1 AN ACT Relating to salmon and steelhead recovery; and amending RCW 2 77.85.200.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Resources, Ocean & Recreation.

4 Sec. 1. RCW 77.85.200 and 2001 c 135 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

(1) A program for salmon and steelhead recovery is established in 6 7 Clark, Cowlitz, Lewis, Skamania, and Wahkiakum counties within the habitat areas classified as the lower Columbia evolutionarily 8 9 significant ((unit 4)) units by the federal national marine fisheries 10 service. The management board created under subsection (2) of this section is responsible for ((implementing the habitat portion of the 11 approved)) developing and overseeing the implementation of the habitat 12 13 portion of the salmon and steelhead recovery ((initiative)) plan and is empowered to receive and disburse funds for the ((approved)) salmon and 14 15 steelhead recovery initiatives. The management board created pursuant 16 to this section shall constitute the lead entity and the committee 17 established under RCW 77.85.050 responsible for fulfilling the requirements and exercising powers under this chapter. 18

(2) A management board consisting of fifteen voting members is 1 2 created within the lower Columbia evolutionarily significant ((unit 4)) The members shall consist of one county commissioner or 3 units. designee from each of the five participating counties selected by each 4 county legislative authority; one member representing the cities 5 contained within the lower Columbia evolutionarily significant ((unit 6 7 4)) <u>units</u> as a voting member selected by the cities in <u>the lower</u> <u>Columbia</u> evolutionarily significant ((unit 4)) units; a representative 8 of the Cowlitz Tribe appointed by the tribe; one state legislator 9 10 elected from one of the legislative districts contained within the lower Columbia evolutionarily significant ((unit 4)) units selected by 11 12 that group of state legislators representing the area; five 13 representatives to include at least one member who represents private property interests appointed by the five county commissioners or 14 designees; one hydro utility representative nominated by hydro 15 utilities and appointed by the five county commissioners or designees; 16 17 and one representative nominated from the environmental community who resides in the lower Columbia evolutionarily significant ((unit 4)) 18 <u>units</u> appointed by the five county commissioners or designees. 19 The board shall appoint and consult a technical advisory committee, which 20 21 shall include four representatives of state agencies one each appointed 22 by the directors of the departments of ecology, fish and wildlife, and transportation, and the commissioner of public lands. 23 The board may 24 also appoint additional persons to the technical advisory committee as 25 The chair of the board shall be selected from among the needed. 26 members of the management board by the five county commissioners or 27 designees and the legislator on the board. In making appointments under this subsection, the county commissioners shall consider 28 recommendations of interested parties. Vacancies shall be filled in 29 the same manner as the original appointments were selected. 30 No action 31 may be brought or maintained against any management board member, the 32 management board, or any of its agents, officers, or employees for any noncontractual acts or omissions in carrying out the purposes of this 33 34 section.

35 (3)(a) The management board shall participate in the development of 36 a <u>habitat</u> recovery plan to implement its responsibilities under (b) of 37 this subsection. The management board shall consider local watershed 38 efforts and activities as well as habitat conservation plans in the

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1 <u>development and</u> implementation of the recovery plan. Any of the 2 participating counties may continue its own efforts for restoring 3 steelhead habitat. Nothing in this section limits the authority of 4 units of local government to enter into interlocal agreements under 5 chapter 39.34 RCW or any other provision of law.

(b) The management board is responsible for ((implementing the 6 7 habitat portions of the local government responsibilities of the lower 8 Columbia steelhead conservation initiative approved by the state and the national marine fisheries service)) the development of a lower 9 Columbia salmon and steelhead habitat recovery plan and for 10 coordinating and monitoring the implementation of the plan. The 11 12 management board will submit all future plans and amendments to plans 13 to the governor's salmon recovery office for the incorporation of 14 hatchery, harvest, and hydropower components of the statewide salmon recovery strategy for all submissions to the national marine fisheries 15 service. In developing and implementing the habitat recovery plan, the 16 management board will work with appropriate federal and state agencies, 17 tribal governments, local governments, and the public to make sure 18 19 hatchery, harvest, and hydropower components receive consideration in context with the habitat component. The management board may work in 20 21 cooperation with the state and the national marine fisheries service to 22 modify the ((initiative)) plan, or to address habitat for other aquatic species that may be subsequently listed under the federal endangered 23 24 species act. The management board may not exercise authority over land or water within the individual counties or otherwise preempt the 25 26 authority of any units of local government.

27 (c) The management board shall prioritize as appropriate and approve projects and programs related to the recovery of lower Columbia 28 river salmon and steelhead runs, including the funding of those 29 projects and programs, and coordinate local government efforts as 30 31 prescribed in the recovery plan. The management board shall establish 32 criteria for funding projects and programs based upon their likely value in salmon and steelhead recovery. The management board may 33 consider local economic impact among the criteria, but jurisdictional 34 35 boundaries and factors related to jurisdictional population may not be considered as part of the criteria. 36

37 (d) The management board shall assess the factors for decline along
38 each ((prioritized stream as listed)) tributary basin in the lower

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1 Columbia ((steelhead conservation initiative)). The management board 2 is encouraged to take a stream-by-stream approach in conducting the 3 assessment which utilizes state and local expertise, including 4 volunteer groups, interest groups, and affected units of local 5 government.

(4) The management board has the authority to hire and fire staff, б including an executive director, enter into contracts, accept grants 7 and other moneys, disburse funds, make recommendations to cities and 8 counties about potential code changes and the development of programs 9 10 and incentives upon request, pay all necessary expenses, and may choose a fiduciary agent. The management board shall report on its progress 11 12 on a ((quarterly)) biennial basis to the legislative bodies of the five 13 participating counties and the state natural resource-related agencies. 14 The management board shall prepare a final report at the conclusion of the program describing its efforts and successes in developing and 15 implementing the ((habitat portion of the)) lower Columbia salmon and 16 17 steelhead ((conservation initiative)) recovery plan. The final report shall be transmitted to the appropriate committees of the legislature, 18 the legislative bodies of the participating counties, and the state 19 natural resource-related agencies. 20

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(5) The program terminates on July 1, $((\frac{2006}{}))$ <u>2010</u>.

(6) For purposes of this section, "evolutionarily significant unit" means the habitat area identified for an evolutionarily significant unit of an aquatic species listed or proposed for listing as a threatened or endangered species under the federal endangered species act (16 U.S.C. Sec. 1531 et seq.).

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
