1 AN ACT Relating to accident reports; amending RCW 46.52.030 and 2 46.52.060; and providing an effective date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 46.52.030 and 1997 c 248 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

(1) Unless a report is to be made by a law enforcement officer 6 7 under subsection (3) of this section, the driver of any vehicle 8 involved in an accident resulting in injury to or death of any person or damage to the property of any one person to an apparent extent equal 9 10 to or greater than the minimum amount established by rule adopted by 11 the chief of the Washington state patrol in accordance with subsection 12 (5) of this section, shall, within four days after such accident, make a written report of such accident to the chief of police of the city or 13 14 town if such accident occurred within an incorporated city or town or the county sheriff or state patrol if such accident occurred outside 15 incorporated cities and towns. Nothing in this subsection prohibits 16 accident reports from being filed by drivers where damage to property 17 is less than the minimum amount or where a law enforcement officer has 18 19 submitted a report.

1 (2) The original of the report shall be immediately forwarded by 2 the authority receiving the report to the chief of the Washington state 3 patrol at Olympia, Washington. The Washington state patrol shall give 4 the department of licensing full access to the report.

5 (3) Any law enforcement officer who investigates an accident for 6 which a report is required under subsection (1) of this section shall 7 submit an investigator's report as required by RCW 46.52.070.

8 (4) The chief of the Washington state patrol may require any driver of any vehicle involved in an accident, of which report must be made as 9 provided in this section, to file supplemental reports whenever the 10 original report in the chief's opinion is insufficient, and may 11 12 likewise require witnesses of any such accident to render reports. For 13 this purpose, the chief of the Washington state patrol shall prepare 14 and, upon request, supply to any police department, coroner, sheriff, and any other suitable agency or individual, sample forms of accident 15 reports required hereunder, which reports shall be upon a form devised 16 17 by the chief of the Washington state patrol and shall call for sufficiently detailed information to disclose all material facts with 18 reference to the accident to be reported thereon, including the 19 location, the circumstances, the conditions then existing, the persons 20 21 and vehicles involved, the insurance information required under RCW 22 46.30.030, personal injury or death, if any, the amounts of property damage claimed, the total number of vehicles involved, whether the 23 24 vehicles were legally parked, legally standing, or moving, ((and)) 25 whether such vehicles were occupied at the time of the accident, and whether any driver involved in the accident was distracted at the time 26 27 of the accident. Distractions contributing to an accident must be reported on the accident form and include at least the following 28 minimum reporting options: Not distracted; operating a handheld 29 electronic telecommunication device; operating a hands-free wireless 30 telecommunication device; other electronic devices (including, but not 31 limited to, PDA's, laptop computers, navigational devices, etc.); 32 adjusting an audio or entertainment system; smoking; eating or 33 drinking; reading or writing; grooming; interacting with children, 34 passengers, animals, or objects in the vehicle; other inside 35 36 distractions; outside distractions; and distraction unknown. Every 37 required accident report shall be made on a form prescribed by the chief of the Washington state patrol and each authority charged with 38

the duty of receiving such reports shall provide sufficient report forms in compliance with the form devised. The report forms shall be designated so as to provide that a copy may be retained by the reporting person.

(5) The chief of the Washington state patrol shall adopt rules 5 establishing the accident-reporting threshold for property damage 6 7 accidents. Beginning October 1, 1987, the accident-reporting threshold 8 for property damage accidents shall be five hundred dollars. The accident-reporting threshold for property damage accidents shall be 9 10 revised when necessary, but not more frequently than every two years. The revisions shall only be for the purpose of recognizing economic 11 12 changes as reflected by an inflationary index recommended by the office 13 of financial management. The revisions shall be guided by the change 14 in the index for the time period since the last revision.

15 Sec. 2. RCW 46.52.060 and 1998 c 169 s 1 are each amended to read 16 as follows:

17 It shall be the duty of the chief of the Washington state patrol to file, tabulate, and analyze all accident reports and to publish 18 annually, immediately following the close of each fiscal year, and 19 20 monthly during the course of the year, statistical information based 21 thereon showing the number of accidents, the location, the frequency, whether any driver involved in the accident was distracted at the time 22 23 of the accident and the circumstances thereof, and other statistical 24 information which may prove of assistance in determining the cause of vehicular accidents. Distractions contributing to an accident to be 25 26 reported must include at least the following: Not distracted; operating a handheld electronic telecommunication device; operating a 27 hands-free wireless telecommunication device; other electronic devices 28 29 (including, but not limited to, PDA's, laptop computers, navigational devices, etc.); adjusting an audio or entertainment system; smoking; 30 eating or drinking; reading or writing; grooming; interacting with 31 children, passengers, animals, or objects in the vehicle; other inside 32 distractions; outside distractions; and distraction unknown. 33

34 Such accident reports and analysis or reports thereof shall be 35 available to the director of licensing, the department of 36 transportation, the utilities and transportation commission, the 37 traffic safety commission, and other public entities authorized by the

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chief of the Washington state patrol, or their duly authorized representatives, for further tabulation and analysis for pertinent data relating to the regulation of highway traffic, highway construction, vehicle operators and all other purposes, and to publish information so derived as may be deemed of publication value.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act takes effect January 1, 2006.

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
