AN ACT Relating to regulating the business of installing, repairing, and maintaining domestic well water systems; amending RCW 18.106.010, 18.106.040, 18.106.050, 18.106.110, and 19.28.041; and adding new sections to chapter 18.106 RCW.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.106.010 and 2003 c 399 s 102 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

8 ((Unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context, 9 the following words and phrases as hereinafter used in this chapter 10 shall have the following meaning:)) The definitions in this section 11 apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires 12 otherwise.

13 (1) "Advisory board" means the state advisory board of 14 plumbers((\div)).

15 (2) "Contractor" means any person, corporate or otherwise, who 16 engages in, or offers or advertises to engage in, any work covered by 17 the provisions of this chapter by way of trade or business, or any 18 person, corporate or otherwise, who employs anyone, or offers or 1 advertises to employ anyone, to engage in any work covered by the 2 provisions of this chapter($(\div$)).

(3) "Department" means the department of labor and industries($(\dot{\tau})$).

4 (4) "Director" means the director of department of labor and
5 industries((*i*)).

6 (5) "Journeyman plumber" means any person who has been issued a
7 certificate of competency by the department of labor and industries as
8 provided in this chapter((*i*)).

9 (6) "Like-in-kind" means having similar characteristics such as 10 plumbing size, type, and function, and being in the same location((\div)).

11 (7) "Medical gas piping" means oxygen, nitrous oxide, high pressure 12 nitrogen, medical compressed air, and medical vacuum systems((+)).

13 (8) "Medical gas piping installer" means a journeyman plumber who 14 has been issued a medical gas piping installer endorsement((\div)).

15 (9) "Plumbing" means that craft involved in installing, altering, 16 repairing and renovating potable water systems, liquid waste systems, 17 and medical gas piping systems within a building. Installation in a 18 water system of water softening or water treatment equipment is not 19 within the meaning of plumbing as used in this chapter((\div)).

20 (10) "Specialty plumber" means anyone who has been issued a 21 specialty certificate of competency limited to:

(a) Installation, maintenance, and repair of the plumbing of single-family dwellings, duplexes, and apartment buildings that do not exceed three stories; ((or))

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(b) Maintenance and repair of backflow prevention assemblies<u>; or</u>

(c) Installation, maintenance, and repair of the pressurization, 26 27 treatment, and filtration components of a domestic well water system consisting of: One or more pumps; pressure, storage, and other tanks; 28 filtration and treatment equipment; if appropriate, a pitless adapter; 29 along with valves, transducers, and other plumbing components and 30 electrical connections, including but not limited to conductors, 31 conduit, raceways, pump controls, control boxes, starters, relays, 32 floats switches, and solenoids, that: 33

<u>(i) Are used to acquire, treat, store, or move water suitable for</u>
 <u>either drinking or other domestic purposes, including irrigation, to:</u>
 <u>(A) A single-family dwelling, duplex, or other similar place of</u>
 <u>residence; (B) a public water system, as defined in RCW 70.119.020 and</u>
 <u>as limited under RCW 70.119.040, that is designed to supply water at a</u>

1 rate of less than five hundred gallons per minute; or (C) a farm owned 2 and operated by a person whose primary residence is located within 3 thirty miles of any part of the farm;

4 (ii) Are located: (A) Within a building used primarily to house a 5 well and the pressurization, treatment, and filtration components of a 6 domestic well water system; (B) within the interior space, including 7 but not limited to an attic, basement, crawl space, or garage, of a 8 residential structure, which space is separated from the living area of 9 the residence by a lockable entrance and fixed walls, ceiling, and 10 floor; or (C) outside of any building;

(iii) Include neither any: (A) Plumbing fixtures, mechanisms, or devices to distribute or access potable water within a building; nor (B) electric components, other than such plumbing or electrical apparatus as are necessary for maintenance, safety, and testing purposes relating to the pressurization, treatment, and filtration portions of the domestic well water system;

(iv) If located within the interior space of a residential 17 structure, are connected to plumbing supplied and installed into the 18 interior space by either: (A) A person who, pursuant to RCW 18.106.070 19 or 18.106.090, possesses a valid temporary permit or certificate of 20 21 competency as a journeyman plumber, specialty plumber, or trainee, as 22 defined in this chapter; or (B) a person exempt from the requirement to obtain a certified plumber to do such plumbing work under RCW 23 24 18.106.150;

