- AN ACT Relating to cancellation of intermediate drivers' licenses upon a second conviction or traffic infraction; and amending RCW
- 3 46.20.267 and 46.20.055.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.267 and 2000 c 115 s 3 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- If a person issued an intermediate license is convicted of or found to have committed a traffic offense described in chapter 46.61 RCW or violated restrictions placed on an intermediate license under RCW 46.20.075:
- 11 (1) On the first such conviction or finding the department shall 12 mail the parent or guardian of the person a letter warning the person 13 of the provisions of this section;
- (2) On the second such conviction or finding, the department shall ((suspend)) cancel the person's intermediate driver's license and the person shall surrender it to the department. The person may apply for a driver's instruction permit. The person may not reapply for a driver's license for a period of six months or until the person reaches

- eighteen years of age, whichever occurs first((, and)). The department

  shall mail the parent or guardian of the person a notification of the

  ((suspension)) cancellation;
  - (3) On the third such conviction or finding, the department shall suspend the person's intermediate driver's license until the person reaches eighteen years of age, and mail the parent or guardian of the person a notification of the suspension.

8 For the purposes of this section, a single ticket for one or more 9 traffic offenses constitutes a single traffic offense.

- 10 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.20.055 and 2004 c 249 s 3 are each amended to read 11 as follows:
  - (1) **Driver's instruction permit**. The department may issue a driver's instruction permit with or without a photograph to an applicant who has successfully passed all parts of the examination other than the driving test, provided the information required by RCW 46.20.091, paid a fee of fifteen dollars, and meets the following requirements:
    - (a) Is at least fifteen and one-half years of age; or
    - (b) Is at least fifteen years of age and:
- 20 (i) Has submitted a proper application; and

- (ii) Is enrolled in a traffic safety education program offered, approved, and accredited by the superintendent of public instruction or offered by a driver training school licensed and inspected by the department of licensing under chapter 46.82 RCW, that includes practice driving.
  - (2) Waiver of written examination for instruction permit. The department may waive the written examination, if, at the time of application, an applicant is enrolled in:
- 29 (a) A traffic safety education course as defined by RCW 30 28A.220.020(2); or
- 31 (b) A course of instruction offered by a licensed driver training 32 school as defined by RCW 46.82.280(1).
- 33 The department may require proof of registration in such a course 34 as it deems necessary.
- 35 (3) **Effect of instruction permit**. A person holding a driver's instruction permit may drive a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, upon the public highways if:

(a) The person has immediate possession of the permit; and

- (b) An approved instructor, or a licensed driver with at least five years of driving experience, occupies the seat beside the driver. However, if the person holding the driver's instruction permit previously held an intermediate driver's license that was cancelled under RCW 46.20.267, then a licensed driver with at least ten years of driving experience must occupy the seat beside the driver.
- (4) Term of instruction permit. A driver's instruction permit is valid for one year from the date of issue.
  - (a) The department may issue one additional one-year permit.
- (b) The department may issue a third driver's permit if it finds after an investigation that the permittee is diligently seeking to improve driving proficiency.
- 14 (c) A person applying to renew an instruction permit must submit 15 the application to the department in person.
