HOUSE BILL 2766

State of Washington 59th Legislature 2006 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to wildlife; and amending RCW 77.08.010.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

3 Sec. 1. RCW 77.08.010 and 2005 c 104 s 1 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

5 As used in this title or rules adopted under this title, unless the 6 context clearly requires otherwise:

(1) "Director" means the director of fish and wildlife.

8 (2) "Department" means the department of fish and wildlife.

9 (3) "Commission" means the state fish and wildlife commission.

10 (4) "Person" means and includes an individual; a corporation; a 11 public or private entity or organization; a local, state, or federal 12 agency; all business organizations, including corporations and 13 partnerships; or a group of two or more individuals acting with a 14 common purpose whether acting in an individual, representative, or 15 official capacity.

16 (5) "Fish and wildlife officer" means a person appointed and 17 commissioned by the director, with authority to enforce this title and 18 rules adopted pursuant to this title, and other statutes as prescribed by the legislature. Fish and wildlife officer includes a person
 commissioned before June 11, 1998, as a wildlife agent or a fisheries
 patrol officer.

(6) "Ex officio fish and wildlife officer" means a commissioned 4 5 officer of a municipal, county, state, or federal agency having as its primary function the enforcement of criminal laws in general, while the 6 7 officer is in the appropriate jurisdiction. The term "ex officio fish and wildlife officer" includes special agents of the national marine 8 fisheries service, state parks commissioned officers, United States 9 fish and wildlife special agents, department of natural resources 10 enforcement officers, and United States forest service officers, while 11 the agents and officers are within their respective jurisdictions. 12

(7) "To hunt" and its derivatives means an effort to kill, injure,capture, or harass a wild animal or wild bird.

(8) "To trap" and its derivatives means a method of hunting usingdevices to capture wild animals or wild birds.

(9) "To fish," "to harvest," and "to take," and their derivatives
means an effort to kill, injure, harass, or catch a fish or shellfish.

(10) "Open season" means those times, manners of taking, and places 19 20 or waters established by rule of the commission for the lawful hunting, fishing, taking, or possession of game animals, game birds, game fish, 21 22 food fish, or shellfish that conform to the special restrictions or 23 physical descriptions established by rule of the commission or that 24 have otherwise been deemed legal to hunt, fish, take, harvest, or 25 possess by rule of the commission. "Open season" includes the first and last days of the established time. 26

27 (11) "Closed season" means all times, manners of taking, and places or waters other than those established by rule of the commission as an 28 open season. "Closed season" also means all hunting, fishing, taking, 29 or possession of game animals, game birds, game fish, food fish, or 30 31 shellfish that do not conform to the special restrictions or physical 32 descriptions established by rule of the commission as an open season or that have not otherwise been deemed legal to hunt, fish, take, harvest, 33 or possess by rule of the commission as an open season. 34

35 (12) "Closed area" means a place where the hunting of some or all 36 species of wild animals or wild birds is prohibited.

37 (13) "Closed waters" means all or part of a lake, river, stream, or38 other body of water, where fishing or harvesting is prohibited.

(14) "Game reserve" means a closed area where hunting for all wild
 animals and wild birds is prohibited.

3 (15) "Bag limit" means the maximum number of game animals, game 4 birds, or game fish which may be taken, caught, killed, or possessed by 5 a person, as specified by rule of the commission for a particular 6 period of time, or as to size, sex, or species.

7 (16) "Wildlife" means all species of the animal kingdom whose members exist in Washington in a wild state. This includes but is not 8 9 limited to mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, fish, and The term "wildlife" does not include feral domestic 10 invertebrates. mammals, old world rats and mice of the family Muridae of the order 11 12 Rodentia, meat from game farms that has been inspected by the United 13 States department of agriculture, or those fish, shellfish, and marine 14 invertebrates classified as food fish or shellfish by the director. The term "wildlife" includes all stages of development and the bodily 15 16 parts of wildlife members.

17 (17) "Wild animals" means those species of the class Mammalia whose 18 members exist in Washington in a wild state and the species Rana 19 catesbeiana (bullfrog). The term "wild animal" does not include feral 20 domestic mammals ((or)), old world rats and mice of the family Muridae 21 of the order Rodentia, or meat from game farms that has been inspected 22 by the United States department of agriculture.

(18) "Wild birds" means those species of the class Aves whosemembers exist in Washington in a wild state.

(19) "Protected wildlife" means wildlife designated by thecommission that shall not be hunted or fished.

(20) "Endangered species" means wildlife designated by thecommission as seriously threatened with extinction.

29 (21) "Game animals" means wild animals that shall not be hunted 30 except as authorized by the commission.

31 (22) "Fur-bearing animals" means game animals that shall not be 32 trapped except as authorized by the commission.

33 (23) "Game birds" means wild birds that shall not be hunted except 34 as authorized by the commission.

35 (24) "Predatory birds" means wild birds that may be hunted 36 throughout the year as authorized by the commission.

