- AN ACT Relating to preventing the rejection of ballots if they are 1 2 marked to identify the voter; and amending RCW 29A.60.040.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 3
- **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.60.040 and 2003 c 111 s 1504 are each amended to 4 5 read as follows:
  - A ballot is invalid and no votes on that ballot may be counted if it is found folded together with another ballot ((or it is marked so as to identify the voter)).
- Those parts of a ballot are invalid and no votes may be counted for 10 those issues or offices where more votes are cast for the office or issue than are permitted by law; write-in votes do not contain all of 11 the information required under RCW ((29A.60.020)) 29A.60.021; or that 12 issue or office is not marked with sufficient definiteness to determine 13 the voter's choice or intention. No write-in vote may be rejected due 14 15 to a variation in the form of the name if the election board or the 16 canvassing board can determine the issue for or against which or the

person and the office for which the voter intended to vote. 17