(v) If located within the interior space of a building, are 25 connected to an electrical circuit at a junction box that has been 26 27 installed into the interior space for purposes compatible with such components by either: (A) A person who, pursuant to RCW 19.28.161, 28 possesses a valid certificate of competency as a master journeyman 29 electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty residential 30 electrician, specialty residential electrician, or a properly 31 supervised electrical trainee; or (B) a person exempt from the 32 requirement to obtain a certified electrician to do such electrical 33 work under RCW 19.28.261; and 34

35 (vi) If located outside of a building, are connected to an 36 electrical circuit where a switch or other means of disconnecting the 37 circuit from a source of power has been installed by either: (A) A 38 person who, pursuant to RCW 19.28.161, possesses a valid certificate of 1 competency as a master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician,
2 master specialty residential electrician, specialty residential
3 electrician, or a properly supervised electrical trainee; or (B) a
4 person exempt from the requirement to obtain a certified electrician to
5 do such electrical work under RCW 19.28.261.

6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.106.040 and 2001 c 281 s 2 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

8 (1) Upon receipt of the application and evidence set forth in RCW 9 18.106.030, the director shall review the same and make a determination 10 as to whether the applicant is eligible to take an examination for the 11 certificate of competency. To be eligible to take the examination:

(a) Each applicant for a journeyman plumber's certificate of competency shall furnish written evidence that he or she has completed a course of study in the plumbing trade in the armed services of the United States or at a school licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board, or has had four or more years of experience under the direct supervision of a licensed journeyman plumber.

19 (b) Each applicant for a specialty plumber's certificate of 20 competency under RCW 18.106.010((+8+)) (10)(a) shall furnish written 21 evidence that he or she has completed a course of study in the plumbing 22 trade in the armed services of the United States or at a school 23 licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board 24 under chapter 28C.10 RCW, or that he or she has had at least three 25 years practical experience in the specialty.

(c) Each applicant for a specialty plumber's certificate of competency under RCW 18.106.010((+8))) (10) (b) or (c) shall furnish written evidence that he or she is eligible to take the examination. These eligibility requirements shall be adopted by rule by the director pursuant to subsection (2)(b) of this section.

31 (2)(a) The director shall establish reasonable rules for the 32 examinations to be given applicants for certificates of competency. In 33 establishing the rules, the director shall consult with the state 34 advisory board of plumbers as established in RCW 18.106.110.

35 (b) The director shall establish reasonable criteria by rule for 36 determining an applicant's eligibility to take an examination for the 37 certificate of competency for specialty plumbers under subsection

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(1)(c) of this section. In establishing the criteria, the director
 shall consult with the state advisory board of plumbers as established
 in RCW 18.106.110. These rules must take effect by ((July 1, 2002))
 <u>December 31, 2006</u>.

5 (3) Upon determination that the applicant is eligible to take the 6 examination, the director shall so notify the applicant, indicating the 7 time and place for taking the same.

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(4) No other requirement for eligibility may be imposed.

9 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.106.050 and 1997 c 326 s 5 are each amended to read 10 as follows:

(1) The department, with the advice of the advisory board, shall prepare a written examination to be administered to applicants for certificates of competency for journeyman plumber and specialty plumber. The examination shall be constructed to determine:

(a) Whether the applicant possesses varied general knowledge of the
 technical information and practical procedures that are identified with
 the trade of journeyman plumber or specialty plumber; and

(b) Whether the applicant is familiar with the applicable plumbing
 codes and the administrative rules of the department pertaining to
 plumbing and plumbers.

21 ((The department shall administer the examination to eligible 22 persons. All applicants shall, before taking the examination, pay to 23 the department a fee.))

24 (2) ((For purposes of the medical gas piping installer endorsement,)) The department, with the consent of the advisory board, 25 26 may enter into a contract with a nationally recognized testing agency 27 to develop, administer, and score ((medical gas piping installer)) any examinations required by this chapter. All applicants shall, before 28 an examination ((for a medical gas piping installer 29 taking endorsement)), pay the required examination fee. The department shall 30 31 set the examination fee by contract with a nationally recognized The fee shall cover but not exceed the costs of 32 testing agency. preparing and administering the examination and the materials necessary 33 to conduct the practical elements of the examination. The department 34 shall approve training courses and set the fees for training courses 35 36 for ((the medical gas piping installer endorsement)) examinations 37 provided by this chapter.