37 (25) "Deleterious exotic wildlife" means species of the animal

kingdom not native to Washington and designated as dangerous to the
 environment or wildlife of the state.

3 (26) "Game farm" means property on which wildlife is held or raised
4 for commercial purposes, trade, or gift. The term "game farm" does not
5 include publicly owned facilities.

6 (27) "Person of disability" means a permanently disabled person who 7 is not ambulatory without the assistance of a wheelchair, crutches, or 8 similar devices.

9 (28) "Fish" includes all species classified as game fish or food 10 fish by statute or rule, as well as all fin fish not currently 11 classified as food fish or game fish if such species exist in state 12 waters. The term "fish" includes all stages of development and the 13 bodily parts of fish species.

14 (29) "Raffle" means an activity in which tickets bearing an 15 individual number are sold for not more than twenty-five dollars each 16 and in which a permit or permits are awarded to hunt or for access to 17 hunt big game animals or wild turkeys on the basis of a drawing from 18 the tickets by the person or persons conducting the raffle.

(30) "Youth" means a person fifteen years old for fishing and undersixteen years old for hunting.

(31) "Senior" means a person seventy years old or older.

(32) "License year" means the period of time for which a recreational license is valid. The license year begins April 1st, and ends March 31st.

25 (33) "Saltwater" means those marine waters seaward of river mouths.

26 (34) "Freshwater" means all waters not defined as saltwater
27 including, but not limited to, rivers upstream of the river mouth,
28 lakes, ponds, and reservoirs.

(35) "State waters" means all marine waters and fresh waters within ordinary high water lines and within the territorial boundaries of the state.

(36) "Offshore waters" means marine waters of the Pacific Ocean
 outside the territorial boundaries of the state, including the marine
 waters of other states and countries.

35 (37) "Concurrent waters of the Columbia river" means those waters 36 of the Columbia river that coincide with the Washington-Oregon state 37 boundary.

38 (38) "Resident" means:

1 (a) A person who has maintained a permanent place of abode within 2 the state for at least ninety days immediately preceding an application 3 for a license, has established by formal evidence an intent to continue 4 residing within the state, and who is not licensed to hunt or fish as 5 a resident in another state; and

6 (b) A person age eighteen or younger who does not qualify as a 7 resident under (a) of this subsection, but who has a parent that 8 qualifies as a resident under (a) of this subsection.

9 (39) "Nonresident" means a person who has not fulfilled the 10 qualifications of a resident.

(40) "Shellfish" means those species of marine and freshwater invertebrates that have been classified and that shall not be taken except as authorized by rule of the commission. The term "shellfish" includes all stages of development and the bodily parts of shellfish species.

16 (41) "Commercial" means related to or connected with buying, 17 selling, or bartering.

18 (42) "To process" and its derivatives mean preparing or preserving 19 fish, wildlife, or shellfish.

(43) "Personal use" means for the private use of the individualtaking the fish or shellfish and not for sale or barter.

(44) "Angling gear" means a line attached to a rod and reel capable of being held in hand while landing the fish or a hand-held line operated without rod or reel.

(45) "Fishery" means the taking of one or more particular species
 of fish or shellfish with particular gear in a particular geographical
 area.

(46) "Limited-entry license" means a license subject to a license
limitation program established in chapter 77.70 RCW.

30 (47) "Seaweed" means marine aquatic plant species that are 31 dependent upon the marine aquatic or tidal environment, and exist in 32 either an attached or free floating form, and includes but is not 33 limited to marine aquatic plants in the classes Chlorophyta, 34 Phaeophyta, and Rhodophyta.

35 (48) "Trafficking" means offering, attempting to engage, or 36 engaging in sale, barter, or purchase of fish, shellfish, wildlife, or 37 deleterious exotic wildlife.

1 (49) "Invasive species" means a plant species or a nonnative animal 2 species that either:

3 (a) Causes or may cause displacement of, or otherwise threatens,
4 native species in their natural communities;

5 (b) Threatens or may threaten natural resources or their use in the 6 state;

7 (c) Causes or may cause economic damage to commercial or
8 recreational activities that are dependent upon state waters; or

9 (d) Threatens or harms human health.

10 (50) "Prohibited aquatic animal species" means an invasive species 11 of the animal kingdom that has been classified as a prohibited aquatic 12 animal species by the commission.

13 (51) "Regulated aquatic animal species" means a potentially 14 invasive species of the animal kingdom that has been classified as a 15 regulated aquatic animal species by the commission.

16 (52) "Unregulated aquatic animal species" means a nonnative animal 17 species that has been classified as an unregulated aquatic animal 18 species by the commission.

19 (53) "Unlisted aquatic animal species" means a nonnative animal 20 species that has not been classified as a prohibited aquatic animal 21 species, a regulated aquatic animal species, or an unregulated aquatic 22 animal species by the commission.

(54) "Aquatic plant species" means an emergent, submersed,
 partially submersed, free-floating, or floating-leaving plant species
 that grows in or near a body of water or wetland.

(55) "Retail-eligible species" means commercially harvested salmon,crab, and sturgeon.
