AN ACT Relating to Washington's Wildlife license plate collection; amending RCW 77.12.170; reenacting and amending RCW 46.16.313; and adding new sections to chapter 46.16 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 (1) The legislature recognizes that the Washington's Wildlife 8 license plate collection, to include three distinct designs including 9 bear, deer, and elk, has been reviewed by the special license plate 10 review board under RCW 46.16.725 and was found to fully comply with all 11 provisions of RCW 46.16.715 through 46.16.775.

12 (2) The department shall issue a special license plate collection 13 displaying a symbol or artwork, approved by the special license plate 14 review board and the legislature, recognizing Washington's wildlife, 15 that may be used in lieu of regular or personalized license plates for 16 vehicles required to display one or two vehicle license plates, 17 excluding vehicles registered under chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and 18 conditions established by the department. <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW
to read as follows:

For the purposes of RCW 46.16.313 and section 1 of this act, the term "Washington's Wildlife license plate collection" means the collection of three separate license plate designs issued under section 1 of this act. Each license plate design displays a distinct symbol or artwork recognizing the wildlife of Washington, to include bear, deer, and elk.

9 Sec. 3. RCW 46.16.313 and 2004 c 221 s 3, 2004 c 48 s 3, and 2004 10 c 35 s 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows: 11 (1) The department may establish a fee of no more than forty

dollars for each type of special license plates issued under RCW 12 46.16.301(1) (a), (b), or (c), as existing before amendment by section 13 5, chapter 291, Laws of 1997, in an amount calculated to offset the 14 15 cost of production of the special license plates and the administration 16 of this program. This fee is in addition to all other fees required to 17 register and license the vehicle for which the plates have been requested. All such additional special license plate fees collected by 18 19 the department shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to 20 the motor vehicle fund.

21 (2) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a 22 23 collegiate license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty dollars. 24 The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and 25 26 collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper 27 identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the 28 funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in 29 RCW 28B.10.890. 30

31 (3) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 32 renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a collegiate 33 license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall 34 deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under 35 this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by 36 it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the custody of the

state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state
treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license
plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890.

(4) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 4 application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a 5 special baseball stadium license plate shall pay an initial fee of 6 7 forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for 8 administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining 9 proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be distributed to 10 a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments 11 12 on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as 13 defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary 14 preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds 15 16 to the state general fund.

17 (5) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a special 18 baseball stadium license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. 19 The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee 20 21 collected under this subsection for administration and collection 22 expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest 23 24 payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, 25 defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary as preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 26 27 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund. 28

(6) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on 29 January 1, 2005, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid 30 31 upon application and registration of a vehicle, the holder of a 32 professional fire fighters and paramedics license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount 33 not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this 34 subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. 35 The remaining proceeds must be remitted to the custody of the state 36 37 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. Under RCW 38 46.16.755, the state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor

vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the professional fire fighters and paramedics license plates. Upon the determination by the department that the state has been reimbursed, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the Washington State Council of Fire Fighters benevolent fund established under RCW 46.16.30902.

(7) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 7 1, 2006, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 8 renewal of a vehicle registration, the holder of a professional fire 9 10 fighters and paramedics license plate shall, upon application, pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to 11 exceed two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for 12 13 administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds must be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a 14 proper identifying detailed report. Under RCW 46.16.755, the state 15 treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until 16 17 the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the professional fire fighters and paramedics 18 special license plate. Upon the determination by the department that 19 the state has been reimbursed, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds 20 21 to the Washington State Council of Fire Fighters benevolent fund established under RCW 46.16.30902. 22

(8) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on 23 24 November 1, 2004, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid 25 upon application and registration of a vehicle, the holder of a 26 "Helping Kids Speak" license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty 27 dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration 28 and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds must be 29 remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper 30 identifying detailed report. Pursuant to RCW 46.16.755, the state 31 32 treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the 33 cost of implementing the "Helping Kids Speak" special license plate. 34 35 Upon the determination by the department that the state has been 36 reimbursed, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the "Helping 37 Kids Speak" account established under RCW 46.16.30904.