(3) An examination to determine the competency of an applicant for 1 2 a specialty plumbing certificate for the installation, maintenance, and repair of the pressurization and filtration components of a domestic 3 well water system must include questions designed to establish the 4 applicant's knowledge of electrical safety and technical requirements. 5 In developing the electrical portion of this examination, the 6 7 department shall consult with the electrical board created under RCW 19.28.311. Certification by a professional or trade association 8 recognized by the electrical board as equivalent to a domestic well 9 specialty electrician examination must be accepted as satisfying the 10 electrical portion of this examination. 11

12 (4) The department shall certify the results of the examinations 13 provided by this chapter, and shall notify the applicant in writing 14 whether he or she has passed or failed. Any applicant who has failed 15 the examination may retake the examination, upon the terms and after a 16 period of time that the director shall set by rule. The director may 17 not limit the number of times that a person may take the examination.

18 Sec. 4. RCW 18.106.110 and 1997 c 307 s 1 are each amended to read 19 as follows:

(1) There is created a state advisory board of plumbers, to be composed of ((five)) seven members appointed by the governor. Two members shall be journeyman plumbers, ((two)) one member shall be a specialty plumber, three members shall be persons conducting a plumbing business, at least one of which shall be primarily engaged in a specialty plumbing business, and one member from the general public who is familiar with the business and trade of plumbing.

27 (2) The term of one journeyman plumber expires July 1, 1995; the term of the second journeyman plumber expires July 1, 2000; the term of 28 the specialty plumber expires July 1, 2008; the term of one person 29 30 conducting a plumbing business expires July 1, 1996; the term of the 31 second person conducting a plumbing business expires July 1, 2000; the term of the third person conducting a plumbing business expires July 1, 32 2007; and the term of the public member expires July 1, 1997. 33 Thereafter, upon the expiration of said terms, the governor shall 34 appoint a new member to serve for a period of three years. However, to 35 36 ensure that the board can continue to act, a member whose term expires 37 shall continue to serve until his or her replacement is appointed. In

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the case of any vacancy on the board for any reason, the governor shall appoint a new member to serve out the term of the person whose position has become vacant.

4 (3) The advisory board shall carry out all the functions and duties
5 enumerated in this chapter, as well as generally advise the department
6 on all matters relative to this chapter.

7 (4) Each member of the advisory board shall receive travel expenses 8 in accordance with the provisions of RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060 as now 9 existing or hereafter amended for each day in which such member is 10 actually engaged in attendance upon the meetings of the advisory board.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 18.106 RCW 12 to read as follows:

(1) The department shall, in consultation with the advisory board and the electrical board created under RCW 19.28.311, adopt reasonable rules as are necessary to adequately coordinate the regulation of both the plumbing and electrical aspects of domestic well water system specialty plumbing.

(2) In adopting the rules as required under subsection (1) of this 18 19 section, the department shall establish, and seek the advice of, a 20 technical advisory committee. The technical advisory committee is 21 composed of at least five persons, appointed by the director from a 22 list of at least eight nominees supplied by a statewide organization of 23 persons engaged in the business of installing, maintaining, and 24 repairing domestic described well water systems as in RCW 18.106.010(10)(c). 25

26 (3) In adopting the rules required under subsection (1) of this section, the department may provide for: (a) Categories of domestic 27 well water systems differentiating on the basis of pump capacity, 28 sizing, or other basis as the department may deem appropriate; and (b) 29 30 an alternative method of demonstrating the electrical and plumbing 31 competency of any person who has been actively, continually, and primarily engaged in the business of installing, maintaining, and 32 33 repairing domestic well water systems during the twenty-four months prior to the effective date of this section. 34

35 (4) The department shall refund any penalty paid by and rescind any 36 citation issued to a person for failing to be properly licensed under 37 RCW 19.28.010 if:

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(a) The citation is issued on or after the effective date of this
 section to a person installing, maintaining, or repairing electrical
 components of a domestic well water system as defined in RCW
 18.106.010(10)(c);

5 (b) The person receiving the citation timely appeals the citation 6 pursuant to RCW 19.28.131; and

7 (c) The person appealing the citation is issued, within one year of 8 the effective date of the rules adopted under this section, a 9 certificate of competency as a specialty plumber for the installation, 10 maintenance, and repair of the pressurization and filtration components 11 of a domestic well water system.

