- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.32.121 and 2004 c 271 s 168 are each amended to read as follows:
  - (1) The maximum number of words for statements submitted by candidates is as follows: State representative, one hundred words; state senator, judge of the superior court, judge of the court of appeals, justice of the supreme court, and all state offices voted upon throughout the state, except that of governor, two hundred words; president and vice president, United States senator, United States representative, and governor, three hundred words. Candidates' statements that appear on the web site of the secretary of state or on the web sites of county auditors may contain up to one thousand words.
- 15 (2) Arguments written by committees under RCW 29A.32.060 may not exceed two hundred fifty words in length.
- 17 (3) Rebuttal arguments written by committees may not exceed 18 seventy-five words in length.
