- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 44.28 RCW to read as follows:
- 8 The joint legislative audit and review committee shall evaluate the
- 9 competitive business climate for encouraging a sustainable and mature 10 biotechnology and medical device manufacturing sector. The committee
- 10 biotechnology and medical device manufacturing sector. The committee 11 shall review the biotechnology and medical device manufacturing
- 12 businesses in the areas listed in subsection (2) of this section and
- identify the best practices in economic development and public policy
- 14 to identify the measures Washington should take to encourage the
- 15 formation and maturation, from start-up to commercial business
- 16 activity, of biotechnology and medical device manufacturing businesses
- 17 in Washington.
- 18 (1) The questions to be answered by this study may include, but are
- 19 not limited to, the following:

- 1 (a) Which biotechnology and medical device manufacturing clusters 2 have rapidly expanded and why;
- 3 (b) What role did state government play in creating an environment 4 that encouraged business growth;
- 5 (c) What incentives should Washington put in place to encourage a 6 sustainable biotechnology and medical device manufacturing sector;
- 7 (d) What aspects of these industries provide the greatest economic 8 benefits;
- 9 (e) What program should Washington establish to develop this 10 business sector.
- 11 (2) The areas to be studied are:
- 12 (a) Boston, Massachusetts;
- 13 (b) San Diego, California;
- 14 (c) Greater San Francisco, California;
- 15 (d) Greater Los Angeles, California;
- 16 (e) Greater Raleigh-Durham, North Carolina;
- 17 (f) Chicago, Illinois;
- 18 (g) Minneapolis, Minnesota; and
- 19 (h) Seattle, Washington.
- 20 (3) The report shall be delivered to the appropriate committees of 21 the legislature by December 15, 2006.

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
