1 AN ACT Relating to studying environmental education; and creating 2 a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The office of superintendent of public 4 5 instruction shall conduct an environmental education study in partnership with public and private entities invested in strategies to 6 7 reach every student, family, and community with quality environmental 8 education experiences. The study shall provide empirical evidence, exemplary models, and recommendations focused on: 9

10 (a) Career development;

11 (b) Good citizenship as proven through service learning;

12 (c) Graduation requirements, specifically addressing senior13 culminating projects;

14 (d) Underserved youth and demographic groups; and

(e) Models of professional development for community-based serviceorganizations including state and local agencies.

17 (2) The study in this section shall provide findings and 18 recommendations useful to the Washington state comprehensive 19 environmental education plan, a comprehensive public-private endeavor 1 to develop local and statewide strategies to ensure quality outdoor 2 environmental education opportunities for every student, family, and 3 community in Washington.

(3) By studying the concepts in this section, the study shall 4 evaluate how environmental education benefits Washington's students, 5 families, and communities. Outdoor environmental education provides 6 relevant quality education set in real world contexts of the built, 7 natural, cultural, social, and economic environments. It provides 8 opportunities for direct natural experiences to help Washington's youth 9 10 develop self-esteem and personal responsibility. Washington benefits from exemplary environmental education programs and public-private 11 12 environmental education partnerships across the state including 13 outdoor, agriculture, forestry, angling and hunting, cultural 14 competency, natural resource, natural science, and wildlife education The study will be useful in identifying outdoor 15 programs. 16 environmental education opportunities for Washington's students, families, and communities. 17

(4) The office of superintendent of public instruction shall
provide an interim update to the legislature by December 1, 2006, and
shall complete the study no later than October 1, 2007.

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
