1 AN ACT Relating to establishing the future of Washington forests 2 review council; creating new sections; and making appropriations.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

The future of Washington forests review NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 4 5 council is established. The purpose of the council is to: (1) Gather data necessary to understanding the economic, recreational, and 6 7 environmental contributions of the forest products industry and 8 secondary manufacturing sectors in Washington state and the trends that will influence the industry in the 9 future; and (2) develop 10 recommendations for policy changes that will contribute to maintaining the economic stability and growth of the forest products industry in 11 12 Washington state.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The future of Washington forests review 14 council is composed of the following members: The governor, the 15 lieutenant governor, and the commissioner of public lands.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. The future of Washington forests review

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council is directed and authorized, subject to funding in the omnibus
 appropriations act, to commission the following studies:

(1) An update of the 1992 timber supply study for Washington state 3 that was done by the University of Washington. The update must be 4 5 conducted using the same fundamental processes, methodology, and assumptions as the 1992 study, and using the same data gathering 6 7 methodology as the original study. The department of natural resources is directed to fully cooperate with the update process and provide the 8 9 data from the recently completed sustained yield calculation process. 10 The council is directed to assemble a team of public and private forest inventory and analysis specialists to develop the specific work plan 11 12 for the timber supply update and work with the vendor to ensure that 13 the data and analysis are collected in the appropriate fashion.

14 (2) An independent assessment of the economic contribution of the 15 forest products industry, and secondary manufacturing sectors, to the 16 state of Washington. This assessment will also examine some of the 17 macroeconomic trends likely to affect the industry in the future.

(3) A comparison of the competitive position of Washington's forest 18 products industry with other leading forest products states, or 19 regions, of the United States. This evaluation should compare the 20 21 relative tax burden for growing and harvesting timber between the 22 states or regions, the relative cost of adhering to regulations, and identify the competitive advantages of each state or region. 23 The 24 council is directed to assemble a team of public and private sector 25 experts and economists to fully develop the work plan and work with the vendor to ensure the data and analysis are of high quality. 26

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. The future of Washington forests review 27 council may form one or more technical advisory committees to assist 28 the council in assembling and understanding recently completed studies 29 or analysis that will assist the council in accomplishing its task. 30 31 Examples include, but are not limited to, the legislative task force on forest health, the joint legislative audit and review committee study 32 33 fire fighting costs, the forest practices board's on forest environmental impact statement for changes in forest practices under 34 forest and fish, the board of natural resources' environmental impact 35 36 statement for the department of natural resources' sustained yield 37 level, and the recently completed economic analysis of the Oregon

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1 forest sector contributions and potential by the Oregon forest 2 resources institute. The council may also form a technical advisory 3 committee to provide input on issues that arise during the course of 4 their review.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. The future of Washington forests review 5 6 council shall review all of the information gathered in sections 2 7 through 4 of this act. The council will summarize the current and potential roles of nonfederal forests, and their contributions to 8 9 Washington state's economy, quality of life, recreation, environmental quality, and rural vitality over the next fifty years. Based on this 10 11 review, the council shall develop recommendations on: (1) Policy 12 changes that would enhance the competitive position of Washington's forest products industry in Washington state; (2) policy changes that 13 would, to the extent possible, ensure that a productive forest land 14 15 base continues to be managed for forest products, recreation, and 16 environmental and other public benefits into the future; and (3) policy 17 changes that would enhance the recreational opportunities on working forest lands in Washington state. 18

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. The future of Washington forests review 20 council must be staffed by the governor's office, the office of 21 financial management, and the department of natural resources.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. (1) The sum of one hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, from the general fund to the governor's office for the purposes of this act.

(2) The sum of one hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof as
may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30,
2007, from the general fund to the governor's office for the purposes
of this act.

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
