- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.04.321 and 2004 c 271 s 106 are each amended to read as follows:
  - (1) All state, county, city, town, and district general elections for the election of federal, state, legislative, judicial, county, city, town, and district officers, and for the submission to the voters of the state, county, city, town, or district of any measure for their adoption and approval or rejection, shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November, in the year in which they may be called. A statewide general election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November of each year. However, the statewide general election held in odd-numbered years shall be limited to (a) city, town, and district general elections as provided for in RCW 29A.04.330, or as otherwise provided by law; (b) the election of federal officers for the remainder of any unexpired terms in the membership of either branch of the Congress of the United States; (c)

the election of state and county officers for the remainder of any

- unexpired terms of offices created by or whose duties are described in 1 2 Article II, section 15, Article III, sections 16, 17, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23, and Article IV, sections 3 and 5 of the state Constitution and 3 RCW 2.06.080; (d) the election of county officers in any county 4 5 governed by a charter containing provisions calling for general county elections at this time; and (e) the approval or rejection of state 6 7 measures, including proposed constitutional amendments, pertaining to any proposed constitutional convention, initiative 8 9 measures and referendum measures proposed by the electorate, referendum 10 bills, and any other matter provided by the legislature for submission to the electorate. 11
  - (2) A county legislative authority may, if it deems an emergency to exist, call a special county election by presenting a resolution to the county auditor at least forty-five days prior to the proposed election date. Bond and levy votes are not emergencies that qualify to be held on a special election date except as provided for in subsection (3) of this section. Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, a special election called by the county legislative authority shall be held on one of the following dates as decided by such governing body:
  - (a) The first Tuesday after the first Monday in February;
    - (b) ((The second Tuesday in March;
    - (c) The fourth Tuesday in April;

  - $((\frac{f}{f}))$  (d) The first Tuesday after the first Monday in November.
  - (3) In addition to the dates set forth in subsection (2)(a) through  $((\frac{f}{f}))$  (d) of this section, a special election to validate an excess levy or bond issue may be called at any time to meet the needs resulting from fire, flood, earthquake, or other act of God. Such county special election shall be noticed and conducted in the manner provided by law.
- 33 (4) In a presidential election year, if a presidential preference 34 primary is conducted in February((, March, April,)) or May under 35 chapter 29A.56 RCW, the date on which a special election may be called 36 by the county legislative authority under subsection (2) of this 37 section during the month of that primary is the date of the 38 presidential primary.

- (5) This section shall supersede the provisions of any and all 1 2 other statutes, whether general or special in nature, having different dates for such city, town, and district elections, the purpose of this 3 section being to establish mandatory dates for holding elections except 4 5 for those elections held pursuant to a home-rule charter adopted under Article XI, section 4 of the state Constitution. This section shall 6 7 not be construed as fixing the time for holding primary elections, or elections for the recall of any elective public officer. 8
- 9 **Sec. 2.** RCW 29A.04.330 and 2004 c 266 s 6 are each amended to read 10 as follows:
- 11 (1) All city, town, and district general elections shall be held 12 throughout the state of Washington on the first Tuesday following the 13 first Monday in November in the odd-numbered years.

- (a) Elections for the recall of any elective public officer;
- (b) Public utility districts, conservation districts, or district elections at which the ownership of property within those districts is a prerequisite to voting, all of which elections shall be held at the times prescribed in the laws specifically applicable thereto;
- (c) Consolidation proposals as provided for in RCW 28A.315.235 and nonhigh capital fund aid proposals as provided for in chapter 28A.540
- (2) The county auditor, as ex officio supervisor of elections, upon request in the form of a resolution of the governing body of a city, town, or district, presented to the auditor at least forty-five days prior to the proposed election date, may, if the county auditor deems an emergency to exist, call a special election in such city, town, or district, and for the purpose of such special election he or she may combine, unite, or divide precincts. Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, such a special election shall be held on one of the following dates as decided by the governing body:
  - (a) The first Tuesday after the first Monday in February;
  - (b) ((The second Tuesday in March;

- (3) In a presidential election year, if a presidential preference primary is conducted in February((, March, April,)) or May under chapter 29A.56 RCW, the date on which a special election may be called under subsection (2) of this section during the month of that primary is the date of the presidential primary.
- (4) In addition to subsection (2)(a) through  $((\frac{f}{f}))$  (d) of this section, a special election to validate an excess levy or bond issue may be called at any time to meet the needs resulting from fire, flood, earthquake, or other act of God, except that no special election may be held between the first day for candidates to file for public office and the last day to certify the returns of the general election other than as provided in subsection  $(2)((\frac{f}{f}))$  (c) and  $(\frac{f}{f})$  (d) of this section. Such special election shall be conducted and notice thereof given in the manner provided by law.
- (5) This section shall supersede the provisions of any and all other statutes, whether general or special in nature, having different dates for such city, town, and district elections, the purpose of this section being to establish mandatory dates for holding elections.
