## SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL 8040

1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE W. BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, 2 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 7 represent and petition as follows:

8 WHEREAS, Our nation possesses a military capacity that is 9 unprecedented in the world's history and without parallel among the 10 sovereign states of the world today; and

WHEREAS, War, in and of itself, is not an answer, and should only be engaged in as a last resort when all other possibilities have been exhausted; and

14 WHEREAS, Peace is among the highest ideals articulated by American 15 presidents from Thomas Jefferson to Ronald Reagan; and

16 WHEREAS, Thomas Jefferson said in 1801 "That peace, safety, and 17 concord may be the portion of our native land, and be long enjoyed by 18 our fellow citizens, is the most ardent wish of my heart"; and

19 WHEREAS, Dwight Eisenhower said "I think people want peace so badly

1 that one of these days government had better get out of the way and let 2 them have it"; and

3 WHEREAS, In 1984, President Ronald Reagan signed into law 4 legislation creating the United States Institute of Peace; and

5 WHEREAS, Our experience in Iraq demonstrates that war can have 6 unintended consequences, such as undermining our nation's standing as 7 a beacon of democratic ideals; and

8 WHEREAS, Remaining a light among nations will require that we 9 become better known and more respected for our ability to make peace 10 than war; and

11 WHEREAS, Peace, if it is to be lasting, must be advanced and 12 expanded and strengthened continually and cannot be achieved without a 13 concerted commitment from our nation's leaders;

14 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the Congress and the President of the United States create a national 15 Department of Peace and Nonviolence that is provided with sufficient 16 17 resources to take a strategic approach to the development of policies that promote national and international peace through the use of 18 mediation and nonviolent action to resolve conflict and advance peace. 19 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately 20 21 transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United 22 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the 23 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of

24 Washington.
