## SENATE BILL 6437

State of Washington 59th Legislature 2006 Regular Session

Read first time 01/12/2006. Referred to Committee on Early Learning, K-12 & Higher Education.

1 AN ACT Relating to course equivalencies for career and technical 2 coursework for high school students; amending RCW 28A.230.090 and 3 28A.230.100; and adding a new section to chapter 28A.230 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28A.230 6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) Each high school or school district board of directors shall 8 adopt course equivalencies for all career and technical high school 9 courses offered to students at the high school. A career and technical 10 course equivalency may be for whole or partial credit. Each school 11 district board of directors shall develop a course equivalency approval 12 procedure.

(2) Career and technical courses determined to be equivalent to academic core courses, in full or in part, by the high school or school district shall be accepted as meeting core requirements, including graduation requirements, if the courses are transcripted on the student's diploma using the equivalent academic high school department designation and title. Full or partial credit shall be recorded as appropriate. 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.230.090 and 2005 c 205 s 3 are each amended to 2 read as follows:

3 (1) The state board of education shall establish high school
4 graduation requirements or equivalencies for students, except those
5 equivalencies as established by local high schools or school districts
6 under section 1 of this act.

7 (a) Any course in Washington state history and government used to
8 fulfill high school graduation requirements shall consider including
9 information on the culture, history, and government of the American
10 Indian peoples who were the first inhabitants of the state.

(b) The certificate of academic achievement requirements under RCW 28A.655.061 or the certificate of individual achievement requirements under RCW 28A.155.045 are required for graduation from a public high school but are not the only requirements for graduation.

15 (c) Any decision on whether a student has met the state board's 16 high school graduation requirements for a high school and beyond plan 17 shall remain at the local level.

18 (2) In recognition of the statutory authority of the state board of 19 education to establish and enforce minimum high school graduation 20 requirements, the state board shall periodically reevaluate the 21 graduation requirements and shall report such findings to the 22 legislature in a timely manner as determined by the state board.

(3) Pursuant to any requirement for instruction in languages other than English established by the state board of education or a local school district, or both, for purposes of high school graduation, students who receive instruction in American sign language or one or more American Indian languages shall be considered to have satisfied the state or local school district graduation requirement for instruction in one or more languages other than English.

30 (4) If requested by the student and his or her family, a student 31 who has completed high school courses before attending high school 32 shall be given high school credit which shall be applied to fulfilling 33 high school graduation requirements if:

(a) The course was taken with high school students, if the academic
level of the course exceeds the requirements for seventh and eighth
grade classes, and the student has successfully passed by completing
the same course requirements and examinations as the high school
students enrolled in the class; or

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1 (b) The academic level of the course exceeds the requirements for 2 seventh and eighth grade classes and the course would qualify for high 3 school credit, because the course is similar or equivalent to a course 4 offered at a high school in the district as determined by the school 5 district board of directors.

6 (5) Students who have taken and successfully completed high school 7 courses under the circumstances in subsection (4) of this section shall 8 not be required to take an additional competency examination or perform 9 any other additional assignment to receive credit.

10 (6) At the college or university level, five quarter or three 11 semester hours equals one high school credit.

12 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.230.100 and 1991 c 116 s 8 are each amended to 13 read as follows:

The state board of education shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 14 34.05 RCW, to implement the course requirements set forth in RCW 15 16 28A.230.090. The rules shall include, as the state board deems 17 necessary, granting equivalencies for and temporary exemptions from the course requirements in RCW 28A.230.090 and special alterations of the 18 course requirements in RCW 28A.230.090. In developing such rules the 19 20 state board shall recognize the relevance of vocational and applied 21 courses and allow such courses to fulfill in whole or in part the courses required for graduation in RCW 28A.230.090, as determined by 22 23 the high school or school district in accordance with section 1 of this 24 act. The rules may include provisions for competency testing in lieu of such courses required for graduation in RCW 28A.230.090 25 or 26 demonstration of specific skill proficiency or understanding of 27 concepts through work or experience.

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
