1 AN ACT Relating to establishing a task force on long-term care 2 financing and chronic care management; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The governor shall establish a joint 4 5 legislative and executive task force on long-term care financing and chronic care management. The joint task force consists of eight 6 7 The secretary of the department of social and members, as follows: 8 health services; the secretary of the department of health; the 9 administrator of the health care authority; a representative from the 10 governor's office; two members of the senate appointed by the president of the senate, one of whom shall be a member of the majority caucus and 11 one of whom shall be a member of the minority caucus; and two members 12 of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house 13 of representatives, one of whom shall be a member of the majority 14 15 caucus and one of whom shall be a member of the minority caucus.

16 (2) The joint task force shall elect a member of the joint task17 force to serve as chair of the joint task force.

18 (3) Consistent with funds appropriated specifically for this

purpose, the joint task force shall contract for professional services.
State agencies, the senate, and the house of representatives may
provide staff support upon request of the joint task force.

4 (4) The joint task force shall create advisory committees to assist 5 the joint task force in its work.

6 (5) Joint task force members may be reimbursed for travel expenses 7 as authorized under RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060, and chapter 44.04 RCW 8 as appropriate. Advisory committee members, if appointed, may not 9 receive compensation or reimbursement for travel or expenses.

10 (6) The joint task force shall review public and private mechanisms11 for financing long-term care and make recommendations related to:

12 (a) Efficient payment models that will effectively sustain public 13 funding of long-term care and maximize the use of financial resources 14 to directly meet the needs of persons of all ages with functional 15 limitations;

(b) The feasibility of private options for realistically enabling 16 17 individuals to pay for long-term care and the most effective tools for implementing these options. The assessment of options should include 18 but not be limited to: (i) Adequacy of personal savings and pensions; 19 (ii) availability of family care, including incentives and supports for 20 21 families to provide care or pay for care; (iii) creative 22 community-based strategies or partnerships for funding quality long-term care; (iv) enhanced health insurance options; (v) long-term 23 24 care insurance options, including incentives to purchase long-term care 25 insurance through individual or group-based products; (vi) life insurance annuities; and (vii) reverse mortgage and other products that 26 27 draw on home equity; and

28 (c) Options that will support long-term care needs of rural 29 communities.

30 (7) The joint task force shall recommend chronic care management 31 and disability prevention interventions that will reduce health care 32 and long-term care costs to individuals and the state, improve the 33 health of individuals over their life span, and encourage patient 34 self-management of chronic care needs.

35 (8) The joint task force shall incorporate a process designed to 36 facilitate an open dialog with the public on findings and 37 recommendations.

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1 (9) The joint task force shall: (a) Report its initial findings to 2 the governor and appropriate committees of the legislature by January 3 1, 2006; (b) report its recommendations to the governor and appropriate 4 committees of the legislature by January 1, 2007; and (c) submit a 5 final report to the governor and appropriate committees of the 6 legislature by June 30, 2007.

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