(9) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on November 1 2 1, 2005, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon renewal of a vehicle registration, the holder of a "Helping Kids Speak" 3 license plate shall, upon application, pay a fee of thirty dollars. 4 5 The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection 6 7 expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds must be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed 8 Pursuant to RCW 46.16.755, the state treasurer shall credit 9 report. the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department 10 determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of 11 12 implementing the "Helping Kids Speak" special license plate. Upon the 13 determination by the department that the state has been reimbursed, the 14 treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the "Helping Kids Speak" account established under RCW 46.16.30904. 15

16 (10) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on 17 January 1, 2005, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a vehicle, the holder of a "law 18 enforcement memorial" license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty 19 dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve 20 21 dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration 22 and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper 23 24 identifying detailed report. Pursuant to RCW 46.16.755, the state 25 treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the 26 27 cost of implementing the law enforcement memorial special license plate. Upon the determination by the department that the state has 28 been reimbursed, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the law 29 enforcement memorial account established under RCW 46.16.30906. 30

(11) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 31 32 1, 2006, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon renewal of a vehicle registration, the holder of a "law enforcement 33 memorial" license plate shall, upon application, pay a fee of thirty 34 dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two 35 dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration 36 37 and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall 38 be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper

1 identifying detailed report. Pursuant to RCW 46.16.755, the state 2 treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until 3 the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the 4 cost of implementing the law enforcement memorial special license 5 plate. Upon the determination by the department that the state has 6 been reimbursed, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the law 7 enforcement memorial account established under RCW 46.16.30906.

(12)(a) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due 8 on or after January 1, 2006, in addition to all fees and taxes required 9 to be paid upon application and registration of a vehicle, the holder 10 of a Washington's Wildlife collection license plate shall pay an 11 initial fee of forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount 12 not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this 13 subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. 14 The remaining proceeds must be remitted to the custody of the state 15 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. Under RCW 16 46.16.755, the state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor 17 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been 18 reimbursed for the cost of implementing the Washington's Wildlife 19 license plate collection. Upon determination by the department that 20 the state has been reimbursed, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds 21 to the state wildlife account. Proceeds credited to the state wildlife 22 account from the sale of the Washington's Wildlife license plate 23 24 collection may be used only for the department of fish and wildlife's game species management activities. 25

26 (b) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on or after 27 January 1, 2007, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon renewal of a vehicle registration, the holder of a Washington's 28 Wildlife collection license plate shall, upon application, pay a fee of 29 thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed 30 two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for 31 administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining 32 proceeds must be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a 33 proper identifying detailed report. Under RCW 46.16.755, the state 34 35 treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until 36 the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the Washington's Wildlife license plate 37 collection. Upon determination by the department that the state has 38

been reimbursed, the treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the state 1 2 wildlife account. Proceeds credited to the state wildlife account from the sale of the Washington's Wildlife license plate collection may be 3 used only for the department of fish and wildlife's game species 4 management activities. 5

Sec. 4. RCW 77.12.170 and 2004 c 248 s 4 are each amended to read 6 7 as follows:

(1) There is established in the state treasury the state wildlife 8 9 fund which consists of moneys received from:

(a) Rentals or concessions of the department; 10

(b) The sale of real or personal property held for department 11 12 purposes;

(c) The sale of licenses, permits, tags, and stamps required by 13 chapter 77.32 RCW and RCW 77.65.490, except annual resident adult 14 saltwater and all annual razor clam and shellfish licenses, which shall 15 16 be deposited into the state general fund;

(d) Fees for informational materials published by the department;

(e) Fees for personalized vehicle license plates and Washington's 18 Wildlife license plate collection as provided in chapter 46.16 RCW; 19

20 (f) Articles or wildlife sold by the director under this title;

21 (g) Compensation for damage to department property or wildlife 22 losses or contributions, gifts, or grants received under RCW 77.12.320;

23 (h) Excise tax on anadromous game fish collected under chapter 82.27 RCW; 24

(i) The sale of personal property seized by the department for 25 26 fish, shellfish, or wildlife violations;

27 (j) The department's share of revenues from auctions and raffles authorized by the commission; and 28

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(k) The sale of watchable wildlife decals under RCW 77.32.560.

(2) State and county officers receiving any moneys listed in 30 31 subsection (1) of this section shall deposit them in the state treasury to be credited to the state wildlife fund. 32

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
