- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 42.52.350 and 1994 c 154 s 205 are each amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The executive ethics board is created, composed of five 7 members, appointed by the governor as follows:
  - (a) One member shall be a classified service employee as defined in chapter 41.06 RCW;
- 10 (b) One member shall be a state officer or state employee in an 11 exempt position;
- 12 (c) One member shall be a citizen selected from a list of three 13 names submitted by the attorney general;
- 14 (d) One member shall be a citizen selected from a list of three 15 names submitted by the state auditor; and
- 16 (e) One member shall be a citizen selected at large by the 17 governor.
- 18 (2) Except for ((initial members and)) members completing partial

terms, members shall serve ((a single)) five-year terms. No member may
serve more than two full terms.

- (3) No more than three members may be identified with the same political party.
- (4) ((Terms of initial board members shall be staggered as follows: One member shall be appointed to a one-year term; one member shall be appointed to a two-year term; one member shall be appointed to a three-year term; one member shall be appointed to a four-year term; and one member shall be appointed to a five-year term.
- (5)) A vacancy on the board shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
- (((6))) (5) Each member shall serve for the term of his or her appointment and until his or her successor is appointed.
- (((7))) (6) The members shall annually select a chair from among themselves.
- $((\frac{(8)}{(8)}))$  (7) Staff shall be provided by the office of the attorney general.