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 18.106 RCW 13 to read as follows:

(1) It is unlawful for any person, firm, partnership, corporation, 14 or other entity to advertise, offer to do work, submit a bid, engage 15 16 in, conduct, or carry on the business of installing or maintaining 17 wires or equipment to convey electric current, or installing or maintaining equipment to be operated by electric current as it pertains 18 well water system, described 19 to any domestic as in RCW 20 18.106.010(10)(c), without having an unrevoked, unsuspended, and 21 unexpired: (a) Electrical contractor license as required by RCW 19.28.041 and a certificate of competency as a master journeyman 22 23 electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty residential 24 electrician, specialty residential electrician, or a properly supervised electrical trainee, as required by RCW 19.28.161; or (b) 25 26 certificate of competency as a domestic well water system specialty 27 plumber issued by the department in accordance with this chapter.

(2) It is unlawful for any person, firm, partnership, corporation, 28 or other entity to advertise, offer to do work, submit a bid, engage 29 30 in, conduct, or carry on the business of plumbing, as defined in RCW 31 18.106.010, pertaining to any domestic well water system, as described in RCW 18.106.010(10)(c), without having an unrevoked, unsuspended, and 32 unexpired: (a) Certificate of competency as a journeyman plumber, 33 34 specialty plumber, properly supervised plumbing trainee, or temporary 35 permit, as required by RCW 18.106.020, and provided in RCW 18.106.070; 36 or (b) certificate of competency as a domestic well water system

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specialty plumber issued by the department in accordance with this
 chapter.

3 Sec. 7. RCW 19.28.041 and 2002 c 249 s 2 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

(1) Except as provided by section 6 of this act, it is unlawful for 5 6 any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity to engage 7 in, conduct, or carry on the business of installing or maintaining wires or equipment to convey electric current, or installing or 8 9 maintaining equipment to be operated by electric current as it pertains 10 to the electrical industry, without having an unrevoked, unsuspended, 11 and unexpired electrical contractor license, issued by the department 12 in accordance with this chapter. All electrical contractor licenses expire twenty-four calendar months following the day of their issue. 13 The department may issue an electrical contractors license for a period 14 of less than twenty-four months only for the purpose of equalizing the 15 16 number of electrical contractor licenses that expire each month. 17 Application for an electrical contractor license shall be made in writing to the department, accompanied by the required fee. 18 The application shall state: 19

20 (a) The name and address of the applicant; in case of firms or 21 partnerships, the names of the individuals composing the firm or 22 partnership; in case of corporations, the names of the managing 23 officials thereof;

(b) The location of the place of business of the applicant and thename under which the business is conducted;

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(c) Employer social security number;

(d) Evidence of workers' compensation coverage for the applicant'semployees working in Washington, as follows:

29 (i) The applicant's industrial insurance account number issued by 30 the department;

31 (ii) The applicant's self-insurer number issued by the department;
32 or

(iii) For applicants domiciled in a state or province of Canada subject to an agreement entered into under RCW 51.12.120(7), as permitted by the agreement, filing a certificate of coverage issued by the agency that administers the workers' compensation law in the applicant's state or province of domicile certifying that the applicant has secured the payment of compensation under the other state's or province's workers' compensation law;

4 (e) Employment security department number;

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(f) State excise tax registration number;

6 (g) Unified business identifier (UBI) account number may be 7 substituted for the information required by (d) of this subsection if 8 the applicant will not employ employees in Washington, and by (e) and 9 (f) of this subsection; and

10 (h) Whether a general or specialty electrical contractor license is sought and, if the latter, the type of specialty. Electrical 11 12 contractor specialties include, but are not limited to: Residential, pump and irrigation, limited energy system, signs, nonresidential 13 maintenance, restricted nonresidential maintenance, appliance repair, 14 and a combination specialty. A general electrical contractor license 15 shall grant to the holder the right to engage in, conduct, or carry on 16 17 the business of installing or maintaining wires or equipment to carry electric current, and installing or maintaining equipment, 18 or installing or maintaining material to fasten or insulate such wires or 19 equipment to be operated by electric current, in the state of 20 21 Washington. A specialty electrical contractor license shall grant to 22 the holder a limited right to engage in, conduct, or carry on the business of installing or maintaining wires or equipment to carry 23 24 electrical current, and installing or maintaining equipment; or 25 installing or maintaining material to fasten or insulate such wires or equipment to be operated by electric current in the state of Washington 26 27 as expressly allowed by the license.

