- 8 (1)There is hereby created, in the state treasury, institutional impact account. The secretary of social and health 9 10 services may reimburse political subdivisions for criminal justice costs incurred directly as a result of crimes committed by offenders 11 residing in an institution as defined herein under the jurisdiction of 12 13 the secretary of social and health services or crimes committed by the staff of such an institution. Such reimbursement shall be made to the 14 15 extent funds are available from the institutional impact account. 16 Reimbursements shall be limited to law enforcement, prosecutorial, judicial, and jail facilities costs which are documented to be strictly 17 related to the criminal activities of the offender or staff. The 18 maximum allowable reimbursement rate for law enforcement costs in a 19

given criminal investigation must reflect, at a minimum, the actual hourly wage rate, including fringe benefits, paid to the law enforcement personnel investigating the crime.

(2) The secretary of corrections may reimburse political subdivisions for criminal justice costs incurred directly as a result of crimes committed by offenders residing in an institution as defined herein under the jurisdiction of the secretary of corrections. Such reimbursement shall be made to the extent funds are available from the institutional impact account. Reimbursements shall be limited to law enforcement, prosecutorial, judicial, and jail facilities costs which are documented to be strictly related to the criminal activities of the offender.
