ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1799

1 AN ACT Relating to park rangers employed by the state parks and 2 recreation commission; creating new sections; and providing an 3 expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that law enforcement б functions at state parks and lands are insufficient to adequately 7 protect the public and our natural resources. Threats to the safety of 8 the visiting public and public lands are not necessarily confined to 9 the boundaries of state parks and lands. State law does not expressly 10 grant or deny park rangers the authority to engage in law enforcement activities outside of park and land boundaries. 11 Further, the legislature finds that, in many areas of the state, other state or 12 local law enforcement officers are either too far away or understaffed 13 to provide adequate support to on-site law enforcement professionals in 14 15 emergency situations. The legislature finds that a comprehensive 16 of the role responsibilities of law enforcement review and professionals within and around state parks and lands is necessary to 17 ensure the value of state parks and natural resources is not 18 diminished. 19

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. (1) The task force on state public
 recreational lands and public safety is created. The task force shall
 be comprised of eleven members appointed as follows:

4 (a) Two members of the house of representatives, one from each 5 major caucus, to be appointed by the speaker of the house of 6 representatives;

7 (b) Two members of the senate, one from each major caucus, to be 8 appointed by the president of the senate;

9 (c) The commissioner of public lands or his or her designee;

10 (d) The chair of the Washington state parks and recreation 11 commission or his or her designee;

(e) The chair of the Washington fish and wildlife commission or hisor her designee;

14 (f) Four members, to be appointed jointly by the speaker of the 15 house of representatives and the president of the senate, from 16 nominations submitted by the following organizations:

17 (i) One representative of the Washington association of sheriffs18 and police chiefs;

19 (ii) One representative of the Washington state council of police 20 and sheriffs;

(iii) One representative park ranger who is an active member of the recognized employee bargaining unit and who is employed by the Washington state parks and recreation commission; and

(iv) One recognized employee representative of enforcement officerswith the department of natural resources.

(2) The task force members shall elect a chair and determine its
operating procedures. The task force shall be jointly staffed by the
office of program research and senate committee services as determined
by their respective staff directors.

30 (a) Legislative members of the task force shall be reimbursed for 31 travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative 32 members, except those representing an employer or organization, are 33 entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 34 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

35 (b) The compensable travel expenses as provided in (a) of this 36 subsection shall be paid jointly by the senate and the house of 37 representatives.

38 (3) This section expires January 1, 2006.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. The task force shall conduct a comprehensive
 review of law enforcement issues in and around state parks and lands,
 including but not limited to:

4 (1) The extent to which illegal activity in and around state parks 5 and lands threatens public safety and natural resources; and

6 (2) The ability of the current state and local law enforcement to 7 respond to illegal activity on or near public recreational lands.

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** By December 15, 2005, the task force shall 9 provide a final report of its recommendations, including any draft 10 legislation to implement the recommendations. The report shall be 11 submitted to the chief clerk of the house of representatives and the 12 secretary of the senate.