(2) The department may verify the workers' compensation coverage information provided by the applicant under subsection (1)(d) of this section, including but not limited to information regarding the coverage of an individual employee of the applicant. If coverage is provided under the laws of another state, the department may notify the other state that the applicant is employing employees in Washington.

34 (3) The application for an electrical contractor license shall be 35 accompanied by a bond in the sum of four thousand dollars with the 36 state of Washington named as obligee in the bond, with good and 37 sufficient surety, to be approved by the department. The bond shall at 38 all times be kept in full force and effect, and any cancellation or

revocation thereof, or withdrawal of the surety therefrom, suspends the 1 2 license issued to the principal until a new bond has been filed and approved as provided in this section. Upon approval of a bond, the 3 department shall on the next business day deposit the fee accompanying 4 the application in the electrical license fund and shall file the bond 5 in the office. The department shall upon request furnish to any 6 7 person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity a certified copy of the bond upon the payment of a fee that the department shall 8 set by rule. The fee shall cover but not exceed the cost of furnishing 9 The bond shall be conditioned that in any 10 the certified copy. installation or maintenance of wires or equipment to convey electrical 11 current, and equipment to be operated by electrical current, the 12 13 principal will comply with the provisions of this chapter and with any 14 electrical ordinance, building code, or regulation of a city or town adopted pursuant to RCW 19.28.010(3) that is in effect at the time of 15 entering into a contract. The bond shall be conditioned further that 16 the principal will pay for all labor, including employee benefits, and 17 material furnished or used upon the work, taxes and contributions to 18 the state of Washington, and all damages that may be sustained by any 19 person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity due to a 20 21 failure of the principal to make the installation or maintenance in 22 accordance with this chapter or any applicable ordinance, building code, or regulation of a city or town adopted pursuant to RCW 23 24 19.28.010(3). In lieu of the surety bond required by this section the 25 license applicant may file with the department a cash deposit or other 26 negotiable security acceptable to the department. If the license 27 applicant has filed a cash deposit, the department shall deposit the funds in a special trust savings account in a commercial bank, mutual 28 savings bank, or savings and loan association and shall pay annually to 29 the depositor the interest derived from the account. 30

(4) The department shall issue general or specialty electrical 31 32 contractor licenses to applicants meeting all of the requirements of this chapter. The provisions of this chapter relating to the licensing 33 of any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity 34 including the requirement of a bond with the state of Washington named 35 36 as obligee therein and the collection of a fee therefor, are exclusive, 37 and no political subdivision of the state of Washington may require or 38 issue any licenses or bonds or charge any fee for the same or a similar

purpose. No person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity holding more than one specialty contractor license under this chapter may be required to pay an annual fee for more than one such license or to post more than one four thousand dollar bond, equivalent cash deposit, or other negotiable security.

(5) To obtain a general or specialty electrical contractor license 6 the applicant must designate an individual who currently possesses a 7 valid master journeyman electrician's certificate of competency, master 8 specialty electrician's certificate of competency in the specialty for 9 10 which application has been made, or administrator's certificate as a general electrical contractor administrator or as a 11 specialty electrical contractor administrator in the specialty for which 12 13 application has been made.

14 (6) Administrator certificate specialties include but are not limited to: Residential, pump and irrigation, limited energy system, 15 nonresidential maintenance, restricted 16 signs, nonresidential maintenance, appliance repair, and combination specialty. To obtain an 17 administrator's certificate an individual must pass an examination as 18 set forth in RCW 19.28.051 unless the applicant was a licensed 19 electrical contractor at any time during 1974. Applicants who were 20 21 electrical contractors licensed by the state of Washington at any time 22 during 1974 are entitled to receive a general electrical contractor administrator's certificate without examination if the applicants apply 23 24 prior to January 1, 1984. The board of electrical examiners shall 25 certify to the department the names of all persons who are entitled to 26 either a general or specialty electrical contractor administrator's 27 certificate.

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
