrol shall arrange for a monthly comparison of any lists of
7 known felons maintained by the department of corrections and the
8 Washington state patrol with the statewide voter registration list. If
9 a person is found on the department of corrections felon list or the
10 Washington state patrol felon list and the statewide voter registration
11 list, the secretary of state or county auditor shall confirm the match
12 through a date of birth comparison and immediately cancel the voter
13 registration from the official state voter registration list. The
14 canceling authority shall send notice of the proposed cancellation to
15 the person at his or her last known voter registration address.

16 (2) Felons who have been granted a certificate of discharge by a
17 court shall provide a certified copy of the certificate of discharge to
18 the department of corrections and the Washington state patrol within
19 thirty days from the day the court grants the certificate, and shall
20 provide a certified copy of their certificate of discharge to the
21 elections officer at the time they register to vote.

22 **Sec. 20.** RCW 29A.08.520 and 2004 c 267 s 126 are each amended to
23 read as follows:

24 (1) Upon receiving official notice of a person's conviction of a
25 felony in either state or federal court, if the convicted person is a
26 registered voter in the county, the county auditor shall cancel the
27 defendant's voter registration. Additionally, the secretary of state
28 in conjunction with the department of corrections and the Washington
29 state patrol shall arrange for a ((periodic)) monthly comparison of
30 ((a)) any lists of known felons maintained by the department of
31 corrections and the Washington state patrol with the statewide voter
32 registration list. If a person is found on the department of
33 corrections felon list or the Washington state patrol felon list and
34 the statewide voter registration list, the secretary of state or county
35 auditor shall confirm the match through a date of birth comparison and
36 immediately cancel the voter registration from the official state voter

1 registration list. The canceling authority shall send notice of the
2 proposed cancellation to the person at his or her last known voter
3 registration address.

4 (2) Felons who have been granted a certificate of discharge by a
5 court shall provide a certified copy of the certificate of discharge to
6 the department of corrections and the Washington state patrol within
7 thirty days from the day the court grants the certificate, and shall
8 provide a certified copy of their certificate of discharge to the
9 elections officer at the time they register to vote.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 21.** A new section is added to chapter 29A.08
11 RCW to read as follows:

12 A person may prove that he or she is a United States citizen with
13 an original or copy of any one of the following:

- 14 (1) A United States passport;
- 15 (2) A certified birth certificate issued by the city, county, or
16 state. A certified birth certificate has a registrar's raised,
17 embossed, impressed, or multicolored seal, registrar's signature, and
18 the date the certificate was filed with the registrar's office, which
19 must be within one year of birth;
- 20 (3) A consular report of birth abroad or certification of birth;
- 21 (4) A naturalization certificate; or
- 22 (5) A certificate of citizenship.

23 **Sec. 22.** RCW 29A.08.651 and 2004 c 267 s 101 are each amended to
24 read as follows:

25 (1) The office of the secretary of state shall create and maintain
26 a statewide voter registration data base. This data base must be a
27 single, uniform, official, centralized, interactive computerized
28 statewide voter registration list defined, maintained, and administered
29 at the state level that contains the name and registration information
30 of every legally registered voter in the state and assigns a unique
31 identifier to each legally registered voter in the state.

32 (2) The computerized list must serve as the single system for
33 storing and maintaining the official list of registered voters
34 throughout the state.

35 (3) The computerized list must contain the name and registration
36 information of every legally registered voter in the state.

1 (4) Under the computerized list, a unique identifier is assigned to
2 each legally registered voter in the state.

3 (5) The computerized list must be coordinated with other agency
4 data bases within the state, including but not limited to the
5 department of corrections, the department of licensing, (~~and~~) the
6 department of health, the Washington state patrol, and the office of
7 the administrator for the courts.

8 (6) Any election officer in the state, including any local election
9 officer, may obtain immediate electronic access to the information
10 contained in the computerized list.

11 (7) All voter registration information obtained by any local
12 election officer in the state must be electronically entered into the
13 computerized list on an expedited basis at the time the information is
14 provided to the local officer.

15 (8) The chief state election officer shall provide support, as may
16 be required, so that local election officers are able to enter
17 information as described in subsection (3) of this section.

18 (9) The computerized list serves as the official voter registration
19 list for the conduct of all elections.

20 (10) The secretary of state has data authority on all voter
21 registration data.

22 (11) The voter registration data base must be designed to
23 accomplish at a minimum, the following:

24 (a) Comply with the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (P.L. 107-252);

25 (b) Identify duplicate voter registrations;

26 (c) Identify suspected duplicate voters;

27 (d) Screen against the department of corrections, the Washington
28 state patrol, and other appropriate state agency data bases to aid in
29 the cancellation of voter registration of felons;

30 (e) Provide up-to-date signatures of voters for the purposes of
31 initiative signature checking;

32 (f) Provide for a comparison between the voter registration data
33 base and the department of licensing change of address data base;

34 (g) Provide online access for county auditors with the goal of real
