- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that protecting the 5 public's health is essential and that the threat of potential pandemics is ongoing and growing. The legislature also finds that the public 6 7 health system as defined in RCW 43.70.575 is essential to fulfilling 8 the state's responsibility to protect the health and safety of its 9 The legislature further finds that local public health citizens. departments lack adequate resources even as their duties increase. 10 Rather than risk catastrophic loss of life, the legislature further 11 12 finds that local public health departments must immediately be given 13 the resources to effectively implement the specific public health 14 improvement standards concerning threats to our drinking water and food 15 supplies, communicable disease, and other first-responder duties unique to local public health departments, pursuant to the requirements in RCW 16

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The sum of ten million dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, from the general fund to the department of health for state funding the local public health standards adopted in the public health services improvement plan pursuant to RCW 43.70.520(8). The funds will support local public health departments' obligations concerning health data and information that individuals and communities can use; chronic and infectious disease surveillance; rapid response to outbreaks of communicable disease; efforts to prevent and control specific communicable diseases, such as tuberculosis, West Nile virus, acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and influenza; and local public health district programs to ensure the safety of drinking water and food supplies.
