## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5684

State of Washington 59th Legislature 2005 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to child care workers; adding new sections to 2 chapter 74.13 RCW; and making appropriations.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW 5 to read as follows:

The legislature finds that as of 2000, child care workers in the 6 7 state earned an average hourly wage of eight dollars and twenty-two 8 cents, only fifty-eight percent received medical insurance through employers, only sixty-six percent received paid sick leave, and only 9 seventy-three percent received paid vacation. The legislature further 10 finds that low wages for child care workers create a barrier for 11 individuals entering the profession, result in child care workers 12 leaving the profession in order to earn a living wage in another 13 profession, and make it difficult for child care workers to afford 14 15 professional education and training. As a result, the availability of quality child care in the state suffers. 16

17 The legislature intends to increase wages to child care workers 18 through establishing a child care career and wage ladder that provides 19 increased wages for child care workers based on their work experience,

level of responsibility, and education. To the extent practicable 1 2 within available funds, this child care career and wage ladder shall mirror the successful child care career and wage ladder pilot project 3 operated by the state between 2000 and 2003. While it is the intent of 4 the legislature to establish the vision of a statewide child care 5 career and wage ladder that will enhance employment quality and 6 7 stability for child care workers, the legislature also recognizes that allocations will determine 8 funding the extent of statewide implementation of a child care career and wage ladder. 9

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW 11 to read as follows:

12 (1) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated for this specific purpose, the division of child care and early learning in the 13 department of social and health services shall establish a child care 14 career and wage ladder in licensed child care centers that meet the 15 16 following criteria: (a) At least ten percent of child care slots are dedicated to children whose care is subsidized by the state or any 17 political subdivision thereof or any local government; (b) the center 18 agrees to adopt the child care career and wage ladder, which, at a 19 20 minimum, shall be at the same pay schedule as existed in the previous 21 child care career and wage ladder pilot project; and (c) the center meets further program standards as established by rule pursuant to 22 23 section 4 of this act.

The child care career and wage ladder shall include wage increments for levels of education, years of relevant experience, levels of work responsibility, relevant early childhood education credits, and relevant requirements in the state training and registry system.

(2) The division shall establish procedures for the allocation of funds to implement the child care career and wage ladder among child care centers meeting the criteria identified in subsection (1) of this section. In developing these procedures, the division shall:

32 (a) Review past efforts or administration of the child care career 33 and wage ladder pilot project in order to take advantage of any 34 findings, recommendations, or administrative practices that contributed 35 to that pilot project's success;

(b) Consult with stakeholders, including organizations representingchild care teachers and providers, in developing an allocation formula

1 that incorporates consideration of geographic and demographic 2 distribution of child care centers adopting the child care career and 3 wage ladder; and

4 (c) Develop a system for prioritizing child care centers interested
5 in adopting the child care career and wage ladder that is based on the
6 criteria identified in subsection (1) of this section.

7 (3) Notwithstanding the requirements of subsection (2) of this section, child care centers meeting the criteria in subsection (1) of 8 9 this section located in urban areas of the department of social and 10 health services region one shall receive a minimum of fifteen percent of the funds allocated through the child care career and wage ladder, 11 and of these centers, child care centers meeting the criteria in 12 subsection (1) of this section participating in the department of 13 14 social and health services Spokane tiered reimbursement pilot project shall have first priority for child care career and wage ladder 15 16 funding.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW 18 to read as follows:

19 Child care centers adopting the child care career and wage ladder 20 established pursuant to section 2 of this act shall increase wages for 21 child care workers who have earned a high school diploma or GED certificate, gain additional years of experience, or accept increasing 22 23 levels of responsibility in providing child care, in accordance with 24 the child care career and wage ladder. The department of social and health services shall pay wage increments for child care workers 25 26 employed by child care centers adopting the child care career and wage ladder established pursuant to section 2 of this act who earn early 27 childhood education credits or meet relevant requirements in the state 28 training and registry system, in accordance with the child care career 29 30 and wage ladder.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW 32 to read as follows:

The division of child care and early learning in the department of social and health services shall establish further program standards by rule. The division of child care and early learning shall also study the impact of the child care career and wage ladder on the quality of

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child care and the child care work force, and report its findings to
 the governor and the appropriate committees of the legislature by
 December 1, 2006.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. (1) The sum of five million dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the general fund to the department of social and health services for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, to carry out the purposes of this act.

8 (2) The sum of five million dollars, or as much thereof as may be 9 necessary, is appropriated from the general fund to the department of 10 social and health services for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, to 11 carry out the purposes of this act.

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
