- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.215.100 and 1994 c 166 s 1 are each amended to 7 read as follows:
 - (1) It is the intent of the legislature to establish an early childhood state education and assistance program. This special assistance program is a voluntary enrichment program to help prepare some children to enter the common school system and shall be offered only as funds are available. This program is not a part of the basic program of education which must be fully funded by the legislature under Article IX, section 1 of the state Constitution.
- 15 (2) The early childhood education and assistance program is a
 16 comprehensive preschool program designed to aid at-risk children, and
 17 to enhance readiness for success in school and life. The needs of the
 18 children and their families will be best served if it is consolidated
 19 with other early childhood services. Administering similar programs

- 1 from the same agency will have the benefit of improving connections
- 2 <u>with social supports, better connection between the child care programs</u>
- 3 and the preschool program for both the families and the providers, and
- 4 greater administrative efficiencies.

- 5 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.215.110 and 1999 c 350 s 1 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in 8 this section apply throughout RCW 28A.215.100 through 28A.215.200 and 9 28A.215.900 through 28A.215.908.
- 10 (1) (("Advisory committee" means the advisory committee under RCW 11 28A.215.140.
- 12 (2))) "Department" means the department of ((community, trade, and economic development)) social and health services.
 - (((3))) (2) "Eligible child" means a child not eligible for kindergarten whose family income is at or below one hundred ten percent of the federal poverty level, as published annually by the federal department of health and human services, and includes a child whose family is eligible for public assistance, and who is not a participant in a federal or state program providing comprehensive services and may include children who are eligible under rules adopted by the department if the number of such children equals not more than ten percent of the total enrollment in the early childhood program. Priority for enrollment shall be given to children from families with the lowest income or to eligible children from families with multiple needs.
 - ((\(\frac{(4)}{1}\))) (\(\frac{3}{2}\) "Approved programs" means those state-supported education and special assistance programs which are recognized by the department ((\(\frac{\text{of community}}{2800}\), trade, and economic development)) as meeting the minimum program rules adopted by the department to qualify under RCW 28A.215.100 through 28A.215.200 and 28A.215.900 through 28A.215.908 and are designated as eligible for funding by the department under RCW 28A.215.160 and 28A.215.180.
- $((\frac{5}{}))$ $\underline{(4)}$ "Comprehensive" means an assistance program that focuses on the needs of the child and includes education, health, and family support services.
- $((\frac{(6)}{(6)}))$ (5) "Family support services" means providing opportunities for parents to:

- 1 (b) Increase their knowledge of child development and parenting 2 skills;
 - (c) Further their education and training;
 - (d) Increase their ability to use needed services in the community;

- 6 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.215.120 and 1994 c 166 s 4 are each amended to 7 read as follows:
- 8 The department ((of community, trade, and economic development)) shall administer a state-supported early childhood education and 9 assistance program to assist eligible children with educational, 10 social, health, nutritional, and cultural development to enhance their 11 opportunity for success in the common school system. Eligible children 12 shall be admitted to approved early childhood programs to the extent 13 that the legislature provides funds, and additional eligible children 14 15 may be admitted to the extent that grants and contributions from 16 community sources provide sufficient funds for a program equivalent to that supported by state funds. Administration and funding of this 17 program shall be shifted to the department no later than December 1, 18 2005. All existing contracts with program providers entered into for 19 20 the 2005-06 school year with the department of community, trade, and 21 economic development shall remain in full force and effect and shall be the responsibility of the department. All funds designated for this 22 23 program remaining at the department of community, trade, and economic development after December 1, 2005, shall be transferred to the 24 25 <u>department</u>.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 28A.215 27 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) A nine-member steering committee is created, which committee shall advise the department on the ongoing promotion and operation of the early childhood education and assistance program. This advice shall include:
- 32 (a) Program standards, which shall be guided by appropriate 33 research;
- 34 (b) Development of partnerships among providers of early learning 35 programs;
- 36 (c) Development of opportunities for professional development; and

1 (d) Identifying opportunities to build upon existing programs and 2 resources by increasing program quality, connecting related services, 3 and simplifying program administration.

- (2) The steering committee authorized in subsection (1) of this section shall be composed of and appointed in accordance with this subsection.
- (a) The secretary of the department shall appoint two agency employees responsible for policies relating to early learning and assistance to children, one representative of an early childhood education and assistance program provider or contractor and one parent with a child participating in the program. The secretary shall also designate the chair of the steering committee.
- (b) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint two representatives of that office who are knowledgeable about early learning and assistance to children and one representative of an early childhood education and assistance program provider or contractor.
- (c) The director of the department of community, trade, and economic development shall appoint one representative.
- (d) The secretary of the department of health shall appoint one member who is knowledgeable about early learning and pediatric public health issues.
- (3) Except for state official and state employee members, each member of the board shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in carrying out the duties of the board in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- **Sec. 5.** RCW 28A.215.150 and 1994 c 166 s 6 are each amended to 27 read as follows:

The department shall adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW for the administration of the early childhood program. Approved early childhood programs shall conduct needs assessments of their service area, identify any targeted groups of children, to include but not be limited to children of seasonal and migrant farmworkers and native American populations living either on or off reservation, and provide to the department a service delivery plan, to the extent practicable, that addresses these targeted populations.

The department in developing rules for the early childhood program shall consult with the ((advisory)) steering committee, and shall

- 1 consider such factors as coordination with existing head start and
- 2 other early childhood programs, the preparation necessary for
- 3 instructors, qualifications of instructors, adequate space and
- 4 equipment, and special transportation needs. The rules shall
- 5 specifically require the early childhood programs to provide for
- 6 parental involvement in participation with their child's program, in
- 7 local program policy decisions, in development and revision of service
- 8 delivery systems, and in parent education and training.
