- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 26.28.085 and 1995 c 373 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
 - (1)(a) Every person who applies a tattoo to any minor under the age of eighteen is guilty of a misdemeanor. It is not a defense to a violation of this section that the person applying the tattoo did not know the minor's age unless the person applying the tattoo establishes by a preponderance of the evidence that he or she made a reasonable, bona fide attempt to ascertain the true age of the minor by requiring production of a driver's license or other picture identification card or paper and did not rely solely on the oral allegations or apparent age of the minor.
- 15 <u>(b) Every person who engages in body piercing on any minor under</u> 16 <u>the age of eighteen is guilty of a misdemeanor, unless a parent of, or</u> 17 <u>a legal guardian of, the minor provides informed consent in writing,</u> 18 <u>furnishes proof of identification, and is present when the piercing</u> 19 occurs.

(2) For the purposes of this section, (a) "tattoo" includes any permanent marking or coloring of the skin with any pigment, ink, or dye, or any procedure that leaves a visible scar on the skin; and (b) "body piercing" means the creation of an opening in the body of a human being for the purpose of inserting jewelry or other decoration. This includes, but is not limited to, piercing of a lip, tongue, nose, or eyebrow. "Body piercing" does not include the piercing of an earlobe.

(3) Medical procedures performed by a licensed physician are exempted from this section.
