1 AN ACT Relating to postpartum depression; adding new sections to 2 chapter 43.121 RCW; and making an appropriation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.121 RCW 5 to read as follows:

The legislature finds that postpartum depression is a serious 6 7 condition that affects women of all ages, economic status, and racial 8 and ethnic backgrounds. Postpartum depression includes a range of physical and emotional changes that many mothers can have following the 9 10 birth of a child, which can be treated with medication and counseling. If untreated, however, postpartum depression can lead to further 11 12 depression, self-destructive behavior, or even suicide, as well as child abuse, neglect, or death of the infant or other siblings. 13

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.121 RCW 15 to read as follows:

16 The council shall conduct a proactive, public information and 17 communication outreach campaign concerning the significance, signs, and 18 treatment of postpartum depression.

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1 The public information campaign may, within available funds, 2 include production and distribution of a brochure and communication by 3 electronic media, telephone hotlines, and existing parenting education 4 events funded by the council.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, or 6 as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the general 7 fund to the Washington council for the prevention of child abuse and 8 neglect for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, to carry out the 9 purposes of this act.

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
